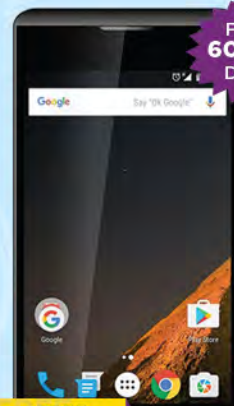

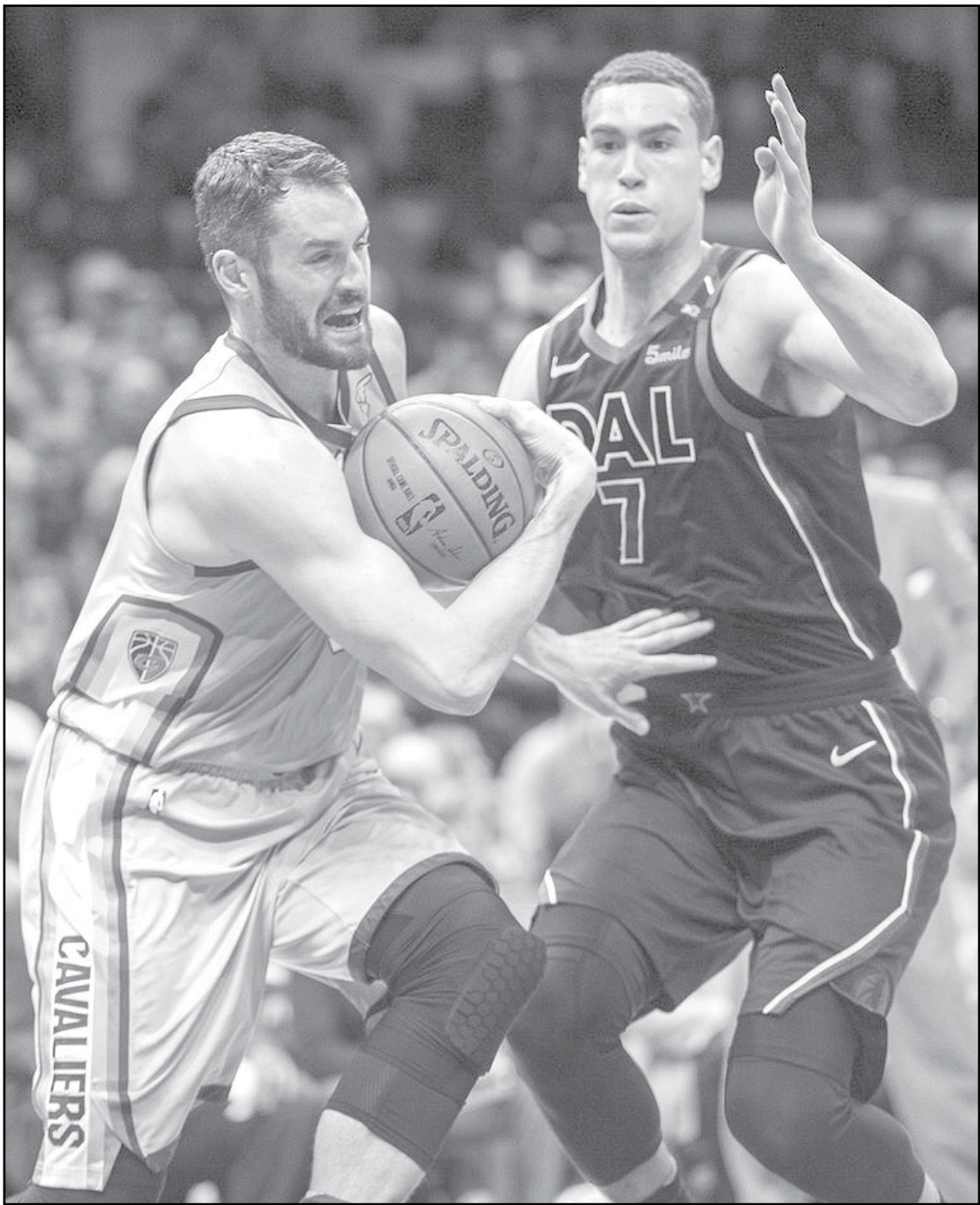

LeBron, Cavs struggle before beating Mavericks 98-87

CLEVELAND (AP) — LeBron James struggled before extending his record double-digit scoring streak to 868 games and the Cleveland Cavaliers had a rough time with Dallas before putting away the lottery-bound Mavericks 98-87 on Sunday night.

James, who broke Michael Jordan's NBA mark for consecutive games with at least 10 points on Friday night, didn't reach 10 until 7:59 remained. He finished just 5 of 21 from the field but made a pair of 3-pointers as the Cavs finally pulled away with a 15-2 run in the fourth quarter.

James had 16 points, 13 rebounds and 12 assists, his 17th triple-double this season and No. 72 of his career.

