Warriors ready for third straight NBA Finals appearance

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Kevin Durant does not need to be told that Golden State should have a muted celebration after winning the Western Conference Finals.

Durant is fully aware a tough challenge waits for them. It's why Durant signed with the Warriors and why Stephen Curry, Klay Thompson and Draymond Green embraced him at the expense of their own stats.

"We have a bigger goal in mind," Durant said.

Golden State has a chance to earn their second championship in three years after sweeping the San Antonio Spurs with a 129-115 victory Monday night.

The Warriors became the first team in league history to open the playoffs 12-0, which provides them with a week of rest prior to their third straight finals appearance.

Golden State will host Game 1 of the NBA Finals on June 1 against either Cleveland or Boston. The Cavaliers hold a 2-1 lead in the Eastern Conference Finals, but Curry alluded the Warriors are expecting a rematch with LeBron James and company.

"We all know, obviously, who we're going to play," Curry said. "We'll be watching the Eastern Conference Finals to see how that unfolds. But it will be easy to start this new chapter and really just lock in on what's

in front of us."

Facing Cleveland will resurrect chatter of Golden State's collapse in last season's finals, which saw the Cavaliers rally from a 3-1 deficit to win the franchise's first championship.

"This year is a totally different year, different group, dif-

ferent journey," Curry said.

The biggest difference is the addition of Durant, who left Oklahoma City in the offseason to sign with Golden State.

His presence has given the Warriors a deep and talented roster headlined by four All-Stars in Durant, Curry,

Klay Thompson and Draymond Green. But Spurs coach Gregg Popovich said to credit talent as the sole reason behind Golden State's current run is disrespectful.

"They're really talented, but that's not everything that describes them," Popovich said.

"This is maybe the best defensive team in the league on top of everything. So, they don't just play with talent. They execute at the defensive end of the floor. On offense, no team is more unselfish finding the open man and that sort of thing."

Scathing report on Rio Olympics: venues 'White Elephants'

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) — A federal prosecutor looking into last year's Rio de Janeiro Olympics says that many of the venues "are white elephants" that were built with "no planning."

The scathing report offered Monday at a public hearing confirms what The Associated Press reported several months after the games ended. Many of the venues are empty, boarded up, and have no tenants or income with the maintenance costs dumped on the federal government.

"There was no planning," federal prosecutor Leandro Mitidieri told the public hearing on the Olympics. "There was no planning when they put out the bid to host the Games. No planning."

"They are white elephants today," Mitidieri added. "What we are trying to look at here is to how to turn this into something usable."

Rio de Janeiro spend about \$12 billion to organize the games, which were plagued by cost-cutting, poor attendance, and reports of bribes and corruption linked to the building of some Olympic-related facilities.

The Olympic Park in suburban Barra da Tijuca, which was the largest cluster of venues, is an expanse of empty arenas with clutter still remaining from the games. The second largest cluster, in the northern area of Deodoro, is closed despite plans to open it as a public park with swimming facilities for the mostly poor who live in the area.

Patricia Amorim, the under-secretary for sports in the city of Rio, said highly publicized plans were on hold to dismantle

one arena and turn the remains into four schools. The arena was the venue for handball.

"It will be dismantled," she said. "We are just waiting to know whether we will actually have resources to build these schools on other sites, or whether we will dismantle it and wait for the resources to come. Our schools need to be reformed and that's our priority, not new schools."

Nine months after the Rio Olympics ended, the local organizing committee still owes creditors about \$30 million, and 137 medals awarded during the games are rusting and need to be repaired.

Former Rio de Janeiro Mayor Eduardo Paes, the moving force with the International Olympic Committee behind organizing last year's Olympics, is being investigated for allegedly accepting at least 15 million reals (\$5 million) in payments to facilitate construction projects tied to the games.

He denies any wrongdoing. Organizing committee spokesman Mario Andrada said more than 100 medals awarded at the Olympics showed signs of rusting. He said many were bronze medals, and said many of the tarnished medals had been awarded to Americans.

"Most of the problems were due to handling, poor handling," Andrada said. "Either they fell on the floor or they were touching each other so, it was a problem of handling. Whatever was the problem with the poor handling, it took the gloss off the medal and then you see rusting."

He said the medals would be repaired at Brazil's mint, called the Casa da Moeda.

Kvitova to decide this week on French Open comeback

PRAGUE (AP) — Two-time Wimbledon champion Petra Kvitova will decide this week whether she will make her comeback at the French Open. She hasn't played since December, when she was attacked by a knife-wielding intruder.

Kvitova previously said she would sign up for the Grand Slam in Paris, which begins on Sunday, in hope of competing. But she wasn't sure whether she would be ready.

Her spokesman Karel Tejkal said on Tuesday she will make a last-minute decision.

