THE BLUE EMPIRE EDGED THE WARRIOR NATION IN A 7-6 THRILLER

The American Samoa High School Athletics Association (ASHSAA) closed off its 2017-18 football season last Saturday morning, with a championship game at the Veterans Memorial Stadium where the Blue Empire claimed this year's varsity championship title, after defeating the Warrior Nation by one point, 7-6.

Coverage of ASHSAA football is sponsored by Congresswoman Aumua Amata.

Deja vu was the name of the game on Saturday.

In 2009, the last time Samoana High School won the ASHSAA varsity football title, it was a player from Fagaalu — BJ Misi — who scored the winning field goal against Tafuna High School. Fast forward 8 years later, and it's another Fagaalu kid, who kicks the winning field goal against Tafuna.

Elliot Lelei — Samoana's star wide receiver — led the way for the Sharks, by not only scoring Samoana's only touchdown of the game, but also kicking the winning field goal that clinched the title.

The main factor in the "Rise of the Blue Empire" is the leadership of head coach Pati Pati who took over Samoana's football program three years ago, and established an unstoppable rhythm over the years that has now led to this year's championships.

Congratulations also goes out to not only the head coach and his team, but to Samoana HS principal Tupa'i Rod Atafua, who in his first year as SHS principal is celebrating having both the JV and varsity football division championship titles in the house.

American Samoa will be competing in three events during the 2017 Mini Pacific Games set to be held in Port Vila, Vanuatu on Dec. 4-15.

American Samoa's delegation, including athletes in beach volleyball, 3-on-3 basketball, weightlifters Tanu Jungblunt and Li'a Tufele, and weightlifting coach Monica Afalava will begin departing Dec. 1st

The rest of the group will depart Dec. 5th

Only those set to compete during the first days of the Games will be leaving first.

Leading the entourage is American Samoa National Olympic Committee president Ed Imo.

ASNOC secretary general Ethan Lake and Miss American Samoa Matauaina Toomalatai are also scheduled to attend the Games. The reigning beauty

queen will head to the Games after she competes in the Miss Pacific Pageant in Nadi, Fiji, which will be held next month — Dec. 2-9.

In other ASNOC news, Lake thanks everyone who attended last Tuesday's meeting to pinpoint those interested in being part of ASNOC's marketing/events commission.

"The meeting went really well," he said, adding that everyone in attendance agreed to push forward with the 2017 American Samoa Sports Awards Gala, set for January 2018, which, according to Lake, will include "our first Sports Hall of Fame inductees." Nomination forms are available from ASNOC.

The next meeting is set for 5 p.m. this Thursday, Nov. 30th at the ASNOC office inside the Veterans Memorial Stadium in Tafuna.

US men beat Mexico in 2019 Basketball World Cup qualifier

GREENSBORO, N.C. (AP) — New format, same familiar U.S. dominance on Sunday.

Travis Wear had 14 points and 10 rebounds, three other players also had 14 points, and the Americans beat Mexico 91-55 in their second qualifying game for the 2019 Basketball World Cup.

Coach Jeff Van Gundy's team, comprised of mainly NBA G League players, was 13 for 24 from 3-point range to win easily after a much tougher opening game against Puerto Rico on Thursday.

"This was a much better win today," guard Markel Brown said. "But in this situation, we'll take every win however we can get it, no matter how much we win by."

The Americans, the world's No. 1 ranked team and the

three-time defending Olympic champions, are used to winning big. But they also almost always have the most talent.

Talent alone won't win games for them now, with the new qualifying format's first two windows being played during the NBA season. So that ruled out for them and everyone else NBA and Euroleague talent, leaving teams scrambling to fill their rosters for games this week in the Americas, Europe, Asia and Africa.

The Americans are turning to NBA G Leaguers who were selected not long before their opening victory over the Puerto Ricans in Orlando, Florida.

"It's really hard to put a group together that quickly unless players are selfless, and we had a bunch of selfless guys who sacrificed not only their

time, but participating in the G League, to represent their country," Van Gundy said. "I couldn't be more proud of them."

Xavier Munford, Brown and Jonathan Holmes all finished with 14 points for the Americans.

The first opening-round windows wrap up Monday. After that teams are idle until February, when the Americans will host Cuba and Puerto Rico. That will come just after the All-Star break, giving USA Basketball plenty of time to evaluate the players it plans to choose for those games.