Cleveland has withstood numerous injuries and won eight of nine, and the Cavs continue to hold onto the No. 3 spot in the Eastern Conference with five games left.

Harrison Barnes scored 30 points to lead Dallas, which has dropped eight of nine. Dirk Nowitzki scored nine points in possibly the 39-year-old's final career game in Cleveland.

The Cavs were in danger of sliding into fifth place behind Philadelphia and Indiana before waking up in the fourth quarter. They trailed 81-79 before going on an 11-0 run that was capped by a 3 from James, who spent part of Saturday night on stage with pop superstar Justin Timberlake.

With guard George Hill sidelined with a sprained ankle, Jose Calderon started at point for the Cavaliers, whose players have missed 188 games due to injury and illness this season.

Cleveland came in 21-9 in Calderon's starts, but the Cavs were sluggish for most of the night before their late burst.

TIP-INS

Mavericks: Nowitzki was questionable with an ankle issue but started his 76th game this

season, a credit to his durability and dedication. "He's another guy that's just so extremely meticulous with his approach," coach Rick Carlisle said. "He changed his diet about 12 years ago or 13 years ago and went to very specific kinds of foods. Drinking a lot of water. There's a level of consistency there that is amazing." ... Signed G Aaron Harrison for the remainder of the season. He originally signed a 10-day contract on March 22. ... G J.J. Barea (personal reasons) missed his fourth straight game.

Cavaliers: Coach Tyronn Lue attended the game but again stayed behind the scenes during his medical absence. ... F Kyle Korver remains sidelined with a sore right foot. Korver recently rejoined the team after attending his younger brother's funeral, but he's still not completely healthy and the Cavs want him to be as close to 100 percent as possible for the playoffs. ... Associate coach Larry Drew acknowledged the Cavs are "a different team" when Tristan Thompson is playing "with a pit bull mentality." Thompson, who missed several easy chances inside, appears to be as healthy as he's been all season. He missed time with a severe calf injury and sprained ankle.

DIRK & LEBRON

Nowitzki and James are ranked sixth and seventh, respectively, on the NBA's career scoring list. And while they're among the greatest players of this generation, Carlisle says they resemble players of yesteryear.

"The thing you love to see is a guy like LeBron James and a guy like Dirk that are new-age athletes from the standpoint of just an amazing level of skill, commitment, all kind of stuff, but old school in their approach and particularly old school in their appreciation for the Oscars and the Russells and the Chamberlains and the Wests and those kind of guys. That's extremely special."

Ohtani wins pitching debut, leads Angels over

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Shohei Ohtani could exhale, at last having made it through a whirlwind week and not one, but two separate debuts in the big leagues.

He got his first career hit, then three days later earned a win on the mound. Souvenir balls for each occasion.

Impressing manager Mike Scioscia with both his poise and repertoire, the two-way star from Japan won his major league pitching debut Sunday. He threw three-hit ball over six innings and led the Los Angeles Angels past the Oakland Athletics 7-4 on Sunday.

“Personally I feel like I got off to a good start and obviously the team went 3-1 on the first road trip, so I’m very happy with the results,” Ohtani said through a translator.

After being the designated hitter in the opener, he expected to be far more nervous to pitch. It didn’t show.

Reaching the upper 90s in mph with his fastball and keeping the A’s guessing with a nifty splitter, Ohtani struck out six and retired 14 of his final 15 batters.

He didn’t hit while pitching, as Albert Pujols played DH and went 0 for 5.

Ohtani (1-0) pounded his glove following a 1-2-3 shut-down fifth. He walked one, and the only damage against him came on Matt Chapman’s three-run homer in the second.

The 23-year-old righty briefly removed his cap and looked to the sky after the drive, then went back to work and blanked the A’s the rest of the way.

“After that three-run shot, Scioscia came up to me and said I’m doing fine,” Ohtani said.

Ohtani began the season-opening series by hitting a single on the first pitch he saw as a big leaguer, part of a 1-for-5 day at the plate. He capped the set by posting his first win.

Not too shabby, considering he struggled in spring training with his arm and bat. He went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA in a pair of Cactus League outings and wound up pitching against minor leaguers on back fields, and also had trouble making contact with his swing.

“He showed really good command today and was able to move the ball in and out, up and down, and we had a hard time getting consistent contact off of him,” Chapman said.

Ohtani received ample support from the Los Angeles lineup.

Mike Trout hit a tying double in the fifth and Justin Upton followed with a go-ahead sacrifice fly. The Angels added insurance in the seventh, getting Andrelton Simmons’ two-run single and an RBI single from Kole Calhoun.

Ohtani began the game with four straight outs — fanning three — before allowing consecutive singles to Matt Joyce and Stephen Piscotty that set up Chapman’s first home run of 2018.

“He used everything,” Scioscia said. “Outside of maybe one stretch of three hitters in the second inning, that’s about as well as you could pitch. ... Shohei has shown great poise in everything he’s done — the way he’s practiced, the adjustments he’s made at the plate when he’s swinging the bat. I think that’s going to be one of his strengths moving on.”

