

NBA G League player dies after collapsing during game

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (AP) — Zeke Upshaw, a swingman for the Detroit Pistons' G League affiliate who collapsed on the court during a game over the weekend, died Monday.

Upshaw, 26, died at a hospital, the Grand Rapids Drive said. No cause was disclosed. He collapsed Saturday night near the end of a game against the Long Island Nets.

The Pistons held a moment of silence in Upshaw's memory Monday night before their home game against the Los Angeles Lakers. The G League also pushed back the start of its playoffs, delaying not just the Drive's upcoming game but the entire first

"Zeke was an outstanding young man whose powerful belief in himself and uncommon perseverance led to a successful professional basketball career," G League president Malcolm Turner said in a news release. "A beloved member of the Grand Rapids Drive, Zeke's continuous improvement and tireless work ethic were hallmarks of his career.'

Upshaw's mother, Jewel Upshaw, released a statement thanking the team and fans. Team owner Steve Jbara said the Grand Rapids area was fortunate to enjoy Upshaw's commitment to the community, especially children.

Numerous NBA players posted messages of sorrow after Upshaw's death was announced. Some members of the Pistons scrawled tributes on the sneakers they wore for their game Monday night, as did Ben Simmons of the Philadelphia 76ers.

"Lost a real one today," Pistons star Andre Drummond wrote on Twitter. "Tragic loss of Zeke Upshaw, my thoughts and prayers are with all of Zeke's family and friends during this difficult time. ... Rest easy my guy.'

Upshaw scored 11 points in Saturday's 101-99 win for Grand Rapids, which secured the Drive a spot in the G League playoffs. The Drive and Toronto affiliate Raptors 905 are scheduled to play in a single-elimination playoff game on Friday at Mississauga, Ontario. That game was originally slated to be played on Wednesday.

Upshaw was on defense Saturday night and coming out of a timeout with 49 seconds left when he appeared to stumble while chasing a Long Island player across the court. The video feed of the game showed Upshaw moments later motionless, lying face down. A referee stopped the game immediately, and Drive medical personnel were at Upshaw's side within seconds.

NFL weighing changes to catch rule

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) That's a catch.

Mention the names Calvin Johnson, Dez Bryant, Zach Miller and Jesse James, and what looked, sounded and felt like a catch wasn't one. If NFL owners pass a proposal from the powerful competition committee, those will be receptions in the future.

According to committee chairman Rich McKay and league officiating director Al Riveron, it's time.

"We want to take these great catches and make them into catches," Riveron said Monday at the NFL meetings, where the owners likely will vote Tuesday on the adjustments to the catch

Such phrases as "slight movement of the ball" and "surviving the ground" will disappear, and fans, players and coaches will get the fulfilment of knowing what they were sure was a reception actually is.

Tucker hits slam in 1st Minute Maid AB as **Astros top Brewers**

HOUSTON (AP) — Kyle Tucker gave Houston Astros fans a nice peak into the future a few days before the World Series champions formally begin their title defense.

The prized prospect hit a grand slam in his first-ever at-bat at Minute Maid Park to lift Houston over the Milwaukee Brewers 5-2 in an exhibition game Monday night.

"It was awesome. The atmosphere from the first inning or even yesterday coming to the field was awesome," Tucker said. "I was super pumped. To finally to get to play on this field was awesome. It's a dream ever since you were a little kid. It was a great night."

Tucker, the fifth overall pick in the 2015 draft, went deep in the seventh inning after replacing Josh Reddick in left field. It was Tucker's fifth homer of the spring and gives him 21 RBIs and a .439 average.

"He's had a nice spring and a nice impression," Astros manager A.J. Hinch said. "I'm not sure I'd be impressed more or any less whether he punches out tomorrow or hits another homer. The long view of him is he looks like he's going to be a really good player. His time will come."

Tucker is already slated to join one of the Astros' minor league affiliates before opening day Thursday. He split last season between Class A Buies Creek and Double-A Corpus Christi.

Reigning AL MVP Jose Altuve had two hits, and Houston starter Lance McCullers Jr. allowed his first runs since March 11 by giving up two with three hits. He also struck out three in three innings.

McCullers finished spring training 3-0 with 24 strikeouts in 21 innings.

"I was able to come into spring healthy, which allowed me to make a full solid five outings down there and got my pitch count up close to 90 my last time out in Florida," McCullers said. "Today I was able to come out and throw three (innings) of 50 pitches. I feel good. I'm on normal rest but because I threw less pitches I'm going to be a little more fresh."

McCullers will get his first regular season start on Saturday

PHILADELPHIA (AP) -Markelle Fultz heard 20,000 fans chanting "Fultz! Fultz! Fultz!" and for a fleeting moment he thought they were serenading Philly's most popular athlete.

"I thought they were saying 'Nick Foles," Fultz said of the Super Bowl MVP for the champion Philadelphia Eagles.

"Then I realized it, and it was pretty dope. These fans are clinched a playoff berth for great, and I love them."

The Sixers and their fans wanted the No. 1 pick to play and — after five often-confusing months — they got him.

Fultz scored 10 points and had eight assists in his first game since October, helping the Philadelphia 76ers beat the Denver Nuggets 123-104 on Monday night.

The first selection of the 2017 draft shot an airball, had three shots blocked and artfully attacked the lane, flashing glimpses of what has made him both a mystery project and prominent prospect.