Kvitova has missed the season so far while recovering from surgery on her left, racket-holding hand in December. She was injured during an attack at her home in the Czech city of Prostějov.

Tejkal also said Kvitova's long-term goal remains to "to be able to play in form at Wimbledon." That starts on July 3.

Kvitova was the Wimbledon champion in 2011 and 2014. She climbed as high as No. 2 in the WTA rankings.

Kvitova announced in early May she was back at practice in Monaco.

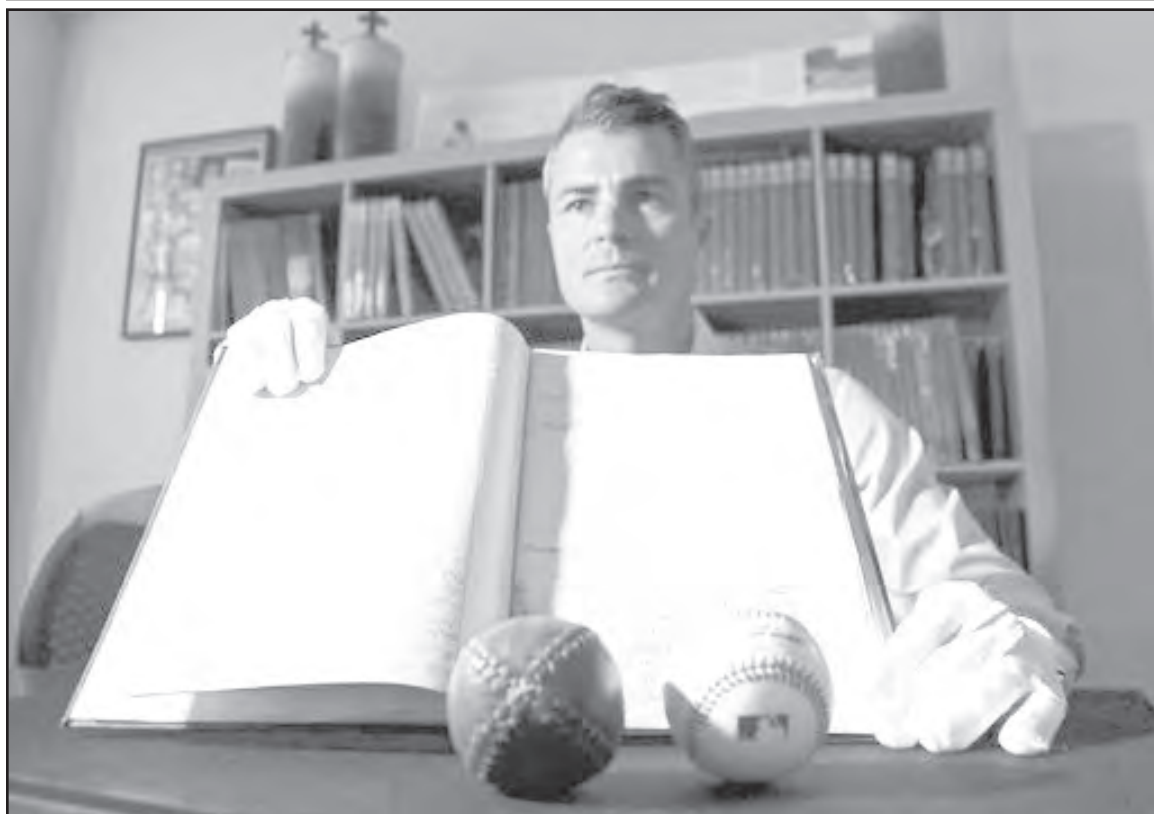

Big league baseball's founding documents to be auctioned

LOS ANGELES (AP) — In 1876, a group of owners and team officials gathered at a New York hotel to draft and sign the constitution that created baseball's National League and would ultimately have ramifications far beyond the diamond.

The principles the document laid out, largely the work of Chicago White Stockings owner William Hulbert, would provide the basic model for every major team sports league in the world that followed. The constitution is getting a public airing for the first time in more than a century when it's put up for sale by SCP Auctions of Laguna Niguel, California, starting Wednesday.

It offers a glimpse into a time when nearly half the teams in the league had "stockings" in their names, 50 cents for a ticket was considered a steep price, and getting paid to play sports was deemed dirty.

"The idea that grown men would pick up a bat and ball and put on costumes was suspicious," said John Thorn, the official historian of Major League Baseball. Not to mention the "residue and foul odor of drunkenness" thought to permeate the game.

Many fans were convinced the outcome of games was determined in advance. Occasionally they were correct, Thorn said.

The NL's immediate predecessor was the National Association of Professional Baseball Players, known casually as the National Association or NA. It was plagued with problems in its short life including weak central organization, teams constantly folding, and East Coast teams refusing to travel west.

