# Braves top prospect Acuna's SunTrust debut only a tease

ATLANTA (AP) — Ronald Acuna's debut at SunTrust Park was only a tease.

Acuna's return to Atlanta on a full-time basis, and in a game that counts, may be less than a month away.

The Braves closed their exhibition schedule with a 7-4 win over a Future Stars team of minor leaguers, including top prospect Acuna, who had a single in three at-bats.

Atlanta opens its season on Thursday night when Julio Teheran starts against the Philadelphia Phillies. Acuna will begin at Triple-A Gwinnett, perhaps for only a few weeks.

Acuna wanted to open the season in Atlanta but said understands more went into the decision than his .432 spring batting average.

"It's just not the right moment right now," Acuna said through a translator before the game. "That's just part of the business. Baseball is a business and I understand that. There are a lot of things that go into the decisions."

Having Acuna spend a few weeks in the minors will give the Braves an extra full season of contractual control down the road. He could be promoted by mid-April.

Cristian Pache drove in three runs for the Future Stars with two homers, each landing in the visitors' bullpen, off Braves left-hander Sean Newcomb.

Bobby Cox, 76, clearly relished the opportunity to return to the dugout as the Future Stars' manager. He even wore spikes, as was his custom during his long career as the manager in Atlanta and Toronto.

Cox, now a senior adviser with the Braves, was with the team throughout spring training. That gave him ample time to watch Acuna, who was selected Baseball America's top prospect as well as MVP of the Arizona Fall League.

Acuna hit second in Cox's lineup, but the Hall of Fame manager said: "He can hit anywhere. It doesn't matter where he hits in the lineup. He's a

dynamic-type guy, five-tool guy."

Acuna, 20, hit four homers with 11 RBIs and four steals this spring.

Following the team's stance, Cox said Acuna will benefit from "a little bit more seasoning" in the minors.

"Get him off to a good start and hopefully he gets him up here real soon," Cox said.

Before the game, Acuna said he was so excited to play at SunTrust Park "there are really no words to describe it."

After striking out in his first at-bat, Acuna lined a single to left field off Newcomb in the third inning but was picked off as he tried to steal second.

Cox said Acuna reminds him "a lot" of a young Andruw Jones.

"He makes contact," Cox said. "He's got a good eye at the plate. He's got tremendous power to right-center as well as left. He can hit the ball out dead center, right-center, left-center."

Acuna, from Venezuela, said he took notes from fellow Venezuelan Ender Inciarte, Atlanta's two-time Gold Glove winner in center field, this spring.

"He helped me right away when I got to spring training and since I've known him, really," Acuna said. "He's helped me focus on the little things, which I think is the difference-maker in how you get to the big leagues. I'm really thankful for all the advice he's given me."

Inciarte followed Acuna's father, Ron, who played in the Mets, Blue Jays and Brewers organizations but never reached the major leagues.

Inciarte seemed offended when told the younger Acuna similarly followed his career.

"I'm not that old!" the 27-year-old outfielder said with a laugh.

"He wants to be himself and that's good for him. He's not trying to be like somebody else. He saw me play and that's one thing, but he's not trying to be like me or someone else. He's different and he's very special," Inciarte added.



# Lillard's 41 points lifts Blazers past Pelicans, 107-103

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Damian Lillard scored 20 of his 41 points in the fourth quarter, and the Portland Trail Blazers beat the New Orleans Pelicans 107-103 on Tuesday night.

Lillard hit his first six shots of the fourth quarter, including two 3-pointers, to push Portland into its first lead since early in the first quarter. He made two free throws with 1.3 seconds left to seal the victory.

Anthony Davis had 36 points, 14 rebounds and six blocks for the Pelicans, with 22 points coming after he rolled his right ankle and briefly came out of the game with 5:15 left in the third quarter. Jrue Holiday had 21 points, 11 assists and 11 rebounds for New Orleans.

Davis and Holiday nearly helped the Pelicans avoid a second straight loss. After Holiday's block on Pat Connaughton with 20 seconds left, New Orleans wound up with two shots to tie or lead, but both of E'Twaun Moore's 3-point attempts rimmed out. The Blazers failed to rebound the first, but Connaughton corralled the second miss with 2 seconds left and quickly got the ball to Lillard, who was fouled.

Jusuf Nurkic had 21 points and 10 rebounds for Portland, highlighted by his putback of C.J. McCollum's miss while being fouled by Moore with 3:55 left to give the Blazers a 96-95 lead. Evan Turner scored 14 points for the Blazers, who further strengthened their hold on third place in the Western Conference.

Al Farouq Aminu had 10 points and 10 rebounds,

including a crucial putback of Lillard's miss with 28 seconds left to make it 105-101.

New Orleans led by single digits most of the first half and by as many as 11 twice in the third quarter, the last time on Davis' 9-foot floater with 7:41 left in the period. But by late in the quarter, the Blazers were down just two after Shabazz Napier's 3.

