

UFC: Champ Jon Jones flagged for another failed doping test

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Jon Jones could face a lengthy suspension from mixed martial arts after the UFC light heavyweight champion was notified Tuesday of his second potential violation of the promotion's anti-doping policy.

Jones is widely considered the top pound-for-pound fighter in his sport. The potential violation stems from a sample collected after his weigh-in July 28 for his title fight against Daniel Cormier at UFC 214 in Anaheim, California.

Jones (23-1) beat Cormier with a vicious third-round head kick, reclaiming his 205-pound belt after sitting out the previous year under suspension for his first failed doping test. The victory appeared to be a return to glory for a fighter who has repeatedly hindered his stellar career with misbehavior outside the octagon.

Jones was stripped of his belt in 2015 after his arrest for his involvement in a hit-and-run accident. He was scheduled to fight Cormier for the title in July 2016, but was pulled from the UFC 200 card and eventually suspended for what he claimed was a failed test due to a sexual enhancement pill.

Last month, the 30-year-old Jones emphatically denied he has ever used performance-enhancing drugs. ⊗

Jones hasn't yet been stripped of his light heavyweight title for a second time, but it will be a formality if the doping violation is confirmed. Cormier held the belt for most of Jones' absence, and he will likely be the champion again, UFC President Dana White said.

"Jon and I have been mad at each other since UFC 200, but the reality is we've been here for this kid every step of the way," White said. "How many times did I fly to Albuquerque when he was in trouble? The list goes on and on, what we've done for this guy. It's really sad."

Jones' camp and his manager, Malki Kawa, released a statement: "We are all at a complete loss for words right now. Jon, his trainers, his nutritionists and his entire camp have worked tirelessly and meticulously the past 12 months to avoid this exact situation. We are having the samples tested again to determine the validity or source of contamination. Jon is crushed by this news and we are doing whatever we can as a team, to support him."

In a statement, Cormier said he was "disappointed" and "very emotional" about the news.

"In my mind, on July 29, I competed and I lost," said Cormier, who is on vacation in Hawaii with his family.

"I thought Jon Jones was the better man that day. I don't know what to think anymore. I can't believe we are going through all of this again. We will see what happens next."

If the violation is confirmed, Jones is almost certain to face a multiyear suspension from the sport, taking away even more of his fighting prime.

The UFC also will be harmed by the lengthy absence of its best fighter and a burgeoning pay-per-view draw.

The penalties for a second offense range from one to four years, depending on several aggravating or mitigating circumstances, said Jeff Novitzky, the UFC's vice president of athlete health and performance.

"Jon definitely has one penalty under the system," Novitzky said. "So the second penalty, if it were to come to that, basically doubles the amount of the first."

White revealed that the UFC was hoping to book Jones in a fight against heavyweight champion Stipe Miocic in Detroit later this year. Instead, two divisions have been thrown into turmoil.

The UFC also could lose its dream matchup between Jones and former heavyweight champion Brock Lesnar. The superstars both appeared eager to meet next year in a heavyweight fight that would be among the biggest events in the UFC's history.

"It's not over yet," White said. "He's got to go through the (legal) process. Maybe there was something crazy that happened for this stuff to get into his system. So I don't know."

USADA administers the UFC's doping policy. The California State Athletic Commission also has jurisdiction over Jones' test.

On Basketball: Kyrie gets a new address, but Cavs win trade

MIAMI (AP) — It's not the principals that will define the blockbuster trade between Cleveland and Boston. Great point guard leaves one city for another. That seems fair.

All the other parts, they will tell the story. There are many ways to claim victory in the deal made Tuesday night. Kyrie Irving wanted his own team and got it, so he wins. Isaiah Thomas gets to play with LeBron James, so he wins. The Cavaliers got rid of a supposedly disgruntled star, so they won. The Celtics now won't have to decide if Thomas is worth something like a \$180 million deal next summer, so they win. It's all semantics.

But look past all that. In the end, Cleveland won. James won, too. Here's a few reasons why James will be celebrating this deal: He'll still have a high-octane point guard; he's getting an absurdly good defender in Jae Crowder (he could have helped the Cavs' cause against Golden State in The Finals); he won't be going into the season dealing with drama about Irving's Cleveland future; this trade might even reap the Cavaliers the No. 1 pick in next year's draft.

All good things, all edge to Cleveland. Give the Celtics credit for being bold. Danny Ainge knew winning the Eastern Conference's regular-season crown last season was meaningless, so he completely blew up a team that was a No. 1 seed and got hammered by the Cavaliers in the East finals. Sure, the Celtics played most of that series without Thomas, but that wasn't going to matter. The Cavs weren't losing that series.