Players just split up the gate

receipts as though they were a small-time rock band playing a nightclub. One team, the Boston Red Stockings, was utterly dominant. (The Red Stockings are not, as one might suspect, the modern Boston Red Sox, but the modern Atlanta Braves. Similarly, Hulbert's White Stockings are not the modern Chicago White Sox, but became the Chicago Cubs.)

The league's demise after the 1875 season gave Hulbert, a man of the West who did not like the dominance of East Coast teams, an opening to found something new and lasting.

On Feb. 2, 1876, in a meeting at the Grand Central Hotel in New York that included other early baseball luminaries like Harry Wright and Al Spalding, the new constitution of the National League of Professional Base Ball Clubs was drafted and signed. It listed on its opening page its central principles, including:

— "To encourage, foster and elevate the game of base ball."

— "To enact and enforce proper rules for the exhibition and conduct of the game."

— "To make base ball playing respectable and honorable."

But it did something far more revolutionary in sports. It created a strict division between capital and labor. Owners and their officers ran the business end, and paid wages to the players.

"Hulbert was a genius in the model he created with the National League," Thorn said. "It is this model that gave birth to every professional sports league that followed, from football to basketball to European football.

Professional sports teams owe everything to Hulbert."

The new league had eight teams: Chicago, Boston, Philadelphia, the Cincinnati Reds, the Hartford Dark Blues, the New York Mutuals, and the St. Louis Brown Stockings.

The documents themselves have been held privately for decades by the family of an old National League executive that is now putting them up for sale. The auction house is not making their names public.

"Everything is in great condition. It's been preserved in a bound volume since 1925," said Dan Imler, vice president of SCP auctions.

Last year, SCP auctions sold a similar document, 1857's "Laws of Base Ball," which laid out the rules of the modern game.

That went for \$3.26 million. This prize could easily surpass it. Imler said he expects both institutions and individuals will be among the bidders.

While its 74 pages have the ink-and-parchment dignity of old government documents, there are also cross-outs and other signs of mistakes, changes and corrections.

"It's highly dramatic because it's the first draft of history," said Thorn, who has studied the documents but is not involved in the auction. "This is sloppy. This is messy. This is what historians love."

The new constitution was no magic bullet. At first things were the same as ever. Toward the end of the inaugural season, Philadelphia and New York both refused to make scheduled western road trips.

The Warriors have shown their strength by blasting through the playoffs in the normally rugged West.

Golden State is shooting 50 percent from the field while averaging 118.3 points in 12 playoff games. As good as the offense has been, it's been the Warriors' defense that has been key to their playoff dominance. Golden State held San Antonio, Utah and Portland to 102 points and averaged 9.2 steals per game.

"I think our defensive intensity has been amazing," Green said. "Overall, I think we've done a great job locking in on the defensive side, scrambling around, trying to take away team's No. 1 option. That doesn't necessarily mean the player, just trying to make them go to a second or third option in the set and also trying to cover that. I think we've been doing a great job of that."

The addition of David West and Matt Barnes has given the Warriors two more defensive-minded players off the bench to go along with Andre Iguodala and JaVale McGee.

Still, Golden State coach

Mike Brown knows better execution is critical in the finals.

"We feel like we can play better," said Brown, who is filling in on the sideline for an injured Steve Kerr. "To get to our ultimate goal of winning the whole thing, we've got to be better on both ends of the floor."

As a 23-year-old playing with the Thunder, Durant learned a heightened effort is needed in the Finals. Oklahoma City celebrated advancing to the 2012 Finals only to be steamrolled by Miami in five games.

Experience has taught Durant that winning the West is no reason to relax or celebrate.

"Yea, it's a little different, definitely. I can't lie," Durant said. "I went when I was 23-years-old, and it felt like the Western Conference Finals was almost like the championship. Just getting to that point, you know how hard it is and how much work you put in to start the season. So, it's a little different now, obviously."

"I feel like we could definitely be better."

out. It was a risky move, but one that would help ensure the league's survival.

"He stuck to his guns," Thorn said. "He was not going to permit the clubs to flout the rules." By the 1880s, the National League started to see real success. The upstart American Association would provide competition that ended up helping the NL; the older league dropped its prices from 50 cents to 25 to match the new league, and crowds started coming in droves. The American League would arrive as a major league in 1901, the first World Series

would be played in 1903, and 114 years of Major League Baseball would follow. Hulbert's White Stockings would become one of the great teams of the late 19th century and, as the Cubs, one of the most popular sports franchises in history.

But he died in 1882 at age 50, just six years after the day he changed everything.

"He did not live to see the great success he had made," Thorn said, "that he had created a structure and a model and an absolute dedication to following the rules that would make his league last."

Greinke whiffs 12 in 8 2/3, Diamondbacks beat White Sox 5-1

PHOENIX (AP) — Zack Greinke was dominant again, looking a lot like the pitcher who went 19-3 with a 1.66 ERA two years ago.