### TIP-INS

Trail Blazers: Starting F Maurice Harkless was scratched from the lineup with left knee soreness. It was the 16th game he's missed this season. The Blazers announced after the game that Harkless would undergo arthroscopic surgery Wednesday in Portland to remove a loose body in his left knee. ... The Blazers have scored 100 or more in 17 straight. ... Portland won its seventh straight on the road. ... McCollum missed 16 of 19 shots, going 1 of 6 from 3-point range, and finished with seven points. ... Portland was 10 of 32 on 3s.

Pelicans: Starting G Rajon Rondo, who missed New Orleans' loss at Houston on Saturday with a sprained right wrist, was scratched from his second straight game shortly before tip-off. ... Moore had 11 points. ... F Solomon Hill played a season-high 21 minutes in his fifth game back from offseason hamstring surgery. He finished with nine points, four assists and three rebounds. ... Holiday had two blocks in the game, both in the fourth quarter, including one from behind on Lillard.

# Dodgers designate OF Trayce Thompson for assignment

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Dodgers have cut outfielder Trayce Thompson, the brother of Golden State Warriors star Klay Thompson.

Thompson was competing for a spot in a crowded Los Angeles outfield that includes Chris Taylor, Yasiel Puig, Matt Kemp, Joc Pederson and Andrew Toles. Out of minor league options, he was designated for assignment Tuesday by the defending NL champions to make room on the 40-man roster for right-hander Cory Mazzoni, who was claimed off waivers from the Chicago Cubs.

The Dodgers have seven days to trade, release or send Thompson outright to the minors — first exposing him to waivers. Thompson, who turned 27 this month, is likely to draw interest from other teams. "It was a tough, tough decision," manager Dave Roberts said. "Trayce does a lot of things well. Just where our roster is and the opportunity, or lack thereof, (it) wasn't going to happen. Being out of options, we had a tough decision to make. Also with Trayce, he's a guy that needs to go out there and play. When he had his success with us here, it was in a two-month spurt where he got to play a lot on a nightly basis. We didn't see that for him right now." In 20 games this spring, Thompson batted .255 with one home run and two RBIs. He made a splash with the Dodgers in 2016, when he hit 13 home runs in 80 games.

Roberts was asked what Pederson and Toles did to beat out Thompson. "Joc's got a longer track record and has performed at a higher level for longer. That's part of it. With Andrew, his ability to not have to play every day, more simple swing mechanic-wise. For one of those guys to not be in there every day, I think Andrew has a better chance than Trayce," Roberts said.

Thompson was informed of the decision before Roberts arrived at Dodger Stadium for Tuesday night's exhibition game against the Los Angeles Angels, and then Roberts called him.

"I think he saw the depth we have and (was) understanding his situation and seeing how guys are playing," Roberts said. "Still, the finality when you're going to be designated for assignment, it kind of jolts you a little bit. Trayce handled it like a professional."

# Rakitic's penalty kick in 2nd half lifts Croatia past Mexico

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Ivan Rakitic scored on a penalty kick in the second half, lifting depleted Croatia to a 1-0 win over Mexico on Tuesday night.

The penalty was called after Mexico defender Miguel Layun, a halftime substitute, kicked Croatia's Tin Jedvaj on the upper thigh in the 61st minute in the corner of the box. Rakitic's penalty kick, low and to the left, just beat goalkeeper Guillermo Ochoa.