"Whoever is on that team, I'm sure if Coach coaches it, it is going to be another great team that gets the best out of the guys, and the guys are going to win that," Munford said.

THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Samoana 7 — Tafuna 6

It was the battle of the defenses, as both defensive squads gave their best performance of the season. Samoana opted to receive the opening kick off to start the match, but they were stopped by the Warriors before they reached the red zone.

Quarterback Tala Sufia, who played for the first time in three weeks, always had a sharp passing game but he just couldn't pull the trigger, as Samoana's pass coverage was on point from the opening quarter of the match.

It wasn't until a Tafuna third down from midfield that Sufia looked far downfield to fire a long one to Pulenu'u Fono; but that pass was intercepted by Elliot Lelei. The play showed Sufia that the Sharks defense came to play.

Lelei, Samoana's star wide receiver, was moved to safety since the playoff game two weeks ago against Faga'itua. He showed up big time for Samoana's defense last Saturday. He nearly recorded his second pick in the second quarter of the game, but was bobbled out of bounds after a match up against Pene Fa'avae.

It wasn't until the final minutes of the first half that the Warriors were able to pound in the opening score of the match.

2:06 remaining in the first half, and Sufia opts to tuck and run the ball in from the one-yard line for the opening touchdown of the game, on a first down and goal situation for the Warriors.

The two point conversion was an inside hand off to Ben Tuimaseve who was stopped immediately at the line of scrimmage by Kidman Sea to deny the Warriors extra point.

The Warriors led 6-0. As the Warrior Nation roared in celebration of their lead, the Sharks silenced Tafuna's sidelines after Lelei clearly beat his coverage in plain sight and

scored the tying touchdown.

Just after Tafuna scored, they kicked the ball off to Samoana, and it was received by Moses Michael Samia to spot Samoana a first down on their own 30-yard line.

There was a fake hand off to David Mikaele, as Anthony Feala dropped back and charged a long pass out to Lelei, who outran his defender and stormed towards the sidelines to make a perfect connection with Feala's pass, as Lelei hauled in Samoana's first touchdown of the game to tie things up at six a piece.

During the extra point conversion, it was an obvious field goal situation for the Sharks as head coach Pati Pati called Lelei in for the sure field goal, that gave the Sharks the 7-6 lead going into halftime.

During the second half, it was a showdown of the defenses, as offensive units were shut down to being scoreless.

Sufia and the Warriors fought to the last second.

It was a Tafuna 4th and long from midfield, with less than 10 seconds remaining on the clock, and Sufia has already scrambled out of the pocket desperately looking for a target.

With a lot of time to spare, Sufia fired a dangerous pass to two of his receivers. The pass was tipped by Samoana's Kalisi Lotulelei, and it fell right into the hands of Tafuna's Frank Mulipola who secured the catch and side stepped his way towards the end zone.

But Lelei stormed in with the touchdown-saving-tackle that stopped Mulipola at the 3-yard line as the clock hit zero.

Raiders back in contention after 21-14 win over Broncos

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — For everything that has gone wrong for Oakland this season, from a four-game losing streak to the defensive coordinator getting fired to the offense regressing, the Raiders somehow find themselves in contention in the mediocre AFC West.

Oakland got a boost Sunday when it eked out a 21-14 win over the Denver Broncos despite losing star receiver Michael Crabtree to an ejection for his role in a brawl and nearly squandering a 21-point lead to a last-place team.

“It’s just a lot of relief,” said Carr, who threw two TD passes . “And now, we sit where we sit and we know what’s ahead of us. It was just a lot of relief getting this win, getting back on the right track, and hopefully we can go on a run.”

With Kansas City (6-5) losing for the fifth time in six games, the Raiders (5-6) are now tied with the Chargers for second place and only need to win their own games to take the division title thanks to this latest win.

It was a wild one, starting with the first-quarter brawl between Crabtree and Denver cornerback Aqib Talib that overshadowed a week of turmoil for both teams. Denver fired offensive coordinator Mike McCoy and made another

quarterback change to give Paxton Lynch the start, and Oakland fired defensive coordinator Ken Norton Jr.

The fight was a continuation of a dispute that started last season when Talib ripped Crabtree’s chain off during the season finale. Crabtree missed the first game between the teams this year but wasted little time seeking revenge.