His reaction: "It's nice."

Greinke struck out a season-high 12 and came within one out of a complete game as the Arizona Diamondbacks beat the Chicago White Sox 5-1 on Monday night.

The ace right-hander gave up four hits and improved to 5-0 in his last six starts.

"It was another Zack moment for us," manager Torey Lovullo said.

The crowd booed loudly when Lovullo walked to the mound to pull Greinke (6-2) after Jose Abreu's two-out double in the ninth.

Lovullo understood.

"Sometimes you've got to sit in the seat and not make popular decisions," he said, "but I made a deal with Zack."

Basically, it was three up and three down or he was not finishing the game.

Greinke wasn't surprised to see Lovullo come to the mound.

"Torey told me I had to get everyone out and I didn't," he said.

Greinke threw 104 pitches and everything was working for him. He was asked to compare the way he's pitching now to that masterful 2015 season with the Los Angeles Dodgers that helped earn him a \$206.5 million, six-year contract in Arizona.

The three-time All-Star and 2009 AL Cy Young Award winner went 13-7 with a 4.37 ERA in his abbreviated first season with the Diamondbacks.

"Right now I'm making really good pitches," Greinke said. "The pitches aren't quite as sharp maybe as that year, but the location's been just as good, maybe better."

Daniel Descalso hit a three-run homer with two outs in the fourth inning to break a scoreless tie.

Greinke's final strikeout — of Yolmer Sanchez — was with a 65 mph curveball; the scoreboard called it an eephus pitch.

"We hadn't seen that all day," Chicago manager Rick Renteria said.

Greinke said he tried to throw the same pitch earlier but it was a little too hard and it wound up being hit for a home run by Leury Garcia.

Paul Goldschmidt added a solo shot for the Diamondbacks during their sixth victory in seven

games.

After totaling 24 runs in their last two games at Seattle over the weekend, the White Sox managed only Garcia's solo homer against Greinke, who walked one in his third double-digit strikeout game this season.

Miguel Gonzalez (3-5) went five-plus innings, permitting five runs — four earned — and seven hits.

"Those two pitches — a curveball, a three-run homer, and a fastball in (for Goldschmidt's homer)," Gonzalez said. "Those two pitches, if I take them back you never know. It is a different ballgame."

Jake Lamb, just selected NL player of the week, tripled to right-center and scored for Arizona.

Leading off the sixth, Goldschmidt jumped on Gonzalez's fastball and lined it into the left-field seats.

Lamb followed with a triple and Arizona went on to load the bases.

Rey Fuentes grounded sharply to shortstop Tim Anderson, who tried to force the runner at home. White Sox catcher Omar Narvaez couldn't quite come up with Anderson's low throw, the ball dropping out of his mitt. Anderson was charged with an error, and it was 5-1.

TRAINER'S ROOM

White Sox: Three pitchers on the DL threw in a simulated game at Chase Field. Carlos Rodon (bursitis in left shoulder) pitched six innings. Nate Jones (right elbow neuritis) and Jake Petricka (strained right lat) each worked an inning. ... Yoan Moncada, rated the game's top prospect by Baseball America, remains on the seven-day DL at Triple-A with a sore left thumb.

Diamondbacks: CF A.J. Pollock (right groin strain) did some light running and throwing. Lovullo said the next step for Pollock is batting practice. He is eligible to come off the disabled list Friday, but Lovullo said he's uncertain Pollock will be ready by then.

SPOT START

Lovullo said right-hander Randall Delgado will come out of the bullpen to make a spot start in the series finale Wednesday. He takes the rotation slot normally occupied by Taijuan Walker, placed on the 10-day disabled list Sunday with a blister on his right index finger. Delgado last started a game in 2015. He is 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA in 15 appearances this season.

Like father like son: Kluivert hopes for European final goal

AMSTERDAM (AP) — It was a late winner from an 18-year-old Patrick Kluivert that gave Ajax a 1-0 win over AC Milan in the 1995 Champions League final.

Justin Kluivert, who just turned 18, might have a chance to follow in dad's footsteps on Wednesday when Ajax faces Manchester United in the Europa League final.

But although they are both forwards, these Kluiverts are not identical.

"My father was a bit taller, and he was a central attacker. And I am more on the side," said the diminutive winger, who is never afraid to take on a defender and can deliver accurate crosses for teenage teammate Kasper Dolberg in the center of Ajax's three-man front line.

Like his father in Vienna the last time Ajax won a European title, Justin is likely to be a substitute, with Bertrand Traore and Amin Younes favored to start on the flanks.

If he needs inspiration for how to turn a match, Kluivert only needs to look on YouTube.

"Of course, you see lots of videos of him ... and the goal," Kluivert said of his dad's decider, a toe-poke finish with his left foot that forced

the ball under goalkeeper Sebastiano Rossi just before veteran defender Franco Baresi could make a tackle. "One touch with the foot. It is nice to see."