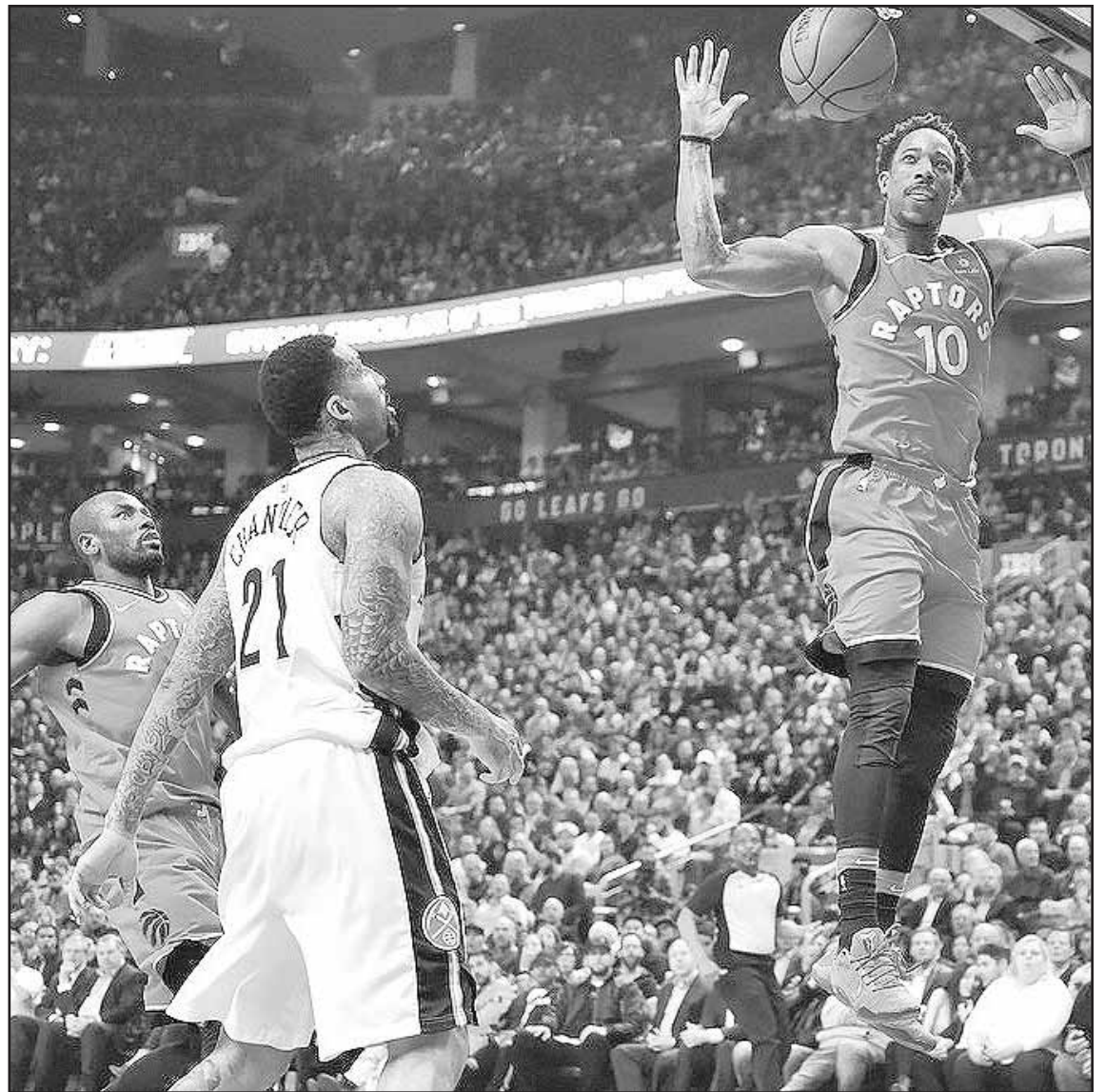
It was the first goal given up by Mexico in 350 minutes, including games against Poland, Bosnia and Iceland.

Mexico suffered a setback in the first half when defender Nestor Araujo was taken to a hospital after sustaining a left knee injury in the 14th minute.

Before the game, Mexico coach Juan Carlos Osorio criticized Croatia's decision to release six of its top players: Luka Modric (Real Madrid), Mario Mandzukic (Juventus), Ivan Perisic (Inter Milan), Marcelo Brozovic (Inter Milan), Danijel Subasic (Monaco) and Nikola Kalinic (AC Milan).

Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane had requested Modric return to the club, while the other players suffered bruises or minor injuries during Croatia's 2-0 loss to Peru on Friday in Miami. Their absence left Croatia at far less than full strength and deprived Mexico of a tougher test in the last game before its final World Cup roster is announced.

# DeRozan scores 15, Raptors beat Nuggets 114-110

TORONTO (AP) — As the losses pile up and a playoff berth slips further out of reach, Denver Nuggets coach Michael Malone is bewildered by his team's lack of urgency.

DeMar DeRozan, Jonas Valanciunas, and Fred VanVleet each scored 15 points and the Toronto Raptors beat the Nuggets 114-110 on Tuesday night.

Nikola Jokic had 29 points and 16 rebounds, and Paul Millsap scored 20 points for the Nuggets, who lost their second straight and fourth of six.

"We have seven games to go," Malone said. "Every damn play matters, and right now we're not playing like every play matters. We're playing like we have 30 games to go in the season and I can't explain that. It's unacceptable."

Jamal Murray scored 15 points and fellow Canadian Trey Lyles had 13 for the Nuggets.

"All the fundamental things it takes to win a basketball game, we're not doing right now," a downcast Murray said.

Jakob Poeltl scored all of his 12 points in the fourth quarter, including eight straight for Toronto at one stretch.

"He played great, with intensity," Raptors coach Dwane Casey said. "He was locked in. I was really proud of the way he played."

Serge Ibaka had 13 points, Pascal Siakam 12 and Kyle Lowry 11 as the Raptors

improved to 31-7 at home.

The Raptors outscored the Nuggets 53-29 in bench points.

"Give their guys credit, their bench was fantastic," Malone said. "They're one of the better benches in the NBA and they showcased it again tonight."

Toronto, which lost to the Clippers on Sunday, avoided what would have been its fifth two-game losing streak. The Eastern Conference-leading Raptors have yet to lose three consecutive games this season.

Denver, which lost at Philadelphia on Monday, was playing the sixth game of a seven-game road trip, but Malone didn't want to use fatigue as an excuse.

"Right now, the urgency that we need to have supersedes the fatigue factor," he said.

Up 85-82 through three quarters, Denver reeled off five straight points in the first minute of the fourth to open an eight-point advantage. Toronto answered with a 13-2 spurt over the next four minutes. Denver called timeout after VanVleet's driving layup gave the Raptors a 95-92 lead with 6:55 to play.