The Angels staked Ohtani to a quick 2-0 lead on back-to-back doubles by Luis Valbuena and Jefry Marte second against Daniel Gossett (0-1).

Cheers of “Ohtani!” greeted the pitcher as he prepared to throw his first pitch, a 96 mph fastball called strike to Marcus Semien. Ohtani fanned the leadoff man on four pitches and got through the first on 13 pitches, nine for strikes.

In all, Ohtani threw 92 pitches, 63 of them strikes.

Piscotty’s RBI single in

the ninth chased Blake Parker. Kenyan Middleton entered to close it out for his first save.

The Angels are off to their first 3-1 start since a 100-win season in 2008.

Gossett’s day was done after four innings and 66 pitches. He allowed four runs and walked two.

JOINING THE BABE

Ohtani became the first player since Babe Ruth for the Boston Red Sox in 1919 to start on opening day in a non-pitching role, then also start on the mound in the initial 10 games.

A ROOKIE DEBUT AND A SEASONED VETERAN

After seeing Ohtani on Sunday, the A’s on Monday will face 44-year-old Bartolo Colon starting for Texas against his old team in the 529th start of his career — and in his 21st season.

TRAINER’S ROOM

Angels: LHP Andrew Heaney, on the disabled list retroactive to last Monday with inflammation in his pitching elbow, threw 69 pitches over five times getting up and down during an intrasquad game in Arizona. General manager Billy Eppler will meet with the medical staff before determining the pitcher’s next step.

Athletics: OF Joyce was the DH for a second straight game as he nurses a sore right ankle. Manager Bob Melvin hopes it will only be a day or two before he’s back in left. ... RHP Trevor Cahill, who signed a minor league deal last month for a second stint with Oakland, is still building his workload and innings at extended spring training.

Ogunbowale encore! Final Four hero lifts Notre Dame to

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Arike Ogunbowale hit the shot of her life — again.

Ogunbowale floated in a 3-pointer from the corner with 0.1 seconds left, lifting Notre Dame to its second women's basketball title with a thrilling 61-58 comeback victory over Mississippi State in the NCAA championship game on Sunday night.

It was the second straight game that the junior guard hit a shot in the final second to carry the Irish. Her jumper with one second remaining in overtime knocked off previously unbeaten UConn in the semifinals Friday.

With this game tied, Ogunbowale took the inbound pass from Jackie Young, dribbled twice toward the corner and, closely guarded, lofted home an off-balance 3 in front of the Notre Dame bench. Close to the same spot on the court where she took down the Huskies, too.

"It just felt right," said Ogunbowale, who scored 16 of her 18 points in the second half. "I practice late-game all the time. I just ran to Jackie and said, 'Throw it to me, throw it to me.'"

Ogunbowale earned most outstanding player honors for the tournament.

All the Irish players could celebrate after pulling off the biggest comeback in title game history. They rallied from a 15-point deficit in the third quarter and were down five in the final 1:58. Marina Mabrey hit a 3-pointer from the wing and Young had a shot in the lane to tie it.

The title came 17 years to the day after Notre Dame's only other championship in 2001 on Easter.

"It's Easter Sunday, and all the Catholics were praying for us," said coach Muffet McGraw, who was wearing floral shoes in honor of the holiday.

When the final buzzer sounded, a wild celebration started with the Irish faithful who were part of the sellout crowd. McGraw's team had fallen short four times in seven years in the title game, losing in 2011, 2012, 2014 and 2015. Many of the Notre Dame alums who were on teams that had fallen just short of winning a title were there to enjoy it, including Natalie Achonwa, Natalie Novosel and Becca Bruszewski.

This version of McGraw's squad refused to lose, and the run was even more improbable because the Irish lost four players over the season to ACL

injuries.

Tied as the clock ran down, Mississippi State star Teaira McCowan missed a layup with 27.8 seconds left, and both teams turned the ball over. McCowan then fouled out of the game stopping an Irish fast break and set up the final 3 seconds.

After Ogunbowale's clutch shot, the officials huddled and put one-tenth of a second on the clock. A couple of Mississippi State players had already headed for the locker room, while Notre Dame players celebrated.

The court was cleared, and Mississippi State tossed a futile inbound pass into the lane as the buzzer sounded.

For the fourth straight NCAA game, the Irish found themselves trailing at the half. They were down 40-25 early in the third quarter before finally getting on track offensively. The Irish closed the period with a 16-1 run to tie the game at 41 heading to the final quarter.

The Irish (35-3) were buoyed by severe foul trouble by Mississippi State that saw all five of its starters with three fouls in the third quarter.

It didn't look good for the Irish in the first half. After getting out to a 12-6 lead with 3:41 left in the opening quarter, Mississippi State outscored Notre Dame 24-5 the remainder of the half. The Irish went just over 8 minutes without a point, missing seven shots and committing five turnovers during the game-changing run.