Like his father before him, Justin Kluivert has risen through the ranks of the Ajax academy, breaking into the first team in the second half of the season after starting in the under-19 team.

After his goal in the Champions League final, Patrick Kluivert went on to play for teams including AC Milan and Barcelona. He also scored 40 goals in 79 appearances for the Dutch national team.

Justin is regularly in touch with his father, a technical director at Paris Saint-Germain this season, for advice and tips.

"We talk a lot and I learn from him," Kluivert said.

With just a handful of starts for Ajax, Kluivert can only dream of a future career to emulate his father. For now, his focus is purely on Stockholm and the chance to at least match his dad's final feat.

"One more thing and that is the toe poke," Justin said. "Or just to score."

Column: Scott Dixon grabs Indy 500 spotlight, robbery aside

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — It is only fitting that it was Scott Dixon, the greatest IndyCar driver of his generation, to grab some of the spotlight away from Fernando Alonso.

Sure, "The Iceman" was robbed at gunpoint in the drive thru of a Taco Bell just a mile away from Indianapolis Motor Speedway not long after he won the pole for the Indianapolis 500. He made a dash for his taco celebration with mate Dario Franchitti, a fellow four-time IndyCar champion, and the headlines of the robbery followed soon after.

But Dixon was already becoming the talk of the speedway before the great Taco Bell heist as "The Greatest Spectacle in Racing" had turned into, well, quite the spectacle, almost all of it surrounding Alonso.

Alonso deserves the attention. The two-time Formula One champion has thrived at Indy and soaked in every single second of his opportunity to run in what he considers to be the greatest race in the world.

But it was Dixon who won the pole in an aggressive setup from engineer Chris Simmons that pushed the limits. Dixon's third Indy 500 pole was the best qualifying run in 21 years at Indy, his four-lap average a brisk 232.164 mph.

Dixon's doesn't let much bother him, so the Alonso show is hardly a slight to the New Zealand driver. Still, he's the 2008 winner of the Indy 500 and ranks fourth on the all-time winning list. He's no different than Helio Castroneves, Tony Kanaan, Juan Pablo Montoya, Ryan Hunter-Reay or even Alexander Rossi — all Indy 500 winners who find themselves in the Alonso's shadow.

The upside to Alonso skipping the F1 race at Monaco this weekend is that new viewers are paying attention to the Indy 500. The downside is that it has come at the expense of quite a

few storylines that, without the presence of Alonso, would be a huge part of the hype leading into Sunday.

The subplots at Indy are meaty, too:

PAGING ROGER PENSKE
His organization is known for excellence and Team Penske holds Indianapolis in the highest regard. But only one of the five Penske cars qualified for the Fast Nine Shootout on pole day, and Will Power ended up the slowest qualifier of the group. He will start ninth on Sunday, highest of all the Penske cars.

"That was as good as we had," Power said.

Roger Penske has a record 16 wins at Indy, but his cars didn't look like contenders out of qualifying.

Behind Power is Castroneves, who will start 19th — the worst qualifying position in 17 Indy 500 starts for the three-time winner. Two-time Indy 500 winner Montoya will start 18th, Josef Newgarden 22nd and Simon Pagenaud 23rd.

"It is a mystery," Pagenaud said. "That's what makes Indianapolis, that's why this place is special. Sometimes it's tough to figure it out. We can't figure it out this month."

If the team doesn't pick it up by Sunday, The Captain will not be a happy man.

CHEVROLET VS. HONDA
Chevrolet seemed to be lagging behind Honda at the start of the IndyCar season, when Honda opened with a pair of victories. But three straight Chevrolet wins seemed to indicate it might be an even playing field.

Well, either Chevrolet is sandbagging at Indy, or Honda has really upped its game.

The Fast Nine qualifying consisted of six Honda drivers, and just three from Chevrolet. Ed Carpenter was the highest-qualifying Chevy driver at second, and teammate JR Hildebrand was sixth. But with the

So long, Wayne?: Cup final may be Rooney's last United game

MANCHESTER, England (AP) — Wayne Rooney could finish his Manchester United career by hoisting a European trophy, surrounded by jubilant teammates and with fireworks exploding around him.

Still, it wouldn't be quite the end he would have envisioned after 13 years at the English club.

Rooney is set to be a substitute for United on Wednesday in the Europa League final against Ajax in Stockholm, a role which the club's captain and record scorer has become increasingly accustomed to this season. Depending on the situation in the match, he might not even come on.

That's how it's been for most of this season, watching from afar at a club where he was once the main man.

Talk about United's key players ahead of a final that means so much to the English club, and many would say Marcus Rashford or Paul Pogba or Henrikh Mkhitaryan.

Few would say Rooney.