Toronto led 111-101 after Poeltl capped his outburst with a layup with just over a minute left. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Murray and Wilson Chandler cut it to 111-107 with 18 seconds remaining. 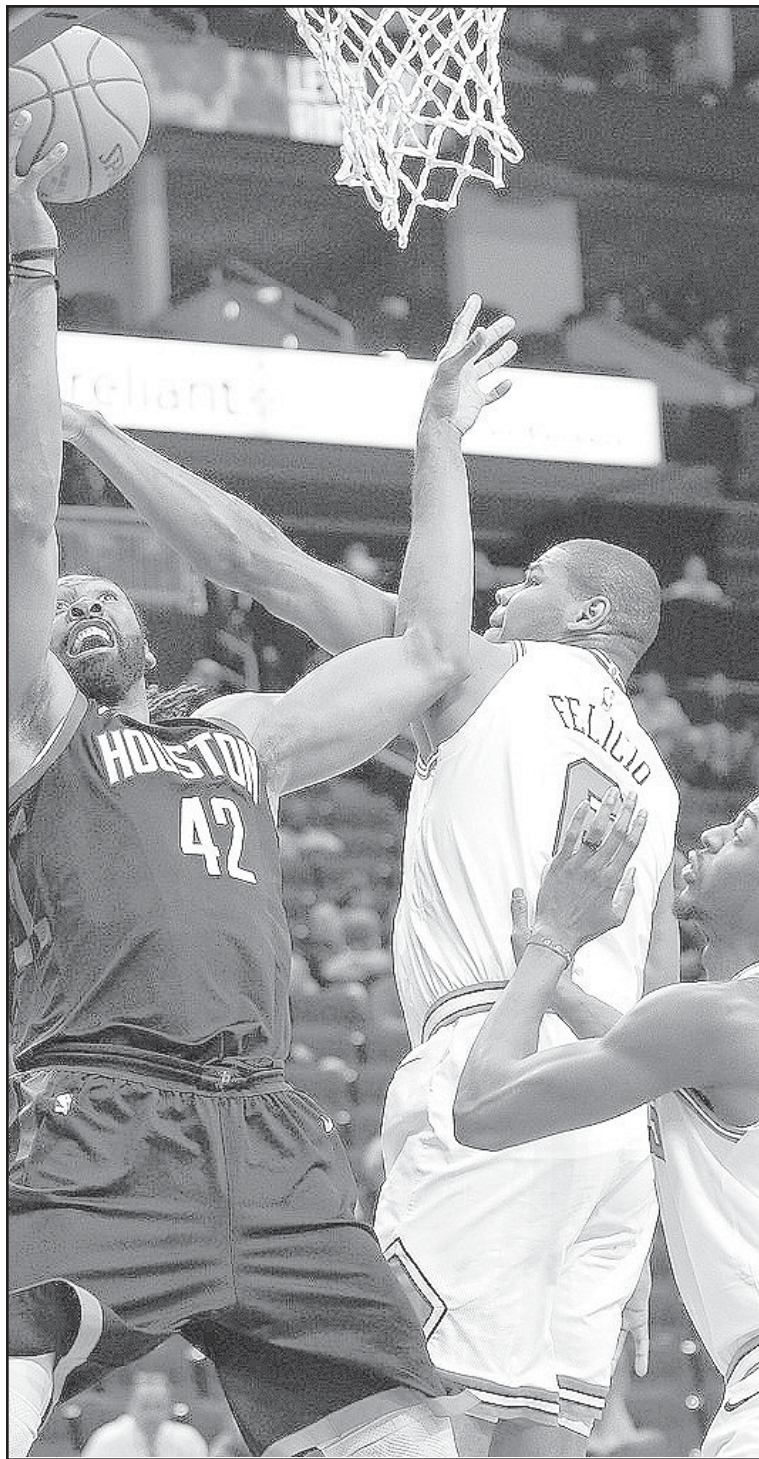

# Rockets extend streak to 10 games with 118-86 win over Bulls

HOUSTON (AP) — Three straight lopsided wins by the Houston Rockets isn't exactly good preparation for the playoffs.

However, the Rockets believe their intensity in these games has showcased an important quality of the team.

"That's what we as a veteran group are supposed to do," Trevor Ariza said. "We're supposed to play the same way every game no matter who the opponent is. Because at the end of the day it's never about the other team for us. Our mindset has to be that it's always about us."

Eric Gordon scored 31 points and tied a career high with eight 3-pointers on a night James Harden sat out to rest, and the Rockets got their 10th straight win with a 118-86 rout of the Chicago Bulls on Tuesday night.

Ariza added 21 points and Chris Paul had 13 points and 10 assists in his return after missing the last three games with a sore hamstring.

"It's all about energy and playing at a high level every night no matter who's out, and

it's just been fun being around these guys," Gordon said. "Most teams there might be a lack of interest against teams that are not going to the playoffs (but) we still put the pedal to the metal."

The NBA-leading Rockets became the first team since San Antonio in the lockout-shortened 2011-12 season to have three winning streaks of at least 10 games in a season. They won 14 in a row from Nov. 16-Dec. 18 and 17 straight from Jan. 28-March 7.

Lauri Markkanen returned after missing Saturday's game with lower back spasms and had 22 points for the Bulls, who dropped their sixth straight.