On the second play of Oakland’s second drive, Crabtree aggressively blocked Talib on a running play and drove him to the ground on the Broncos sideline. Talib ripped Crabtree’s chain off his neck while they were tangled up, and a brawl ensued . Guard Gabe Jackson pushed an official while trying to join in and got ejected, along with Crabtree and Talib.

“I guess his initiative was to come out there and fight today,” said Denver cornerback Chris Harris Jr., who said Crabtree “sucker-punched” him on the previous play. “I guess it wasn’t to play football.”

Here are some other take-aways from the game:

PAXTON’S PROBLEMS:
The switch to Lynch provided no spark for the Broncos. He threw for just 41 yards on 14 attempts while taking four sacks before leaving with an ankle injury. Trevor Siemian came in and threw two TD passes in the fourth quarter.

Mississippi decides to keep Luke as football coach

When Mississippi's football program was in shambles back in July, Matt Luke took over as the interim coach, restored order and kept the Rebels respectable on most weekends.

Now, he's earned the full-time job.

Ole Miss announced Sunday that it's keeping Luke as its football coach, three days after the Rebels finished the regular season with an emotional 31-28 victory over No. 16 Mississippi State in the Egg Bowl.

The 41-year-old initially took over the program during the summer on an interim basis after former coach Hugh Freeze's stunning resignation following a university investigation into his phone records.

Luke led the Rebels to a 6-6 record this season, including a 3-5 mark in the Southeastern Conference. Athletics director Ross Bjork had made no promises about keeping Luke beyond this season — and even hired a search firm to evaluate outside candidates — but ultimately decided to stick with the status quo.

The school says Luke will be officially introduced at a press conference on Monday morning. The terms of his new contract were not immediately released.

The decision to keep Luke will undoubtedly be popular inside the program. In the Egg Bowl's aftermath, players could be heard chanting "We want Luke!" in the locker room during a raucous celebration. Players routinely praised Luke as honest, passionate and down-to-Earth.

No. 9 Michigan State thumps No. 4 North Carolina 63-45

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — Joshua Lanford made five 3-pointers and scored 23 points and No. 4 Michigan State topped No. 9 North Carolina 63-45 on Sunday night to win the “Victory Bracket” of the PK80 Invitational.

Tom Izzo got the best of Roy Williams for the first time since Williams arrived in Chapel Hill, thanks to a dominating performance at the defensive end by the Spartans. Michigan State bullied the Tar Heels on the interior at both ends of the floor and getting just enough offense on a night North Carolina struggled to make anything. The Tar Heels shot just 24.6 percent.

Williams had won all seven previous matchups between the Tar Heels and Izzo’s Spartans.

Langford was key in the first half as the Spartans (5-1) built a 13-point halftime lead despite Miles Bridges and Jaren Jackson Jr. being limited with foul trouble. Langford had 14 points in the first half as Michigan State used an 11-4 run to take control and were never threatened by the Tar Heels.

Miles Bridges finished with 11 points

Theo Pinson led North Carolina (5-1), but Joel Berry II and Luke Maye both had awful nights. The Tar Heels trimmed the 21-point deficit to 12 with 4:30 left, but Bridges stemmed the run with a driving layup.

Maye had been brilliant to start the season for North Carolina but was 3 of 13 shooting, missed five free throws and finished with just eight points. Michigan State challenged seemingly every shot in the paint and the Tar Heels had no outside shooting. North Carolina was 1 of

18 on 3-point attempts. Berry was 2 of 11 overall. The Tar Heels had more turnovers (16) than field goals (15).

North Carolina’s night was so awful even the easiest plays became difficult. Kenny Williams made a fine interception of a pass in the first half but his breakaway layup caromed off the front rim and Winston drilled a 3-pointer at the other end to push Michigan State’s lead to 33-17. Late in the second half, Maye was wide open on a drive down the lane, yet his layup didn’t even touch the rim, his 10th miss of the game.

North Carolina shot 7 of 30 (23 percent) in the first half and Berry’s desperation flip at the half-time buzzer was the Tar Heels’ only 3-pointer of the night.

THE TAKEAWAY

North Carolina: The Tar Heels continued their streak of making at least one 3-pointer to 713 straight games dating to 1997. Barely. Berry’s 30-footer to end the first half was the only make and the Tar Heels shot under 10 percent from deep for the first time since late in the 2016 season against Duke.