At the same time, the 6-foot-7 McCowan and Victoria Vivians were powering the Bulldogs offense. McCowan got the burst going with five straight points and Vivians capped it with the final six points to give the Bulldogs a 30-17 lead at the half.

Vivians finished with 21 points and McCowan 18 to go along with 17 rebounds to lead the Bulldogs (37-2).

The Irish had just three points in the second quarter, setting an NCAA Tournament record for the fewest points in a period. That was five less than the previous mark for futility set by Syracuse in 2016 against UConn.

It didn't matter in the end as Notre Dame found a way to rally, just as they had done all season.

"This team is relentlessly driven," said Jess Shepard, who scored 19 points to lead the Irish. "We've been down multiple times this year, but nobody stops us."

This was McGraw's 800th win at Notre Dame and the 888th of her career.

Westbrook gets triple-double, Thunder beat Pelicans 109-104

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Russell Westbrook had a triple-double to lead the Oklahoma City Thunder over the New Orleans Pelicans 109-104 on Sunday night.

Westbrook finished with 26 points, 15 rebounds and 13 assists. Paul George scored Oklahoma City's first 11 points in the second quarter and finished with 27. Carmelo Anthony added 16 and Steven Adams had 14.

The Pelicans got within 104-99 with 1:57 left, but Westbrook scored on a layup, and after a basket by Anthony Davis, George made a 3-pointer.

Davis led the Pelicans with 25 points and 11 rebounds, Ian Clark scored 16 points and E'Twaun Moore had 15.

Both teams entered the game on three-game losing streaks that had weakened their playoff positions in the Western Conference.

The Thunder were tied for fifth with Minnesota, but the Timberwolves hold the tie-breaker. New Orleans was in eighth, two games ahead of Denver and the Los Angeles Clippers for the final playoff spot.

Oklahoma City has four games left and New Orleans has five.

The Thunder led by three points at halftime and by 10 during the third quarter before Clark and Darius Miller each made a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 80-75 after three quarters.

Jerami Grant and Westbrook scored six points each as the Thunder took a 96-85 lead with 5:42 left. Grant finished with 12 points.

The first half featured hot and cold stretches for each team.

The Pelicans used a 16-0 run as the Thunder went score-

less for more than six minutes to build a 28-20 lead after one quarter.

After George got the Thunder going in the second, Westbrook scored six points down the stretch for a 53-50 halftime lead.

TIP-INS

Thunder: Oklahoma City scored 18 points on 21 New Orleans turnovers. ... The Thunder got their first victory against the Pelicans this season, who won the first two meetings and the season series. ... Anthony was called for three fouls in the first 6 1/2 minutes and went to the bench. While on the bench he was called for a technical foul. ... The Thunder were just 9 of 31 on 3-pointers after making a franchise-record 20 3-pointers in a 126-125 overtime loss to Denver on Friday.

Pelicans: Davis had scored at least 30 points in six of his last seven games against the Thunder and at least 36 in each of his last three games against them. ... He had his second straight subpar game after having just 16 points on 6-of-19 shooting in a 107-102 loss at Cleveland on Friday.

The former Sixers guard and Blazers head coach is in his third season on Billy Donovan's staff. Dorsey has 19 points as Hawks hold off Magic, 94-88

ATLANTA (AP) — Tyler Dorsey scored 19 points, including back-to-back baskets after Orlando trimmed Atlanta's lead to five points late in the game, and the Hawks beat the Magic 94-88 on Sunday in a matchup of the Eastern Conference's worst records.

Dewayne Dedmon had 17 points and 10 rebounds and rookie John Collins added another double-double for Atlanta with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

The Hawks snapped a five-game losing streak.

Orlando's Shelvin Mack hit two free throws with 2:16 remaining to cut Atlanta's lead to 89-84. Dorsey answered with a 3-pointer and added a layup

on Atlanta's next possession to stretch the lead back to double digits at 94-84.

D.J. Augustin led Orlando with 20 points, and rookie Jonathan Isaac had a career-high 15.

Orlando made only 34.4 percent of its shots from the field. Center Nikola Vucevic had 10 points on 3-for-19 shooting but led the Magic with 14 rebounds.

Positioning for the NBA draft lottery was on the line as both teams trail Phoenix in the race for the league's worst record.

With its third straight loss, Orlando (22-54) moved closer to Atlanta (22-55) at the bottom of the East.

The Hawks took a big first-half lead of 15 points and led 56-43 at halftime.

Aldridge, Gay help Spurs beat league-best Rockets 100-83

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — The Spurs took advantage of a Houston Rockets team that admitted to a lapse of focus after recently clinching the best record in the Western Conference, and pulled out a crucial win in its own playoff push.

LaMarcus Aldridge had 23 points and 14 rebounds and Rudy Gay added 21 points as San Antonio held Houston to its lowest-scoring game of the season, beating the Rockets 100-83 to snap their 11-game winning streak.

“We’ve been through some ups and downs this season, but we’re picking up at the right time,” Gay said. “There is no better time than this. This is when teams make or break themselves.”