"They space the floor so well and are shooting from all over, it puts you in such a tough position," Bulls coach Fred Hoiberg said. "I said the other day, they're fun to watch, but no fun to play against."

The Rockets had a 21-point lead at halftime, paced by 24 points from Gordon, and opened the third quarter with a 16-2 run to extend it to 76-41 with 7 1/2 minutes left in the quarter. Ariza had eight points, powered by two 3-pointers in that stretch.

The Bulls couldn't do any-

thing right in that span, missing four shots and committing five turnovers, including one on a shot clock violation and another when David Nwaba stepped out of bounds.

Nwaba made Chicago's first basket in more than 3 1/2 minutes, but the Rockets scored the next seven points to make it a 40-point lead with just more than five minutes left in the quarter.

After never trailing in their blowout wins over New Orleans and Atlanta, the Rockets spent 13 seconds behind on Tuesday night after Cameron Payne put Chicago up 2-0 with a basket early in the first.

Gordon's first 3-pointer came next to put Houston up for good. It was the first of a 14-3 run that put the Rockets ahead 14-5 with about 8 1/2 minutes left in the quarter.

Markkanen had the next seven points to get Chicago

within two, but an 11-2 spurt by Houston followed to extend the lead to 25-14.

Chicago cut the lead to eight on a 3-pointer by Denzel Valentine about nine minutes before halftime before the Rockets used a 13-2 run to extend it to 51-32 five minutes later. It was 60-39 at halftime.

Bulls: Sean Kilpatrick, who signed a three-year deal on Tuesday, had 12 points and two rebounds. ... Noah Vonleh had 10 points and 12 rebounds. ... Chicago had 18 turnovers.

Rockets: Luc Mbah a Moute missed his third straight game with a sore left knee. ... Houston made 18 3-pointers to give them at least 15 in six of the last seven games. ... Tuesday was the third straight game where Houston held its opponent to less than 50 points in the first half.

**BIG WINS**

Houston's 32-point win tied

its biggest of the season. The Rockets have won 14 games this season by 20 points or more, which is tied for most in franchise history. They've won three straight games by 10 points or more for the first time since Feb. 1-6.

**GORDON GOING**

Tuesday was Gordon's fifth 30-point game this season after he had just five 30-point games in the previous four years combined. He's been playing his best basketball over the last five games, averaging 22.4 points on 54 percent shooting.

"I think he feels good and has an extra bounce in his step," coach Mike D'Antoni said. "He's playing at a very high level right now."

# Clamping down: Wade, Heat stymie Cavaliers, 98-79

MIAMI (AP) — Dwyane Wade is completely convinced LeBron James is still the best basketball player in the world.

And the Miami Heat accepted the challenge of slowing him down.

Kelly Olynyk scored a game-high 19 points, Wade blocked a pair of shots by James as part of a stifling defensive effort by Miami, and the Heat had little trouble on the way to beating the Cleveland Cavaliers 98-79 on Tuesday night.

Wade finished with four blocks, two of them from behind to thwart James, and afterward the close friends got together and laughed like always.

“That’s one thing about us — we don’t brag about what we do against each other,” James said. “We talk about what we do against everybody else.”

Josh Richardson and James Johnson each scored 15 points for Miami, which led 54-34 at halftime and has won 10 of its last 11 home games. Wade finished with 12 against the team he spent part of this season with before getting traded back to Miami.

“We did a great job,” Wade said. “One of our best defensive games since I’ve been here, for sure.” The Heat held Cleveland to a season-low point total, a shocking number when considering the Cavs had scored 120 in each of their previous four games. James finished with 18 points for the Cavaliers, who were without Kevin Love in the second half because of what was initially diagnosed as a loose tooth and then changed to concussion-like symptoms.

Love, who was hurt 1:22 into the game after taking an elbow from Heat center Jordan Mickey, will be evaluated again Wednesday to see if he needs to enter the NBA’s concussion protocol.

“What hurt us more was our rotation was in disarray,” James said. “We have a great rotation thing down the last few games and for a guy to go down that early it kind of messed that up.”

James finished with 18 points for the Cavaliers, whose previous season low for points was 88. The Cavs are 1-13 this season when held under 100; they’re 43-17 when scoring more than 100.

It was the 865th consecutive regular-season game in which James scored at least 10 points, putting him one shy of tying Michael Jordan for the longest such streak in NBA history. James can tie the mark in Charlotte — against the Jordan-

owned Hornets — on Wednesday.

“We missed shots early and we allowed their pressure to take us out of some of the stuff that we wanted to do,” Cavs interim coach Larry Drew said.

Rodney Hood added 15 points for Cleveland. It was Miami’s 14th consecutive home win over the Cavaliers, including a 4-0 mark when James plays in Miami since leaving the Heat after the 2014 NBA Finals.

“This shows the type of defensive team we can be,” Heat guard Goran Dragic said.

Cleveland came in averaging 31 points per quarter over its last five games, then managed only 34 in the first half against the Heat.

Cleveland showed life in the third, getting within 13 late in the quarter. But Miami was still up 75-59 going into the fourth, after Wade — moments after checking in for the first time in about an hour of real time — connected on a step-back jumper with 17 seconds left in the third.