So Ainge goes out and gets an All-Star point guard in Irving, after he hauls in Gordon Hayward during free agency and adds probable rookie of the year front-runner Jayson Tatum to the mix in the draft — plus gets another draft pick in either 2018 or 2019 for his trouble. It's not a bad deal for the Celtics. They get Irving. It's his team. A storied franchise is in his hands and he will savor that.

It's just a better deal for Cleveland, at least right now. Minnesota never offered Andrew Wiggins. Miami never offered half its roster. Portland wasn't giving up Damian Lillard. In the end the

Cavs still got a star for a star, and since Thomas is only making about \$6.3 million next season they got plenty of bonus parts as well to make the trade work.

It also solved one big Cleveland problem. James' only motivation is rings, and this move gives him just that. He will be looking to go to the Finals for the eighth consecutive year. Only three teams in NBA history have been to four straight finals — the Lakers, the Celtics, and the Miami Heat when James was with them. Golden State will be heavy favorites to join that club next June. The Cavaliers won't surprise many if they join them.

James will show up at camp in a couple of months and begin plotting ways to get his team back to the Finals. Had Irving still been there, James surely would have been wondering if they could make it work again. With Thomas, there won't be a question. James and Thomas already have great respect for one another, and Thomas runs on the same prove-people-wrong gasoline that James uses.

Cleveland has been through the free-agency-is-looming dance with James before, of course. If the Cavs want to keep him next summer, they simply have to go all-in to make him as happy as possible. This trade probably wasn't a bad start on that front.

In Boston, the Celtics will look very different this season. Irving and Hayward are in; Thomas, Crowder, Avery Bradley, Kelly Olynyk and Amir Johnson are out — meaning five of Boston's seven top scorers from a No. 1 seed now play elsewhere.

The Cavs weren't overhauled; Irving is gone, Thomas, Derrick Rose and Jeff Green arrived.

From a continuity standpoint, obvious edge to Cleveland as well. Regardless of all these Celtics-Cavaliers fireworks, it's still Golden State's world and probably will be for a long time. This deal didn't change that.

The Warriors will still be the favorites to win the last game of next season. The first game of next season, as luck would have it, just happens to be Boston at Cleveland. And just like that, the NBA has drama again.

Sims sharp, Braves score on crazy play, beat Mariners 4-0

ATLANTA (AP) — Rookie Lucas Sims pitched three-hit ball over six innings and the Atlanta Braves scored on a crazy play that took three rundowns in a 4-0 victory over the Seattle Mariners on Tuesday night.

Sims (2-3) won his second straight start after starting his big league career with three losses in a row. Seattle only got two runners as far as second base against the 23-year-old right-hander, a native of suburban Atlanta who won for the first time in front of the home folks.

Nick Markakis put the Braves ahead in the fourth, leading off with his eighth homer of the season against Marco Gonzalez (0-1), yet another replacement starter in Seattle's injury-plagued rotation. Markakis added a run-scoring single in the fifth.

After committing four errors in the series opener, the Mariners botched two more plays defensively.

Third baseman Kyle Seager dropped a throw during a rundown in the fifth, allowing Ozzie Albies to race home. Seattle made five throws on the play, ending when first baseman Yonder Alonso cut across the diamond with the ball chasing one runner, then tossing to catcher Mike Zunino for a tag between second and third.

Another unearned run scored after center fielder Mitch Haniger fumbled away a routine flyball.

In his fourth start since being acquired from St. Louis, Gonzalez surrendered six hits in 4 2-3 innings, walked three and struck out five.

The left-hander retired the first two hitters in the fifth but couldn't get through the inning.

After Freddie Freeman walked and Matt Kemp singled, the Mariners called in James Pazos from the bullpen. Markakis foiled that strategy, singling to left-center to bring home Freeman.

Four Atlanta pitchers combined on the four-hit shutout. Jose Ramirez pitched the seventh, Sam Freeman worked 1 1-3 innings and Arodys Vizcaino got the final two outs.

Seattle began the night one game out of an AL wild-card spot.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Mariners RHP Tony Zych (right flexor strain) was placed on the 10-day disabled list with a right flexor strain. Zych, who last pitched Saturday at Tampa Bay, is 6-3 with a 2.66 ERA in 45 appearances. "It's probably the best thing to give him 10 days and let it calm down," manager Scott Servais said. RHP Dan Altavilia was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma to fill Zych's spot on the roster. He made 29 appearances for the Mariners earlier this season, going 1-1 with a 5.46 ERA. ... Seattle RHP David Phelps (right elbow) felt good after throwing a simulated game Monday in Atlanta and "could be activated here really soon," according to Servais.