Michigan State: Bridges appeared mostly recovered from the sprained left ankle that had limited the preseason All-American in the first two games of the tournament. Bridges played 26 minutes and had five rebounds.

1 dead in clash between Argentine police, Mapuche activists

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) — Police clashed with a group of Mapuche during an operation to clear lands seized by members of the indigenous community, and one young Mapuche was killed and two were injured, Argentina's government said Sunday.

The Security Ministry said in a statement that the incident happened Saturday and stemmed from a police operation that began Thursday in southern Argentina to evict Mapuche activists from properties they had taken over. It said the clash came after some Mapuche fled into the moun-

tains following their eviction from national park land near the Patagonia city of Bariloche.

The statement said four police officers searching in the area were attacked by 15 to 20 hooded people armed with spears, guns and stones. It said the officers fired some shots into the trees. Later, two Mapuche came down from the hill carrying a man who had been wounded but died on the way down, the statement said.

The Mapuche community of Lof Lafken Winkul Mapu said a 22-year-old Mapuche had been killed. They identified him as Rafael Nahuel.

Contestant from South Africa wins Miss Universe crown

LAS VEGAS (AP) — The woman representing South Africa won the Miss Universe crown Sunday.

Demi-Leigh Nel-Peters, who recently earned a business management degree, was crowned during the event at The AXIS theater at Planet Hollywood casino-resort on the Las Vegas Strip. The runner-up was Miss Colombia Laura Gonzalez, while the second runner-up was Miss Jamaica Davina Bennett.

Ninety-two women from around the world participated in the decades-old competition. This year's edition had the most contestants ever, including the first ever representatives of Cambodia, Laos and Nepal.

The 22-year-old Nel-Peters has earned a yearlong salary, a luxury apartment in New York City for the duration of her reign and more prizes.

Steve Harvey returned as the show's host despite botching the 2015 Miss Universe crowning. On Sunday, he poked fun at his mistake throughout the night. Three days after people in the U.S. celebrated Thanksgiving, Harvey told the audience he is "grateful for the Oscars," referring to the best-picture flub at this year's Academy Awards.

Grammy-Award winner Fergie performed her new song "A Little Work" while the contestants walked down the stage wearing evening gowns. This

year's judges included YouTube star Lele Pons, former judge of "America's Next Top Model" Jay Manuel and Wendy Fitzwilliam, the 1998 Miss Universe winner from Trinidad and Tobago.

President Donald Trump offended Hispanics when he made anti-immigrant remarks in announcing his bid for the White House in 2015. At the time, he co-owned The Miss Universe Organization with NBCUniversal, but the network and the Spanish-language broadcaster Univision quickly cut ties with him, refusing to air the show. Trump sued both networks, eventually settling and selling off the entire pageant

Meredith buying Time Inc. for about \$1.8 billion

NEW YORK (AP) — Meredith Corp. announced Sunday that it is buying Time Inc. for about \$1.8 billion, a deal CEO Stephen Lacy called "a transformative and financially compelling growth opportunity" that joins two giant magazine companies. Meredith brings with it a magazine portfolio that includes Better Homes & Gardens, Family Circle, all-recipes and Shape, while Time Inc. owns properties including Time, Sports Illustrated, People, Fortune and Entertainment Weekly. The companies said the deal was unanimously approved by their boards of directors and will close early next year.

Meredith will pay \$18.50 per

share in cash for Time's nearly 100 million outstanding shares. It said it is using \$3.55 billion in financing commitments from a variety of lenders and a \$650 million preferred equity from Koch Equity Development, an investment arm of Koch Industries, to finance the deal and pay down existing debt. Prior to the announcement, Meredith had just \$28 million in cash on hand, according to its latest quarterly report. Combined, the companies posted \$4.8 billion in revenue last year. Meredith expects it will save up to \$500 million in costs in the first two years of operation and plans to "aggressively pay down" debt by 2020.

The procedure for a ligament injury was performed by Dr. Frank Scott on Sunday, the team announced. There is

no precise timetable for his return, but will be "dependent upon consistent assessment throughout the rehab process," the Nuggets said. Millsap was hurt in the first half of the Nuggets' loss to the Los Angeles Lakers on Nov. 19.

The 32-year-old Millsap

is averaging 15.3 points, 6.2 rebounds and 3.1 assists in his first season with the Nuggets. He signed a three-year, \$90 million free agent deal over the summer.

Denver is off to an 11-8 start this season.