“That’s why he is who he is,” Heat coach Erik Spoelstra said.

### TIP-INS

**Cavaliers:** James has played in all 74 Cavs games, matching his total from last season. It was his first time playing at Miami since March 19, 2016. ... Cleveland changed its starting lineup, with Jeff Green in for Larry Nance Jr. ... Kyle Korver remained away from the team, one day after the funeral for his brother. Korver is expected back soon, though the team has not revealed if an exact comeback date has been determined.

**Heat:** Spoelstra was back with the team, two days after he and his wife Nikki’s first child — Santiago Ray Spoelstra — was born. ... Miami was down two centers — Hassan Whiteside (left hip) remains out, and Bam Adebayo missed the game with a sprained ankle that the Heat think will be better in a few days.

### LONG BENCH

In three games against Miami this season, the Cavaliers used a total of 20 players. The only Cavs to play in all three meetings were James, J.R. Smith and Tristan Thompson.

### GO TIME

Miami’s next five games are all against teams well out of the playoff picture, with the next three of those games — against Chicago, Brooklyn and Atlanta — all at home. After road games at Atlanta and New York, the Heat then finish at home against Oklahoma City and Toronto.

Guerrero Jr. is among the game's top prospects, but will open the season in Double-A.

"These two days have been amazing for me," he said. "It's like a dream come true. Of course having that chance to help the team win is something I'm always going to remember."

This is the fifth year that Toronto has capped its exhibition season at Olympic Stadium.

# Designer of deadly waterslide charged along with park owner

TOPEKA, Kan. (AP) — A water park company co-owner accused of rushing the world's tallest waterslide into service and a designer accused of sho Wednesday, March 28, 2018 planning were charged Tuesday in the decapitation of a 10-year-old boy on the ride in 2016.

With the latest charges, three men connected with Texas-based Schlitterbahn Waterparks and Resorts and its park in Kansas City, Kansas, have been indicted by a Kansas grand jury, along with the park and the construction company that built the ride. Caleb Schwab died on the 17-story ride when the raft he was riding went airborne and hit an overhead loop.

The Kansas attorney general's office said Schlitterbahn co-owner Jeffrey Henry, 62, and designer John Schooley were charged with reckless second-degree murder, along with Henry & Sons Construction Co., which is described as the private construction company of Schlitterbahn. Second-degree murder carries a sentence of 9 years to 41 years in prison.

They also were charged with 17 other felonies, including aggravated battery and aggravated endangerment of a child counts tied to injuries other riders sustained on the giant slide, called Verruckt, which is German for "insane." The indictment accuses Henry of making a "spur of the moment" decision to build the ride, and that he and Schooley lacked technical or engineering expertise in amusement park rides.

Henry was ordered held in a Texas jail without bond Tuesday, pending extradition to Kansas. The attorney general's office said Schooley is not in custody. Schooley didn't have a listed phone number and no one answered the phone at Henry & Sons Construction Co. Eric B Terry, who represented the company in an earlier unrelated case, didn't immediately return a phone or email message.

The same grand jury last week indicted the Kansas City park and Tyler Austin Miles, its former operations manager, on 20 felony charges. The charges include a single count of involuntary manslaughter in Schwab's death. Miles has been released on

# Clippers rally to beat Bucks 105-98, improve playoff hopes

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Clippers came out attacking, moving the ball and hitting 3-pointers to start the game. Then they got stagnant.

It nearly cost them.

They blew a 16-point, first-half lead and rallied from five down on a slew of 3s in the fourth to beat the Milwaukee Bucks 105-98 on Tuesday night and boost their playoff hopes.

Tobias Harris scored 19 points, DeAndre Jordan had 12 points and 16 rebounds, and Lou Williams added 16 points off the bench.

The Clippers hit six 3-pointers in the fourth, when they launched a 13-0 run to go back in front 96-88.

They made 3-pointers on four straight possessions — by four different players — for a 105-96 lead.

“Those really hurt,” Bucks coach Joe Prunty said.

Los Angeles trails Minnesota by 1 ½ games for the eighth and final Western Conference berth with eight games to play.

“We’re focused right now as much as I’ve ever seen,” said Austin Rivers, who scored 10 of his 13 points in the fourth. “We look at each game like it’s the last game. We don’t have too much room for error.”

Milos Teodosic got their 3-point run going in the first quarter, when he made four of the Clippers’ seven 3-pointers. He left the game just before halftime after tweaking his left foot, which has been bothered by plantar fasciitis this season.

“I know he was kicking (expletive),” Jordan said.

Giannis Antetokounmpo scored 26 points and Khris Middleton added 22 for the Bucks, who opened a four-game Western Conference swing by having their two-game winning streak snapped.

The Clippers came out strongly to start the second quarter, extending their lead to 16 on a dunk by Williams.

But Middleton and the Bucks chipped away, outscoring the Clippers 26-15 in the third and getting stops on defense. Antetokounmpo had 10 points to help send Milwaukee into the fourth leading 82-78.