UP NEXT

Mariners: RHP Erasmo Ramirez (5-4) makes his fifth start since being acquired from Tampa Bay in a July 28 trade. He is 1-1 with a 3.54 ERA for Seattle.

Braves: R.A. Dickey (8-8) makes his first appearance against the Mariners since Sept. 23, 2014, when he pitched for Toronto. The 42-year-old knuckleballer is 5-5 with a 4.99 in 15 career games vs. Seattle.

Polanco stays hot as Twins top White Sox 4-1

CHICAGO (AP) — Jorge Polanco homered for the third time in two days, smacking one of the Minnesota Twins' three long balls in a 4-1 victory over the Chicago White Sox on Tuesday night.

Polanco led off the fourth inning with his sixth homer of the season after going deep in both ends of a doubleheader Monday.

Kennys Vargas and Eddie Rosario added home runs against rookie Lucas Giolito (0-1) in his White Sox debut. The Twins remained in playoff position with their fifth win in six games.

Giolito, who came to Chicago from the Washington Nationals in an offseason trade for Adam Eaton, allowed six hits and four runs, striking out four.

Rookie Yoan Moncada hustled for a double on a slow ground ball through the infield in the first inning, moved to third base on a fly ball from Jose Abreu and then scored on a wild pitch to open the scoring.

After Polanco's home run tied it, Vargas started the fifth with a towering shot to right on an 0-2 count to go up 2-1. Rosario hit a two-run home run in the sixth inning.

Minnesota entered with a half-game lead for the second AL wild card and is attempting to hold off a pack that includes the Los Angeles Angels, Seattle, Kansas City and Texas, who all entered Tuesday within two games of the Twins.

Kyle Gibson (7-10) struck out a season-high eight batters over seven innings, allowing one run. Gibson is 6-2 against the White Sox in his career, his most wins against any oppo-

ment, and has a 2.26 ERA in those games.

Gibson stranded the bases loaded in the second and third innings, getting three straight swinging strikeouts in the third after three White Sox reached with no outs.

Trevor Hildenberger retired all three batters in the eighth and Matt Belisle closed his fourth save.

PROSPECT PARADE

Giolito was the latest Chicago prospect to debut this year at Guaranteed Rate Field.

Carson Fulmer gave up six runs in 1 1/3 innings in his White Sox season debut on Monday. Reynaldo Lopez, acquired along with Giolito and minor leaguer Dane Dunning, made his White Sox debut on Aug. 11.

STREAK SNAPPED

Byron Buxton went 0 for 4 to end his 12-game hitting streak. He was tied for the AL lead with Seattle's Nelson Cruz, who extended his streak to 13 on Tuesday.

RELIABLE ROOKIE

Chicago's Nicky Delmonico walked in the third inning. The rookie has reached base in 19 of his 20 major league games and has hit six home runs in that span.

Ozuna, Yelich go deep, Marlins beat Phils 7-4 for sweep

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Marcell Ozuna hit a two-run homer, Christian Yelich had a three-run shot and robbed Nick Williams of a two-run drive and the Miami Marlins beat the Philadelphia Phillies 7-4 to complete a doubleheader sweep Tuesday night.

Williams and Andres Blanco each hit quirky homers for the Phillies, Tommy Joseph also went deep and the teams combined for 14 homers in the two games.

Ichiro Suzuki's pinch-hit three-run homer broke a tie in the seventh inning, Giancarlo Stanton added his major league-leading 46th homer and the Marlins won the opener 12-8.

Jose Urena (12-5) allowed three runs and five hits in five innings to win Game 2. Brad Ziegler pitched the ninth for his third save in four tries.

The Marlins jumped ahead 6-0 in the second inning of the nightcap after Ozuna went deep in the first and Yelich connected an inning later to chase Nick Pivetta (4-9). Pivetta allowed six runs and seven hits while recording only four outs.

Williams drove one 445 feet out to right-center into the elevator that brings visiting pitchers from the bullpen to the field. Blanco lined a shot off a picture of his face on the scoreboard on the facing of the second deck in right.

Williams nearly had another homer in the fifth, but Yelich leaped over the fence in right-center and snagged it.

Joseph launched a solo shot

to left to cut it to 6-4 in the sixth.

Ozuna also went deep for the Marlins in a six-run sixth in the first game and J.T. Realmuto hit a two-run shot in the ninth.

Rhys Hoskins, Cameron Rupp, Cesar Hernandez, Joseph and Blanco all connected for the Phillies.