The Spurs winners of eight of their last 10, remained fourth in the Western Conference after preventing a season sweep by the Rockets, who have the NBA’s best record with a franchise-best wins total.

There appeared to be a bit of a hangover after the Rockets clinched the West’s top seed following Golden State’s loss to Milwaukee on Thursday.

“(The Spurs) played 10 times harder than we did,” Houston coach Mike D’Antoni said. “Looked like a team trying to stay in the playoffs at a good spot and (Rockets) like a team that’s already got it sewn up and we played that way. If we play that way Tuesday we’ll get our rears busted again.”

San Antonio outscored Houston 19-8 to open the fourth quarter in taking a 94-74 lead with 5 minutes remaining. D’Antoni opted to take his starters out two minutes later, but they struggled prior to the late benching.

Houston shot 34 percent from the field and was 7 for 31 on 3-pointers.

“They do a good job of trying to run us off the line,” Rockets star James Harden said. “They played much harder than us. They’re fighting for a playoff spot as well. Credit them, they came out and played well tonight.”

Harden scored 25 points for Houston on 8-of-19 shooting. He also had eight assists, but dealt with foul trouble before exiting with five fouls. Eric Gordon added 18 points for the Rockets.

Houston was without injured Chris Paul and San Antonio was without Kawhi Leonard, who has played in only nine games this season. Gay scored six points in two minutes bridging the first and second quarters, including what became a four-point play. Gay rebounded his own missed free throw after making the first and was fouled on a layup. He made the ensuing free throw. Gay finished 9 for 13 and had three rebounds and two

steals. “He was tremendous today,” Spurs forward Kyle Anderson said. “You could see him kind of take over the game.” Gay later blocked a shot and then raced downcourt for a slam dunk that brought a thunderous response from the home crowd and led to a timeout by D’Antoni. Dejounte Murray had 13 points and six rebounds for the Spurs. Murray scored four of his first six points against Harden, driving twice past the Rockets star for a layup.

“You’ve just got to play game to game,” Aldridge said. “You can’t get too high, too low. We’ve got to take this intensity and this focus on the road and try to get two wins on the road.”

TIP-INS

Rockets: Houston’s previous low point total came in a 103-89 loss to Memphis on Oct. 28. ... Paul missed the game with a sore left leg.

D’Antoni said the star guard is “not quite there but looking very good for Tuesday” against Washington. ... P.J. Tucker remained in the game despite taking an elbow to the top of the head and later crashing to the floor after a rebound. ... Gerald Green tweaked his right ankle with about two minutes left in the first half while scrambling for a loose ball. Green shoved Danny Green to force a stoppage and exit the game, gingerly walking on his right ankle. Gerald Green played 14 minutes in the second half.

Spurs: San Antonio has at least 45 wins in 19 straight seasons, the longest streak in league history. ... Popovich said he is unsure when Leonard and “his group” will clear the forward to play as Leonard continues his rehabilitation in New York with his own team of doctors.

TIME TO STOP

Harden says the Rockets have been coasting recently despite winning their previous 11 games. And it needs to come to an end.

“It’s time to amp it back up a little bit and just get our minds and our bodies right and be ready to go,” Harden said.

FEELING LIKE HIS OLD SELF

Gay demonstrated he is returning to full health with a resounding dunk and thunderous block against the Rockets.

Gay ruptured his left Achilles tendon in January while playing with the Sacramento Kings, but has worked himself back to health while coming off the bench for San Antonio.

“I guess they’re back,” Gay said of his hops. “I think I told someone that last game, I’m really starting to feel like myself.”