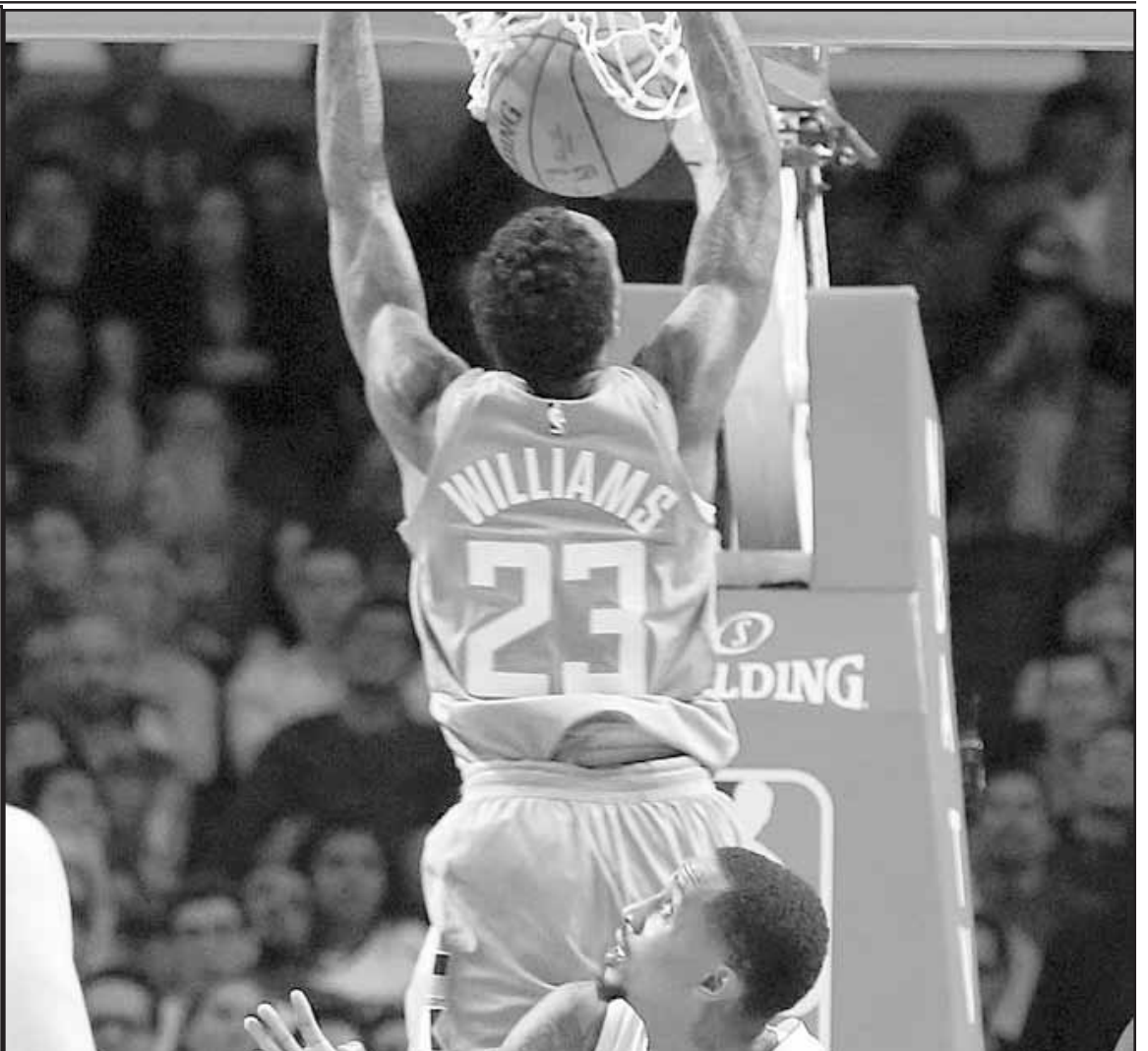
“We just played defense,” he said. “When we are able to do that we’re really good.”

The Bucks ended the third on a 9-0 run, including back-to-back baskets by Tyler Zeller that gave them their first lead since the initial basket of the game.

# Stratton throws 5 strong as Giants beat A’s 3-0

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Chris Stratton pitched four-hit ball over five innings to lift the San Francisco Giants over the Oakland Athletics 3-0 in the finale of the three-game Bay Bridge exhibition series Tuesday night.

A 5-2-3 double play helped Stratton escape a bases-loaded, no-outs situation in the first inning. The 27-year-old right-hander settled down nicely after that, facing one batter over the minimum over the next 4 1/3 innings.

Giants relievers Josh Osich, Cory Gearrin, Sam Dyson, Pierce Johnson and Derek Law combined for four innings of two-hit ball.

Law escaped a bases-loaded, one-out situation in the ninth.

Joe Panik led the game off

for the Giants with a triple to right-center off Andrew Triggs, then scored on Brandon Belt’s infield grounder.

Austin Jackson had a two-out, two-run single off Liam Hendricks in the fourth that extended the lead to 3-0.

Triggs struck out six and gave up three runs, five hits and a walk in 3 2/3 innings.

The A’s (14-16) completed their third straight losing spring training. They’ve had three or more straight losing springs three times in Oakland history (1974-77 and 2009-11).

