Solomon Islands 18, American Samoa 0, OFC Youth Futsal

The Solomon Islands are the best in Futsal (indoor soccer) in Oceania, and they showed it with an 18-0 beating of American Samoa in their first game of the OFC Youth Futsal Tournament at Bruce Pulman Arena in Auckland, NZ.

They were superior in all aspects of the game – technical ability, fitness, shooting, passing and receiving. They ran around and by the territory’s teams with ease, finishing the second half with 11 goals, after scoring seven in the first.

“I give our boys a lot of credit for playing their hearts out against a team that was better than us,” said the team’s

coach, Tunoa Lui. “We had our chances to score as well, it was just poor execution and bad luck that we walked out of that game scoreless.”

American Samoa played well during some stretches of the game, keeping Solomon Islands at bay, but in the end they just could not hold back the juggernaut that was the Solomon Islands.

“We are going to regroup and get ready for the second day of the tournament because it will be against New Zealand and New Caledonia,” Lui explained.

There were many positives the coaches were able to take

**Titans QB
Marcus Mariota's status
still unclear
vs. Miami**

VNASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Tennessee Titans coach Mike Mularkey says quarterback Marcus Mariota's status is still unclear for their upcoming matchup with the Miami Dolphins. The Titans coach remains hopeful that Mariota will play despite a strained hamstring.

Mariota, who was hurt in last week's loss to Houston, was limited in practice, stretching and throwing passes during the open portion of the workouts on Wednesday. The quarterback did not speak with the media after practice. "We didn't ask him to do very much, we were smart with him," Mularkey said. "We did what we thought he could do, and that wasn't very much, but enough. We're going to be smart with him; positive for what he had to do."

Mularkey says he would be comfortable playing the quarterback Sunday even without a full practice.

The Titans (2-2) signed Brandon Weeden to a one-year deal Tuesday as a third quarterback as insurance if Mariota isn't able to play Sunday. Mularkey says Weeden's familiarity with the Titans' offense from his stints with Dallas and Houston was the deciding factor. Weeden also knows Titans backup quarterback Matt Cassel from Dallas.

"As quickly as we could get somebody up to speed in a short amount of time, he had the advantage over everybody," Mularkey said.

Cowboys’ defensive shuffle likely to continue vs Packers

FRISCO, Texas (AP) — Dallas linebacker Anthony Hitchens practiced fully for the first time this season coming off a knee injury on the same day Charles Tapper broke a foot, likely the start of a lengthy absence for the defensive end.

Pass rusher David Irving is ready after serving a four-game suspension, two weeks removed from fellow defensive lineman Damontre Moore rejoining the team following a two-game ban.

Injuries and suspensions have meant little continuity for a unit that has been up and down through four games, and now looking at a few more changes going into a visit from Green Bay and Aaron Rodgers.

“That’s always something that’s important, for guys to have the opportunity to get to play with each other and know each other that much better on the field,” linebacker Justin Durant said. “I’m not going to use that as an excuse. You’ve got to know what you’re supposed to do and make the calls and play with whoever we have.” All-Pro linebacker Sean Lee missed the 35-30 loss to the Los Angeles Rams with a hamstring injury, and the Cowboys (2-2) are optimistic he can play Sunday against the Packers (3-1) even though he missed practice Wednesday.

If Lee returns, he’ll be the second veteran to miss one game with an injury. Cornerback Orlando Scandrick broke a hand in the opener and was sidelined for a blowout loss in Denver. The defense had another slow start the next week in Arizona, then was strong in the second half of a 28-17 win. The opposite was in play against the Rams — good first half, bad second half, as in five straight

scoring possessions for LA.

Hitchens had to watch the first four games after breaking a bone in his right knee in a pre-season game. The fourth-year middle linebacker returned to practice last week. “Every game there’s one or two plays where a couple of guys are messing up,” Hitchens said. “We’ve shown different spurts of playing first quarter, third quarter. But we’ve got to play a full four quarters if we want to win in this league.”

If Hitchens returns, Jaylon Smith probably won’t play every defensive snap, which he did for the first time in his career against the Rams. Smith is in his second season but missed his rookie year recovering a knee injury sustained in his final game at Notre Dame.