Marlins starter Dan Straily (8-8) allowed three runs and two hits — both homers — while striking out 10 in six innings.

Philadelphia's Aaron Nola (9-9) gave up seven runs and nine hits in 6 1-3 innings in his second straight poor start after 10 excellent outings in a row.

Suzuki, who leads the majors with 21 pinch hits, has two pinch homers in his career. The other was against the Phillies on Sept. 6, 2016.

Stanton made an outstanding, outstretched catch in right-center to rob Cameron Perkins of extra bases in the seventh inning of Game 2.

Fister fires 1-hitter as Red Sox romp Indians 9-1

CLEVELAND (AP) — Doug Fister gave up a leadoff homer in the first inning to Francisco Lindor and then nothing else, finishing with a career-best one-hitter, and Eduardo Nunez had five RBIs as the Boston Red Sox rolled to a 9-1 victory over the Cleveland Indians on Tuesday night.

Fister (3-6) was facing Cleveland for the third time in four starts, and the right-hander took advantage of his familiarity with the Indians' lineup. He allowed two walks and hit a batter, but was otherwise in control.

Backed by two double plays, he pitched his first complete game since 2014 with Washington.

Jackie Bradley Jr. homered in the fifth off Carlos Carrasco (12-6) and Nunez connected for two-run double in the seventh and three-run homer in the eighth.

The AL East-leading Red Sox improved to 15-4 since July 31.

The game's start was delayed 73 minutes because of rain. It was a rough day all around for the Indians.

The club placed All-Star reliever Andrew Miller (knee tendinitis) and starter Danny Salazar (elbow) on the disabled list. Also, second baseman Jason Kipins left after one at-bat with tightness in his right hamstring. He recently spent a month on the DL with a strained hamstring.

Fister, who was claimed on waivers from the Los Angeles Angels in late June, pitched against Cleveland a week ago when the Indians swung by

Fenway Park to play a makeup of a game postponed earlier this season.

He took a 1-0 lead to the mound in the first, but gave it back on his third pitch when Lindor hit his 21st homer, a towering shot to right. Fister, though, buckled down and handled the Indians with ease, retiring the final 14 batters in a row.

Leading 3-1, the Red Sox gave Fister some insurance with a three-run seventh, highlighted by Nunez's double.

With two on, Nunez hit a shot high off the wall in left to score both Sandy Leon and Bradley, who injured his left thumb reaching around catcher Yan Gomes' tag.

The Red Sox said Bradley will undergo further tests.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Red Sox: RHP Matt Barnes (strained lower back) was placed on the 10-day disabled list.

He pitched to two batters in Monday's game and said afterward that his back was bothering him. RHP Hector Velazquez was recalled from Triple-A Pawtucket.

Indians: RHP Josh Tomlin will make a rehab start on Friday, and if all goes well, he'll take Salazar's spot in the rotation. He went on the disabled list in July with a strained left hamstring.

UP NEXT

Indians ace Corey Kluber, who is 8-1 with a 2.09 ERA at home this season, faces Boston's Drew Pomeranz. The left-hander was forced to leave his last start in the fourth inning with back spasms.



Rays hold on for 6-5 win over Blue Jays

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) — The Tampa Bay Rays' 6-5 victory over the Toronto Blue Jays on Tuesday night was their 62nd of the season. Alex Colome has saved 37 of them, the most in the major leagues.

Colome gave up a run for the first time in nine appearances. But after giving up hits to Kendrys Morales and Steve Pearce and a sacrifice fly that left the potential game-tying run on third base, he got a ground ball with the infield in and a flyout to finish the game.

"Even if things get a little hairy, he trusts his ability," winning pitcher Chris Archer said. "He's allowed to give up a run every now and then, he's human. But he got that save, and that's why he's a lock-down reliever."

"I try to keep the ball down and get ground balls," Colome said. "That's what I was thinking - keep the man on third, try to get some popup or ground ball." Lucas Duda and Corey Dickerson homered in the first two innings and Archer struck out 10 for the Rays, who have won only three of their last 11. The Blue Jays lost their fourth straight.

Duda's 23rd home run (sixth with Tampa Bay) came off rookie Chris Rowley in the first inning after Norichika Aoki had led off the game with a homer off Archer. Dickerson hit his 23rd homer in the second, starting a three-run inning off Rowley that put the Rays ahead 4-1. Aoki drove in another run with a sacrifice fly in the fifth after a double by Ezequiel Carrera and an RBI single by Ryan Goins. Carrera had entered the game in the third inning after the ejection of Blue Jays center fielder Kevin Pillar by home plate umpire Chad Fairchild.