That's the reason why this game might be his last for United despite having two years left on his contract, why he has been linked for much of the past few months with a return to former club Everton, a move to MLS in the United States, or a short spell in the

Chinese league.

United is moving on under Jose Mourinho and Rooney is being left behind. Speculation grows that James Rodriguez will be moving to Old Trafford from Real Madrid, adding to the list of attackers who will be ahead of Rooney in the pecking order next season.

There was a symbolic moment Sunday on the final day of the Premier League season. Rooney was one of the few senior players picked for a virtually meaningless match against Crystal Palace — Mourinho rested most of his Europa League starters — and he was replaced in the final minutes by 16-year-old attacking midfielder Angel Gomes, who became the first player born this millennium to play in the Premier League.

Rooney applauded all corners of Old Trafford and walked off with his head down. Was he saying goodbye to the stadium he has played at since 2004, when — at 18 — he made a spectacular debut by scoring a hat trick in a Champions League game against Fenerbahce?

Since then, he has racked up 253 goals for United to surpass Bobby Charlton's long-standing club record. He is also England's record scorer with 53 goals, again overtaking

Charlton.

He has won the Premier League title five times, the FA Cup once, the League Cup three times and the Champions League once. That last trophy came in 2008 when he was part of the famous frontline containing Cristiano Ronaldo and Carlos Tevez.

Rooney is no longer the force of old, unable to influence matches in the same way or tear around the field harassing opponents. Games can pass him by and there is the fear that, after 15 years in the spotlight of the soccer world, he is simply burnt out.

In his last appearance at a news conference, prior to the second leg of the Europa League semifinals against Celta Vigo, Rooney said his priority at this stage of his career was to "play football." When asked if that meant at United, he added: "Of course."

He will end this season likely having started 25 of United's 64 games. Often, he was an unused substitute.

Mourinho said he would not sell Rooney against his wishes, so it is for the player to decide if Wednesday is the last time he dons a United jersey.

Whether he actually makes it onto the field remains to be seen.

UEFA: 'No specific intelligence' of risk to Europa final

STOCKHOLM (AP) — After a deadly bombing at a concert in Manchester, UEFA said Tuesday it has “no specific intelligence” that the Europa League final featuring Manchester United will be a target.

Man United plays Ajax on Wednesday in Stockholm, and security was already intensified following a deadly truck attack in the Swedish capital last month.

“The terrorist risk had been taken into account since the very beginning of the project,” UEFA said, noting it has worked with Swedish authorities “for many months” to plan for the game.

“There is currently no specific intelligence which might suggest that any of the UEFA Europa League Final activities in Stockholm may be the target of attacks,” UEFA said in a statement.

At least 22 people were killed when an apparent suicide bomber attacked an Ariana Grande concert as the performance ended on Monday in Manchester.

Man United players observed a minute’s silence for the victims at a Tuesday morning training session before flying to Sweden.

United coach Jose Mourinho’s scheduled news conference later in the day at the Friends Arena in Stockholm was canceled at the club’s request, UEFA said.

Ajax joined many in the soccer world expressing support for the victims.

“From Amsterdam with love to Manchester,” the Dutch team posted on its official Twitter account. “Our thoughts are with the victims and the loved ones of those affected.”

Former United greats used

social media to show support for the city.

Cristiano Ronaldo’s Twitter account had a post of a British flag with “MANCHESTER” written across the red central stripe.

David Beckham wrote on Facebook: “As a father & a human what has happened truly saddens me.”

The club said its “staff are ready to help the police and other emergency services in any way that may be required at this challenging time for our city.”

Old Trafford, including a club store and museum, was closed on Tuesday.

Manchester City captain Vincent Kompany wrote on Twitter: “I would like to express my deepest condolences to the families of the victims. It’s a sad day for the great city of Manchester. #Unity.”

Penske cars struggling, Chevrolet just seems overmatched.

It’s an odd position for Chevy, the dominant manufacturer since it returned to IndyCar competition in 2012, and has the makings for an ugly Indy 500 for the Bowtie Brigade.

BOURDAIS’ BAD BREAK

Few drivers had as strong a start to the season as Sebastien Bourdais, another four-time champion who has gone largely under the radar for almost a decade.

But he opened the year with a sports car victory at the Rolex 24 at Daytona driving for Chip Ganassi, and then won the IndyCar opener at St. Petersburg driving for tiny Dale Coyne Racing.

Bourdais’ lap of 233.116 mph registers as the fastest so far at Indy this month, and he might have had a shot at the pole before his frightening accident in Saturday’s qualifying. Now the Frenchman has had surgery to repair fractures to his

hip and pelvis, and Coyne likely lost his shot at winning the 500.