Through four games, Smith has been one of five first- or second-year players to see significant roles at some point. That includes rookie cornerbacks Chidobe Awuzie and Jourdan Lewis. Both were plagued by hamstring issues in training camp, with Lewis missing the opener and Awuzie the past two games after aggravating his injury. “Looking at the age, it’s going to be some ups and downs,” Durant said. “It’s probably the youngest defense I’ve seen in a long time, a bunch of young guys with major roles. But they’re playing well. They’re getting better.”

Safeties Byron Jones and Jeff Heath are among the most experienced players in the Dallas secondary, along with Scandrick. But both are first-time starters, and Heath missed a tackle on running back Todd Gurley’s 53-yard touchdown catch that put the Rams ahead for good after trailing by 11 in the first half.

Judge-ment day: Indians set to meet slugger, Yankees in ALDS

CLEVELAND (AP) — They ran away with their division again, and streaked to history, 102 wins and home-field advantage throughout the AL playoffs. The Cleveland Indians have had a special season.

A new one, the only one, is about to begin.

Heartbroken after coming up a little short last year against the Chicago Cubs, Cleveland figured to make it to October for another swing at ending a World Series drought stretching back to 1948.

The Indians are back, but there's now a 6-foot-7, 280-pound baseball-bashing behemoth standing in their way.

Behold Aaron Judge.

On the same field where their magical 2016 postseason ended on Nov. 2 in a light rain and extra innings, the Indians will open the division series on Thursday night against Judge and the New York Yankees, who rallied to beat the Minnesota Twins in the wild-card game. Unaffected by a larger stage, Judge hit a two-run homer in his playoff debut as the Yankees overcame a 3-0 deficit in the first inning and won their first postseason game in five years to earn a best-of-five matchup against the defending AL champions — and the team favored to win it all.

"We're not done yet," Judge said after the 8-4 win at Yankee Stadium. "We've just got to keep it rolling in Cleveland."

And while fans across the country are excited about watching the colossal Judge, who blasted 52 homers as a rookie and seems to hit the ball hard every time he's up, face Indians ace Corey Kluber and baseball's deepest pitching staff, Cleveland manager Terry Francona isn't as thrilled.

"He's good for Major League Baseball," Francona said of Judge. "He's bad for the teams you're playing against. He's really good. From all accounts, he's a really special young man. I didn't get a chance to meet him at the All-Star Game because I wasn't there, but everybody came back raving about him as a person."

"I know, if you throw in the wrong place, he's going to hit it a long way."

Francona, normally a by-the-book manager, is taking a gamble in the opener and starting Trevor Bauer, a 17-game winner during the regular season, in Game 1 instead

of Kluber, who will start Game 2. Francona reasoned that in doing so he will have Kluber on regular rest again for Game 5 — if the series goes that far and if Mother Nature doesn't bring rain.

It makes sense. Then again, it seems risky.

The Yankees will counter with Sonny Gray, who was acquired at the trading deadline to help get New York into October. He went 1-2 with a 4.86 ERA in three starts against Cleveland.

Bauer is well aware of the damage Judge can do, but he's just as focused on rest of New York's lineup.

"You've got some youth in there with big power," he said. "You've got some veteran guys in there too that balance everything out. They can do a lot of different things offensively, and they're very well balanced."

So are the Indians, who don't have a hole in their lineup and finished strong, stringing together 22 straight wins from Aug. 24 to Sept. 14 and winning 33 of their last 37.

Cleveland also went 5-2 against New York.

None of that means anything now.

"Everybody's even," Francona said. "What's going to matter is who plays the best. It doesn't matter who thinks somebody should win unless it's the umpires. It's going to be who plays the best."

Here are some other things to keep an eye on as the Indians and Yankees meet in the postseason for the fourth time:

PEN PALS: Cleveland and New York boast two of baseball's best bullpens, stacked with hard-throwers, specialists and elite closers.

Yankees manager Joe Girardi showcased his stellar relief corps Monday night after starter Luis Severino was chased in the first. Chad Green, David Robertson, Tommy Kahnle and Aroldis Chapman combined for 8 2/3 innings of one-run relief, striking out 13.

The Indians have plenty of arms, too, including Andrew Miller, virtually unhittable last October.

"These are two teams that can shorten the game real quick with the bullpens that we have," Indians center fielder Jason Kipnis said. "It's not just versus the Yankees, it's in any game that we'd like to score early and often and keep pressing."