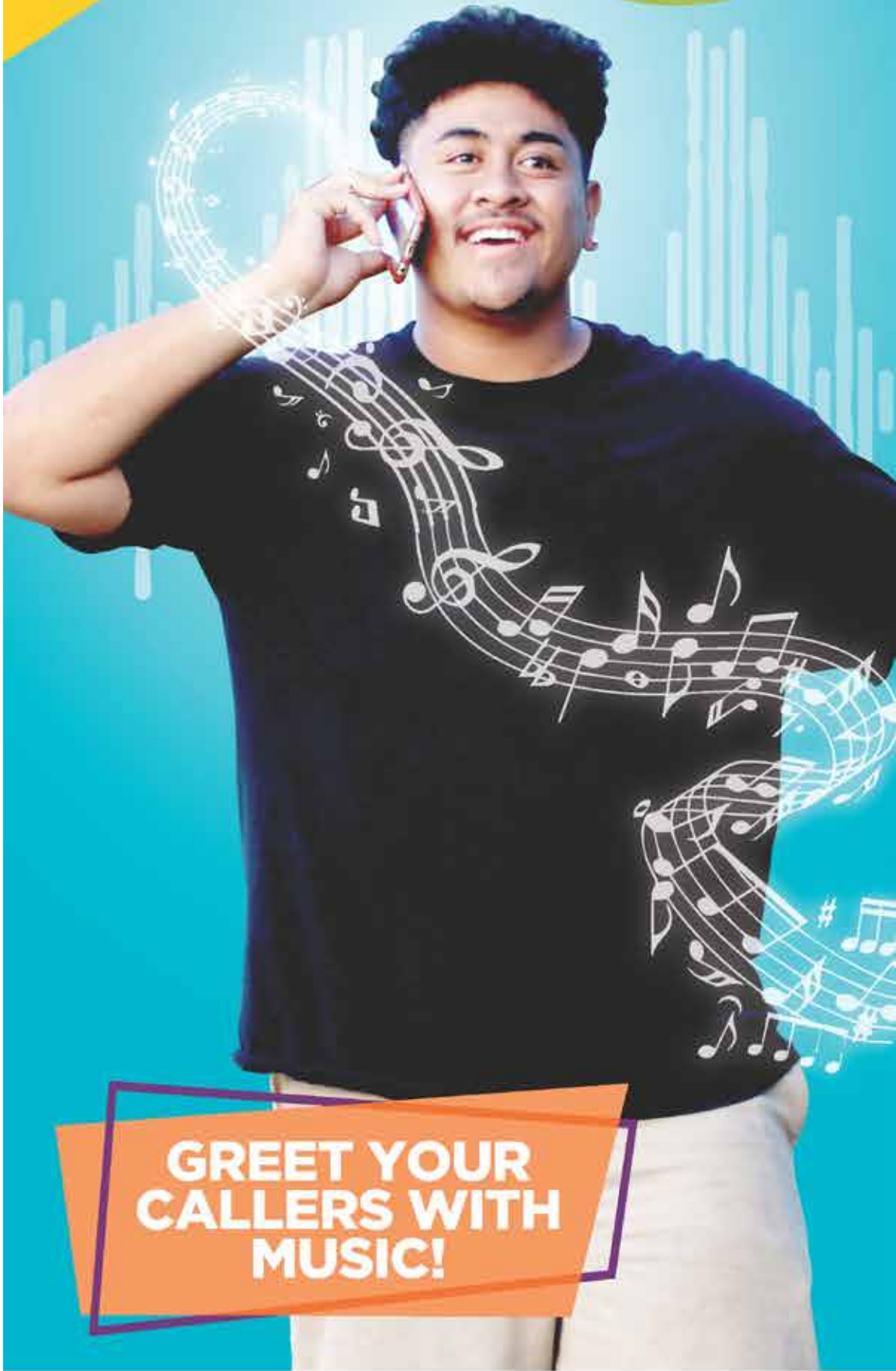

Markkanen, hot-shooting Bulls top playoff-bound Wizards

CHICAGO (AP) — After coach Fred Hoiberg went home sick, rookie Lauri Markkanen and the Chicago Bulls came out shooting feverishly.

Markkanen scored 23 points and connected on 5 of 8 3-pointers to lead Chicago to a 113-94 win over the Washington Wizards on Sunday.

Bobby Portis had 18 points and hit 4 of 5 from long range, and Sean Kilpatrick added 14 points. The Bulls shot 52.4 percent overall from the floor and were 18-for-34 on 3s — matching their season high — as Hoiberg missed the game with an upper-respiratory infection.

Hoiberg left United Center before tipoff, leaving associate head coach Jim Boylen to direct Chicago to its second straight win following a seven-game skid. “I thought we were focused from the start,” Boylen said. “We talked about a first-quarter edge. I thought we had it.”

The Bulls sizzled early against the playoff-bound Wizards, who rested five-time All-Star John Wall.

Chicago shot 60.9 percent in the quarter and connected on 8 of 11 3-point attempts, with Markkanen and Portis each sinking three from long range.

Markkanen nailed his first 3 just over three minutes in to set an early rhythm. “Of course it helps when you make the first one, but I always think it’s going in,” said the 20-year-old Finn. “Just trying to take my normal shots and today they were falling a little bit better.”

“We ran a couple of things for him early just to get him to his spots where he can score and make plays,” Boylen added.

The Bulls kept connecting. Chicago upped its field-goal percentage to 64.3 and went 11-for-17 on 3s in the first half. Markkanen led with 15 points and four 3-pointers at the break and Chicago ahead 68-59.

Otto Porter Jr. led the Wizards with 17 points. Bradley Beal scored 15 points and reserve Mike Scott added 14.

Wall remained on the bench against Chicago after playing 33 minutes in his first game in over two months on Saturday. The slick point guard had 15 points and 14 assists in the Wizards’ playoff-clinching 107-93 win over Charlotte. Before Saturday, Wall had last played on Jan. 25, six days before he underwent left knee surgery. The Wizards went 15-12 during that absence and they were flat on Sunday without their high-tempo star whom coach Scott Brooks called his team’s “Ferrari.”

“We made the playoffs, but are we just excited about making the playoffs?” Brooks said. “That’s the question we have to ask.