Athletics: LHP A.J. Puk has hurt his pitching elbow, and Dr. James Andrews is recommending he have Tommy John surgery. Puk was diagnosed with an injury to his ulnar collateral ligament by Dr. Doug Freedberg in Arizona, and

Giants: RHP Julian Fernandez was diagnosed with a UCL injury, manager Bruce Bochy said. The flame-throwing 22-year-old prospect is seeking a second opinion, but will start the season on the DL. ... RHP Mark Melancon’s status for opening day is uncertain. The 33-year-old closer who underwent right forearm surgery last September threw on flat ground Tuesday and is expected to do so again Wednesday. “We’re hoping it’s all good to go on Thursday, but we don’t know right now if that will be the case,” Bochy said. ... RHP Jeff Samardzija, who is expected to start the season on the DL with a strained pectoral, will throw on flat surfaces Wednesday and Thursday, Bochy said.

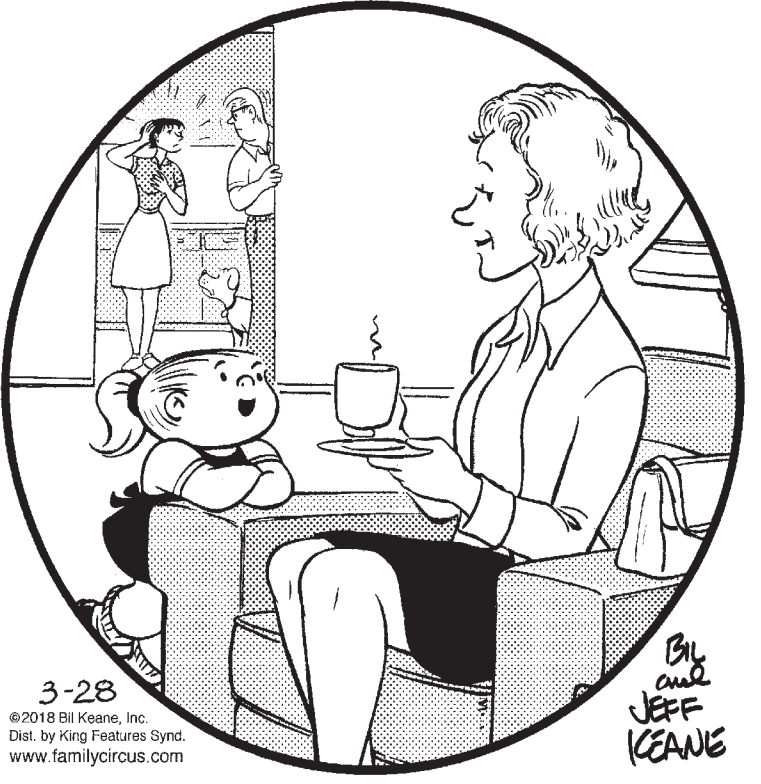
*P.S. Because the father reached out to make amends, the half-brother may try to contact his siblings. But don't count on it.*

# Sewage leak spills onto field during game at Dodger Stadium

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Spring training came to a repulsive end Tuesday night at Dodger Stadium.

The exhibition finale between the Angels and Dodgers was cut short because of a foul-smelling leak that spilled sewage onto the field in the fifth inning.

The game was called after a 32-minute delay with two outs in the bottom of the fifth, giving the Dodgers a 4-3 victory over their Los Angeles rivals. The water main leak left a brown

mess pooling near the Dodgers' dugout in foul territory as the grounds crew spread a drying agent and worked to clean up.

"I'm not going to tell you what it really was," Dodgers outfielder Andrew Toles said. "That's messed up. It's nasty."

There was definitely an undeniable stench, according to players.

"I thought it was Gatorade or something coming from the stands. I don't know. They said it was the sewer," Toles said. "I smelled it. It was nasty, man."

After about 10 minutes of waiting on the field, both teams returned to their respective dugouts. Umpire crew chief Gerry Davis announced the delay as officials tried to determine if it was a stadium or city issue.

"Apparently, there was a pipe backup on two different levels of the stadium," Dodgers president and CEO Stan Kasten said after the game. "We don't know exactly where the backup was, or what caused it. It had something to do with a main pipe here, as well as main pipe outside the stadium."

Kasten was unsure if the Dodgers would refund fans, but said officials would discuss the situation on Wednesday.

Because the losing team had at least five chances to bat, the final score and statistics will count as an official game in spring training records. Matt Kemp homered in the fourth to give the Dodgers a 4-3 lead.

"You can always say you've seen everything, but we haven't seen something like that," Angels manager Mike Scioscia said. "It's unfortunate. We're all winding down spring training. You want to finish strong. When you had a lake forming around the third base area that wasn't going to stop, it's just unfortunate."

The leak might have reached the coaches' offices, but Dodgers manager Dave Roberts wouldn't confirm or deny that.

"I'll get back to you guys tomorrow," he said. "We'll figure it out."

Both teams open the regular season Thursday, with the Dodgers hosting the rival San Francisco Giants and the Angels playing in Oakland — where leaking sewage at the old Coliseum has been a problem several times in recent years.