James Davison will replace Bourdais, who is out indefinitely. He tweeted a picture of himself Monday in his hospital gown, but up and moving with a walker. His loss is a huge blow to the Coyne team, which Bourdais felt strongly he could build into a contender and seemed to be delivering on his word through his first season with the organization.

Ex-Barcelona president Rosell held in money laundering probe

MADRID (AP) — Former Barcelona president Sandro Rosell and his wife have been detained in connection with his businesses in Brazil, Spanish authorities said Tuesday.

The detentions were part of a money-laundering investigation related to buying television rights for past matches of Brazil's national team.

Three other people were detained, but their identities were not immediately released by authorities.

Police raided offices, homes and businesses in Barcelona and other locations in Spain as part

of "Operation Rimet," a reference to former FIFA President Jules Rimet, who also gave his name to the World Cup trophy from 1930-70.

Authorities said the operation looked into the alleged illegal payments received by Rosell and other people involved in promoting Brazil's games. Authorities said nearly 15 million euros (\$16.8 million) could have been laundered through tax havens.

Officials said the operation used information from the FBI following the U.S. case against high-level FIFA officials in 2015.

Rosell, a former Nike executive in Brazil, had close connections to the former president of the Brazilian football confederation, Ricardo Teixeira, who was mentioned in the indictment by American officials.

Teixeira was also being investigated by Spanish authorities, and raids were also expected in Brazil. Teixeira resigned from the Brazilian confederation in 2012 citing medical reasons amid widespread allegations of corruption and irregularities in his administration.

In the 1990s, Rosell negotiated several deals with Teixeira involving Brazil's national team and Nike, which remains the sportswear company used by the Brazilian team.

Several years ago, Rosell was formally accused by Brazilian authorities of using one of his companies to illegally benefit from a friendly between Brazil and Portugal in 2008. Rosell was cleared of any wrongdoing at the time.

In a separate case in Spain, Rosell is going to stand trial for fraud and corruption charges involving the transfer of striker Neymar from Brazilian club Santos in 2013. Prosecutors said the real amount of the transfer fee was concealed to benefit some of those involved. Neymar and his father will also stand trial.

Rosell resigned as Barcelona president in 2014 because of the allegations related to Neymar's transfer. He had taken over the club in 2010.

He and his wife were detained at their home in Barcelona during one of the police raids. They stayed at the location while authorities executed search warrants. Another home owned by Rosell was also searched by police.