“We weren’t ready mentally. When you’re not ready mentally you’re not going to have a chance to win and that was the game tonight. They were just running their offense and we were chasing them around with no purpose.” The Bulls opened a 15-point lead late in the first quarter before Washington finished the frame with a 6-0 run to cut it to 36-27. Getting a lift from Scott and others off their bench, the Wizards trimmed the Bulls’ lead to four points three times in the second quarter.

The Bulls maintained their hot shooting pace throughout first half before cooling down in the second. “They came out and just shot 3s,” Beal said. “That’s pretty much all they did. For the most part, we couldn’t guard the 3-point line.”

Chicago then effectively managed its lead — and used all but one bench player — before pulling away late.

NOT THE FIRST TIME

Boylen stepped in as a head coach once before, taking over for Gregg Popovich with San Antonio on Jan. 17, 2014, after Popovich was ejected in a loss to Portland.

“That’s different than Fred calling me at 9 (a.m.), saying, ‘I think I’m struggling. You’ve got to be ready,’” Boylen said.

Boylen admitted he had fun coaching, but added, “I feel bad for Fred. I’ve never seen him this sick before.”

Wizards: Brooks said Wall “felt pretty good” on Sunday, but plans for how to use the star in Washington’s final five regular-season games haven’t been finalized. Washington plays two back-to-back sets down the stretch. ... F Markieff Morris started on Sunday after leaving Saturday’s game with flu-like symptoms after nine minutes.

Data breach hits Saks Fifth Avenue, Lord & Taylor stores

A data breach at department store chains Saks Fifth Avenue, Saks Off Fifth and Lord & Taylor has compromised the personal information of customers who shopped at the stores.

The chains’ parent company, Canada-based Hudson’s Bay Co., announced the breach of its store payment systems on Sunday. The company said it was investigating and taking steps to contain the attack.

The disclosure came after New York-based security firm Gemini Advisory LLC revealed on Sunday that a hacking group known as JokerStash or Fin7 began boasting on dark websites last week that it was putting up for sale up to 5 million stolen credit and debit cards.

The hackers named their stash BIGBADABOOM-2. While the extent of its holdings remains unclear, about 125,000 records were immediately released for sale.

The security firm confirmed with several banks that many of the compromised records came from Saks and Lord & Taylor customers. Hudson’s Bay said in a statement that it “deeply regrets any inconvenience or concern this may cause,” but it hasn’t said how many Saks or Lord & Taylor stores or customers were affected. The company said there’s no indication that the breach affected its online shopping websites or other brands, including the Home Outfitters chain or Hudson’s Bay stores in Canada. The company said customers won’t be liable for fraudulent charges.

Warriors' McCaw released from hospital after scary fall

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Golden State Warriors guard Patrick McCaw has been released from a hospital following a terrifying fall to the floor during Saturday's game at Sacramento.

The team also said Sunday that preliminary tests showed McCaw has no structural damage or problems with his nervous system after the freak injury.

Golden State announced that X-rays, a CT scan and an MRI "were all clear." McCaw was able to leave UC Davis Medical Center. He is scheduled to be re-examined by a specialist on Thursday and his injury — aside from anything related to the impact of the fall — will be listed as a bruised lumbar spine.

"Just a huge relief," Warriors coach Steve Kerr said. "Last night was really terrifying. All the news has been good. He's up walking. That's the only thing that matters, that Patrick's OK."

"Scariest thing I've ever experienced on a basketball floor for sure. Not even close."

McCaw was taken away on a stretcher after a thud to the court following a foul by Sacramento's Vince Carter in the Warriors' 112-96 win.

The second-year pro, who appeared to be trying to dunk, did a scissor kick in the air over Carter's shoulder before landing hard on his back. He lay in agony for about 10 minutes as the crowd quieted. Carter, who was given a flagrant-one foul, knelt nearby as medical personnel from both teams along with Kerr rushed onto the court.

Players for both teams eventually came to the floor and huddled in prayer as McCaw was placed on a stretcher and wheeled away with his neck stabilized.

The Warriors were later informed that McCaw had feeling in his legs. Still, Kerr was shaken when he and some of his assistant coaches visited McCaw in the hospital late Saturday night. A handful of Golden State's players were also there.

"We were very encouraged but when we got there he was not doing great," Kerr said. "He was immobilized, had some painkillers. It really wasn't until this morning that I felt good about the news. Everything seems to be progressing now. His parents are up there (and) his girlfriend, so he's in good hands."

The Warriors have been playing with a banged-up roster most of the season. All-Star point guard Stephen Curry could miss the first round of the playoffs with a left knee injury, while Klay Thompson returned Saturday after sitting out eight games with a fractured left thumb. Kevin Durant has been nursing a rib injury.