With Philadelphia having the first time since 2012, Fultz decided the time was right to return from the injured shoulder and busted confidence that had cost him all but four games of his rookie season.

Fultz was on a media blackout in his absence and said nothing in his public return to clarify his situation.

He basically ignored the first two questions about his shoulder, and instead thanked teammates and coaches for their support during rehab.

Why was today the day to

"Just woke up and it was that day," he said.

His next two answers were as empty as his stat line since October.

Did he do something to hurt his shoulder or just feel soreness?

Fultz rubbed his face and stared straight without talking and grabbed a towel someone tossed him. His wiped his face during a few more seconds of awkward silence.

Why not talk about the injury?

Blank stare.

Fultz sparked the 76ers at times in actions, certainly not words, in a reserve role.

"He looked confident," coach Brett Brown said. "I thought it was a real, sort of

bold, gutsy effort that he made given where he was now where he is."

The 19-year-old Fultz played the 76ers' first four games of the season before he was ruled out indefinitely in October with soreness and a scapular muscle imbalance in the shoulder.

The Sixers aren't sure what they'll get out of Fultz as they push toward 50 wins.

"That is a great unknown," team president Bryan Colangelo said. "I'm not sure I have the answer. We will have to ... certainly not judge tonight as the sole case of what to expect going forward."

Fultz checked in to a standing ovation with 2:54 left in the first quarter and drove down the baseline for a quick basket. But Fultz - whose awkward shooting form made him a punchline in the NBA — fired an airball later in the quarter.

Perhaps trying to force his shot too much, Fultz also had two shots blocked on the same possession. He was a pedestrian 1 for 4 with three assists in the first half.Fultz scored two baskets in the third quarter, missed a spin move in the lane and had another shot blocked.

"It was a little bit of excitement and little bit of just like, I gotta help the team," Fultz said. "Once I stepped on the floor, it felt great just to be back out there with my brothers."

He did not shoot a 3-pointer or attempt a free-throw. It was his gruesome, clunky form at the line that got him mocked on social media.

"That's what the media's job is, to try to do what they have to do to get paid," Fultz said.

The fans hardly seemed to care.Fultz was cheered each time he touched the ball, and they went wild when he sank two jumpers late in the game. The 6-foot-4 guard out of Washington just may have a significant impact after all in the postseason."I love these guys. They're my guys," Fultz said. "I'm just trying to be the best teammate I can possibly be."






If your mother needs a companion and your family finances allow it, hire someone to stay with her. It's time you had a life of your own. Consider it the price of your freedom.





Mini Fact:

Thomas Jefferson served as president from 1801 to 1809.

The United States' third president, Thomas Jefferson, was born on April 13, 1743 275 years ago! Jefferson was more than just a president. His ideas and actions were important to the formation of our country.

This week, The Mini Page learns more about this fascinating Founding Father.

As a boy

Thomas was born in the colony of Virginia at his family's home, Shadwell. He was the third-oldest of 10 children. When Thomas was just 2 years old, his father's friend William Randolph died. Thomas' father was asked to take care of Randolph's children, so the family moved to Randolph's plantation, Tuckahoe. They lived at Tuckahoe for seven years.

Ťhomas' family was wealthy. His father had a library full of books, and his parents taught their children to enjoy music and dance. Thomas played the violin. But when he got

tired of playing, he read his father's books.
At 9 years old, Thomas went to live with a teacher, Rev. William Douglas, who taught him French, Latin and Greek. Thomas came to believe that education was more important than money or land.

Off to college

Thomas left home for the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, when he was 17. He loved living in the Colonial capital of Virginia, where he gambled, danced and watched politics unfold. He graduated after just two years at college and went on to

study law with professor George Wythe.

During that time, Thomas was invited to dinners and other events where educated, curious people met and talked about science, literature and politics. Jefferson hosted similar gatherings throughout his life, even during his time in the White House.

Entering politics

Jefferson was elected to the Virginia House of Burgesses in 1769. This group was elected to make laws for the Colony. Although Jefferson owned and inherited slaves, he used his public office to try to reform, or change, slavery. In 1769, he proposed a law that would allow slave owners to free their servants. But his bill never became law.

Other interests

Thomas Jefferson showed great interest

in architecture, or the art and science of designing and building structures. He was also fond of gadgets, and he invented new ways to do things throughout his life.



For example, Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence on a lap desk that he designed and had built. He linked his parlor doors with chains under the floor so that when one opened, the other would too.

His greatest work

On April 19, 1775, the war between British troops and American Colonists began in Massachusetts. Two months later, Thomas Jefferson left his home, Monticello, and went to Philadelphia to serve in the Second Continental Congress, where statesmen talked about what to do about the war.

Jefferson was not a speaker like Patrick Henry, but he listened and wrote well. In June 1776, the Congress decided a declaration of independence from Britain should be written. John Adams declared that Jefferson should do it.

On July 4, 1776, the Congress approved Jefferson's Declaration of Independence, and the United States became a country.



Farmers, beekeepers and scientists are worried about bees. Bees are disappearing around the world. Researchers think several factors may be contributing: Chemicals meant to kill other insects that eat crops could accidentally harm the bees. Development of wild areas, abandoned farms, growing crops without leaving habitat for wildlife, and growing gardens with flowers that are not friendly to pollinators contribute to poor nutrition for bees, making them