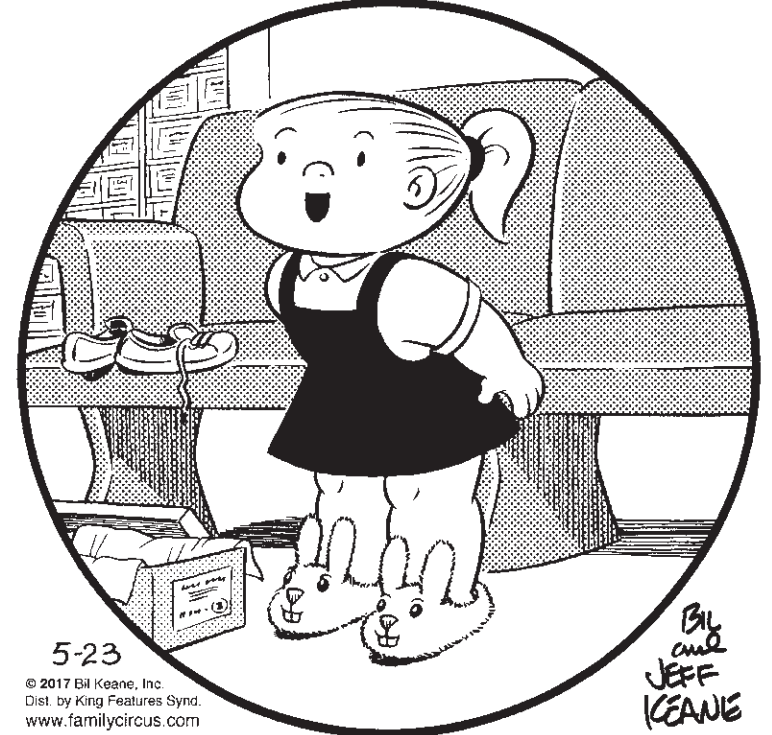

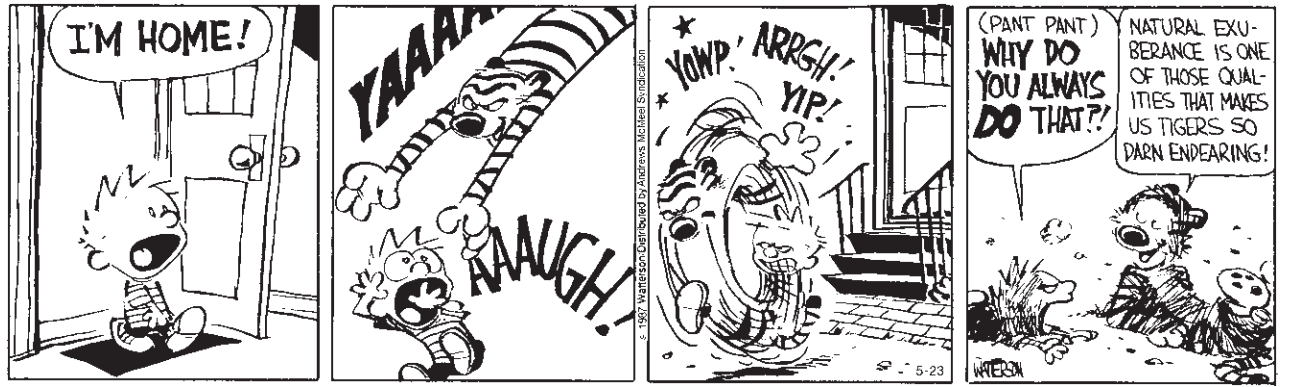

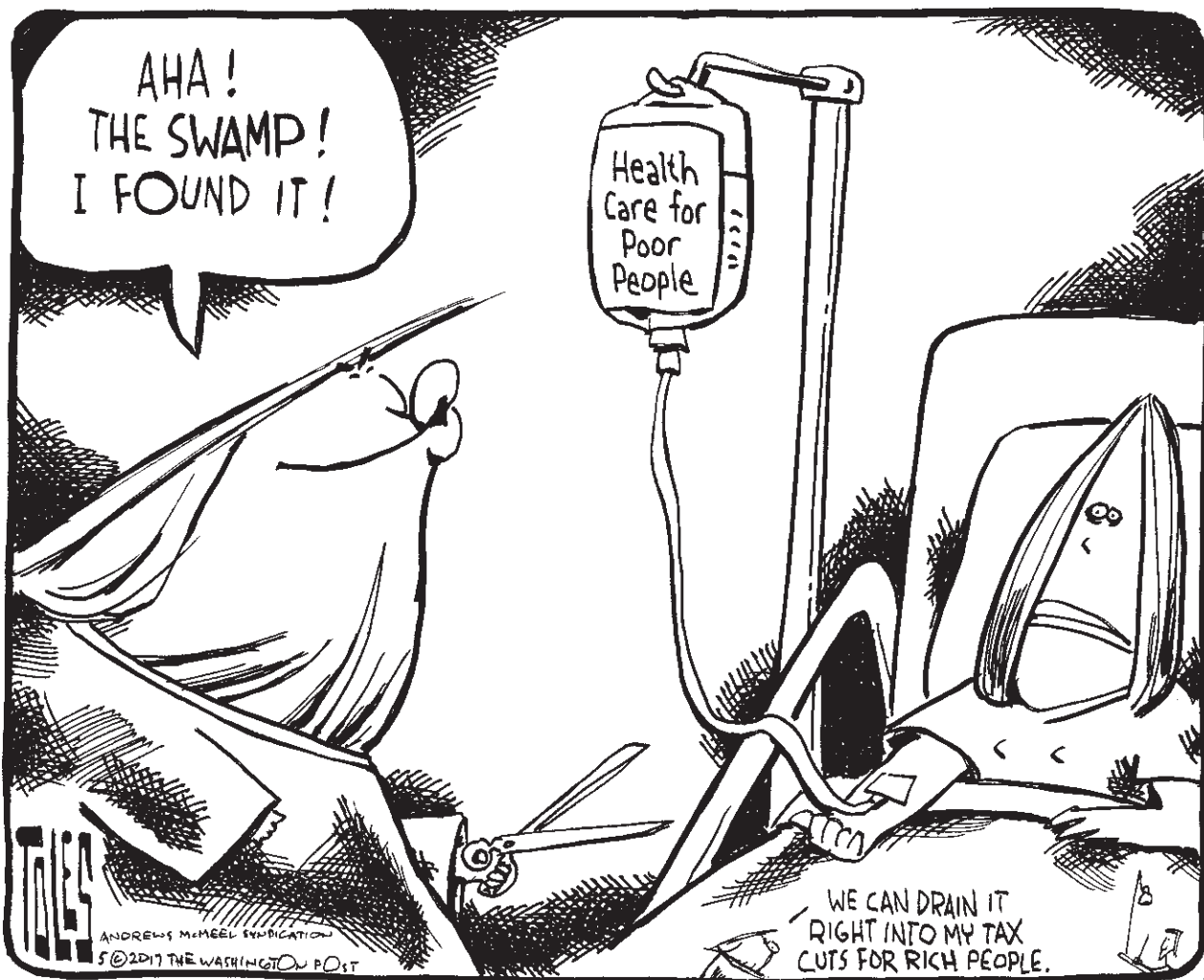