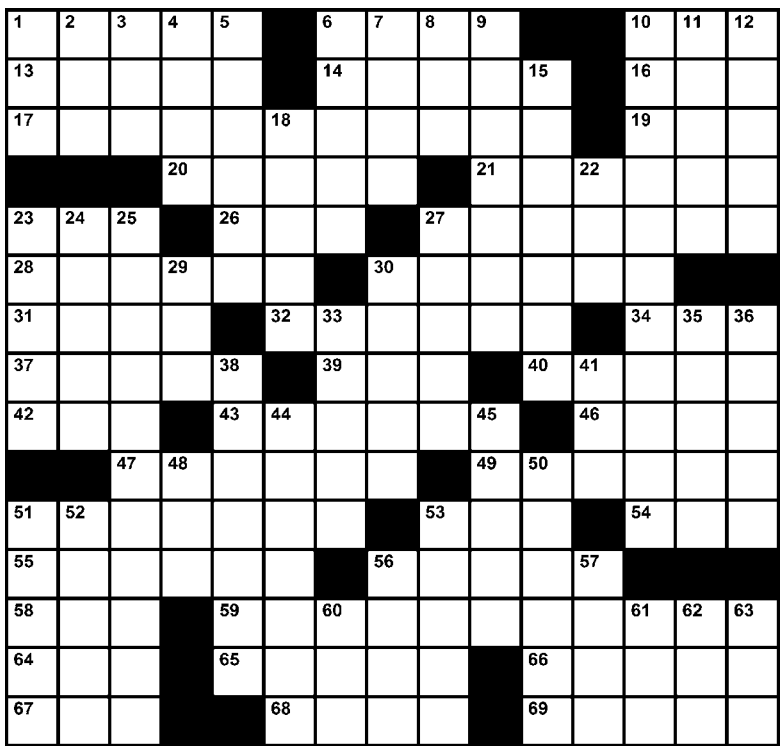

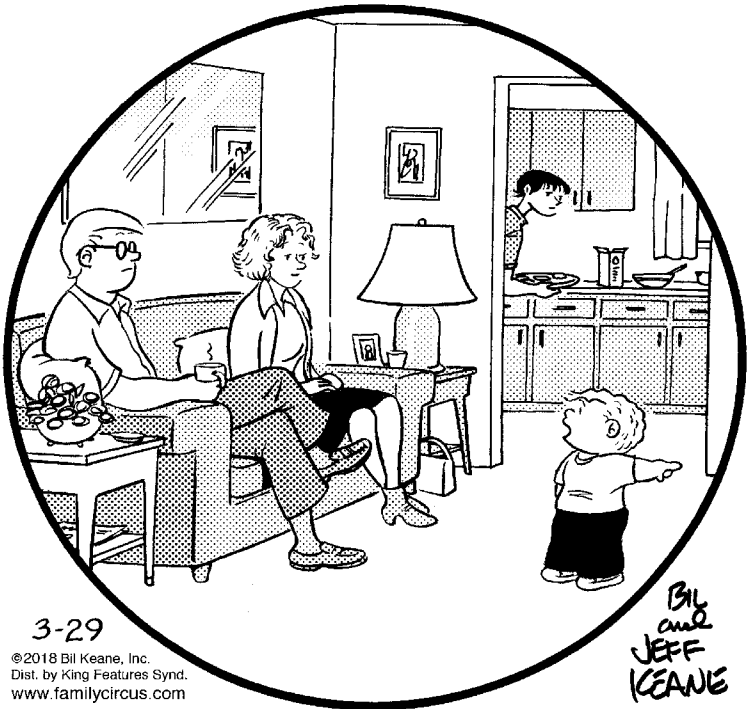



PROCLAMATION

A Proclamation Declaring April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month

WHEREAS, the American Samoa Alliance against Domestic & Sexual Violence, also known as “The Alliance”, calls attention to April 2018 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM). Crimes of sexual violence in American Samoa are witnessed in our homes, villages, churches, and heavily reported in the media; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of SAAM is to raise public awareness about sexual violence and educate communities on how to prevent it; and

WHEREAS, rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment endangers our community. A study done at the American Samoa Community College in 2016 revealed that 25% of students had experienced sexual assault of some form, either rape, attempted rape, molestation or incest, and 46% percent of those stated they kept it to themselves; and

WHEREAS, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority as one in six boys and one in four girls will experience sexual assault before the age of 18; and

WHEREAS, the theme of this year’s Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign is “Embrace Your Voice”. The Alliance will host activities and a vigil for the community on how to use their words to stop violence before it happens by promoting safety, respect, and equality; and

WHEREAS, we recognize our words are important, and whether you speak out against victim blaming, or helping someone better understand these issues, your voice is powerful and necessary in this conversation; and

WHEREAS, we ask each individual to embrace your voice and show your support for survivors in our community. Stand up to victim blaming, shut down rape jokes, correct harmful misconceptions, promote everyday consent, and practice healthy communication with kids.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Lolo Matalasi Moliga, Governor of American Samoa, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2018 as “Sexual Assault Awareness Month”, and join the American Samoa Alliance against Domestic & Sexual Violence organization and our community in taking action to prevent sexual violence. April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month and each day of the year is an opportunity to create change for the future.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my signature on this 26th day of March 2018, in the year of the Lord, two thousand and eighteen.