Josh Donaldson's 21st home run came off Rays reliever Tommy Hunter in the eighth.

Miguel Montero made it 6-5 with a sacrifice fly off Colome.

Colome's 37 saves are "a product of the style of baseball

we play," according to the Rays manager Kevin Cash. "We play a lot of tight games, we pitch well for the most part, and we're in a lot of tight games. The bulk of our wins are relying on him to get the final three, four or five outs." Archer (9-7) gave up three runs (one earned) and four hits in six innings.

Rowley (1-1) gave up four runs and five hits in 3 1/3 innings in his third major league start for the Blue Jays.

"I was working the corners a little bit and got behind," Rowley said. "The last time I pitched against them I got away with it a little bit more, just didn't tonight."

SENSITIVE TIMES

Part of Pillar's 4-minute explanation of his ejection: "I get it, we're living in sensitive times and these umpires are highly sensitive, but at the same time it is part of their job description. They're human beings, they are going to make mistakes. I'm a human being, I'm going to offer my opinion. I just think it's sad."

NO SINGLES OR DOUBLES

After his first three major league starts, left-handers are hitting only .185 against the right-handed Rowley. However, the five hits include three triples and two home runs.

Blue Jays: C Russell Martin (left oblique) missed his 10th game and is not close to returning, according to manager John Gibbons.

Rays: Of the RHPs on the disabled list, Alex Cobb (turf toe) will start Thursday's game; Jake Faria (abdominal strain) will resume throwing on Thursday; Matt Andriese (hip stress reaction) will make a rehab start Wednesday for Triple-A Durham.

Dodgers' offense leads the way in 8-5 win over Pirates

PITTSBURGH (AP) — The Los Angeles Dodgers added two more players to the disabled list Tuesday: 14-game winner Alex Wood and rookie of the year candidate Cody Bellinger.

It didn't seem to slow them down at all.

Neither could a short outing from starting pitcher Brock Stewart, as the Dodgers' offense and bullpen more than picked up the slack in an 8-5 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates on Tuesday night.

Chris Taylor had three of the Dodgers' 10 hits and he drove in three runs and Yasmani Grandal hit a two-run home run.

Corey Seager drove in the winning run in the sixth, knocking in Adrian Gonzalez, who had led off the inning with a double off Johnny Barbato (0-1). The hit was Gonzalez's 2,000th of his career.

The Dodgers also took advantage of a career-high five walks from Pirates starter Jameson Taillon. Taillon gave up five hits and five runs in his five innings of work.

"Those guys are just good hitters," Taillon said. "I felt like I made some good pitches. Anything close to the zone, if it wasn't their pitch, they were spitting on it. I was a couple balls off, but they were close pitches and they just took them." Stewart started for the Dodgers but lasted just two-plus innings. He allowed five runs, including a two-run home run by Starling Marte and a bases-loaded double by Josh Harrison.

After Stewart, the Los Angeles bullpen combined for seven scoreless innings. Former Pirates reliever Tony Watson (7-4) picked up the win with a 1-2-3 fifth inning. Watson is 2-0 since joining the Dodgers. Josh Ravin and Tony Cingrani each pitched two innings. Josh Fields pitched the eighth to get to Kenley Jansen, who struck out the side in the ninth for his 34th save. "They did a great job," Dodgers manager Dave Roberts said. "Watson, I think that was the best inning he's thrown with us. Obviously, you get Ravin just getting here, pitched a day ago and what he did was getting out of that and giving us an inning-plus was huge. Fields and Kenley. The story of the night, obviously, was the bullpen." The win over the Pirates secured the Dodgers at least a split of the four-game series, their 22nd consecutive series without suffering a loss. They have won 23 of their last 27 games and that's with Bellinger and Wood joining the likes of Yu Darvish and Clayton Kershaw among the 12 players on the disabled list. They have also won all five matchups against the Pirates so far this season. "When you win as many games as they have, you look a little taller. You walk a little taller," Pirates manager Clint Hurdle said. "When you can have Adrian Gonzalez at seventh in your lineup, it pretty much sums it up for me."

MAKING MOVES

Both teams reshuffled their pitching staffs after a 12-inning game on Monday. The Dodgers recalled Ravin and Stewart from Triple-A Oklahoma City. The Pirates brought up Barbato, Edgar Santana and Steven Brault from Triple-A Indianapolis.

TRAINING ROOM

Dodgers: Bellinger (right ankle sprain) was hurt in a play at the outfield wall in Detroit on Saturday. He took swings Tuesday, but did not improve quickly enough. Wood (left sternoclavicular joint inflammation) complained of discomfort after throwing six innings against Pittsburgh on Monday.
