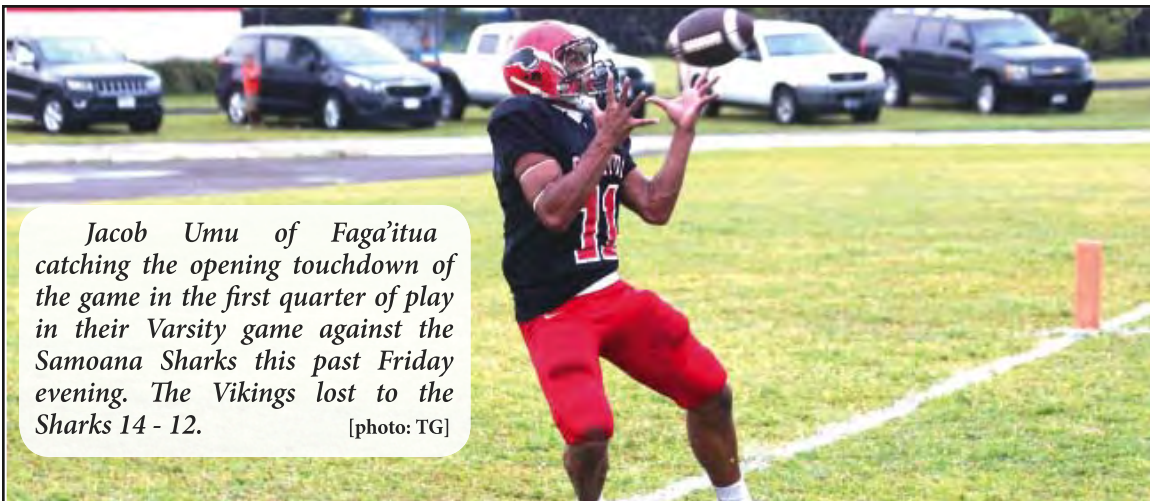

Samoana Sharks Varsity edge the Vikings out in a stunning victory

SHARKS JV CONTINUES TO WREAK HAVOC IN ANOTHER BLOWOUT WIN

This past weekend was the fifth week of the American Samoa High School Athletic Association (ASHSAA) 2017-18 Football Season — the final week of the first round, which concluded with Samoana High School's second win of the season in the Varsity Division — a shocker — it was a two-point victory over Head Coach Sua'ese Pooch Ta'ase and his Faga'itua Vikings.

This was 'the' match that ASHSAA Football fanatics claimed that Samoana had a chance to prove themselves if they defeated the Vikings — and indeed they did — in both divisional competition of the East Side Battle. Samoana's passing game finally pulled through for them in their Friday Night Lights battle against the reigning champs of the league — with two passing touchdowns that allowed them the lead throughout the final half of their game.

VARSITY DIVISION SAMOANA SHARKS 14 – FAGA'ITUA VIKINGS 12

The passing game wasn't the only thing that claimed the Sharks second victory of the regular season — credit also goes to their defensive side of the ball. With Sebastian, Solomon ISeiuli, and Antonio Pule leading Samoana's defensive front, the Sharks were able to hold on, and stop the Vikings bruising running game.

Late in the opening half

of the game, 1:22 seconds remaining in the second quarter, and the Vikings running game was threatening inside Samoana territory — Vito Kitiona at the helm for the Vikings sounded the snap on the Sharks 15-yard line, and rolled out with a play action pass to find Jacob Umu in the end zone for the opening touchdown of the game.

Just when the Vikings thought they'd get away with the lead into halftime — the Sharks said 'Not Today!' when Anthony Feala spotted Zephaniah Pati on the long route, and Feala bombed a long one to Pati for their first touchdown of the game, with just 58 seconds remaining in the first half; Samoana came roaring back to tie the game with six a piece.

Suddenly, just when Samoana's flame of hope started to light, the Vikings turned off the lights when they came back with just seconds remaining, and pulled off a last second TD — 28 seconds remaining in the first half, and Vito Kitiona finds Steven Fiso on the post route for a long reception that spotted them a first down situation on the Sharks five yard line.

From there, Kitiona sent Advent Migi straight up the middle for a five yard touchdown reception, their second touchdown of the half, as they came back and took the lead 12 - 6. Their two-point conversion was no good when Seiuli sacked Kitiona immediately in the backfield for a loss.

7:25 in the third quarter of play, and Samoana spots another fortunate down inside Vikings territory. After a few running plays to gain yardage,

Cowboys' Jerry Jones reignites protest conversation in NFL

DALLAS (AP) — Now that Jerry Jones of the Dallas Cowboys has become the first NFL owner with a public suggestion of repercussions for displays during the national anthem, players are opening up more about the delicate balance of team chemistry and politics in the locker room.

And they're not necessarily slamming the powerful and outspoken Jones for suggesting his players will be benched if they disrespect the flag.

"He's the owner. Either you listen or you don't," Washington Redskins tight end Vernon Davis said Monday. "And if you don't listen, then you won't play. It's all up to

each and every individual."

Jones was responding Sunday night to questions about Vice President Mike Pence's decision to leave an Indianapolis home game in protest of about a dozen San Francisco players who kneeled during the anthem. President Donald Trump tweeted after Pence's walkout that he had told his vice president to leave if any players kneeled.

On Monday night, Trump also tweeted his support for Jones.

"A big salute to Jerry Jones, owner of the Dallas Cowboys, who will BENCH players who disrespect our Flag," the president tweeted. "Stand for Anthem or sit for game!"

when everyone in management can unite and truly embrace and articulate what the flag stands for, liberty and justice for all, instead of some of them just talking about standing," Smith said. "We look forward to continuing our talks with them on this very issue."

Many of the NFL's 32 teams have held meetings in various forms to discuss the issue since Trump said more than two weeks ago during a rally in Alabama that owners should fire players who kneel for the anthem.

In some cases, teams have struggled with their responses. After Trump's criticism, the Pittsburgh Steelers agreed to stay off the field before the anthem. But Army veteran Alejandro Villanueva, an offensive lineman, stood at the edge of a tunnel with his teammates in darkness behind him during the anthem two weeks ago.

Former 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick started the movement early last season when he sat on the bench, and later kneeled, during the anthem to protest racial inequality and police mistreatment of black males. He remains unsigned and wants to resume his career.

The 74-year-old Jones, also the team's general manager, said after a loss to Green Bay on Sunday that the NFL cannot leave the impression that it tolerates players disrespecting the flag and said any Cowboys doing so will not play.

They were the most provocative comments so far from Jones, a powerful behind-the-scenes force in the NFL and recent Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee who had already been clear in his support of standing for the anthem.

Villanueva said he was not making a political statement or defying his teammates, calling it a misunderstanding that was "very embarrassing on my end."

Miami coach Adam Gase recently created a team policy requiring players either to stand or wait in the tunnel. Three chose to stay off the field Sunday at home against Tennessee — Michael Thomas, Kenny Stills and Julius Thomas. All three have kneeled in the past.

Asked why he was responding to questions on the topic after previously declining to comment, Gase said, "Because I thought it was time for us to address it."

After several meetings over two days before a Monday night game in Arizona two weeks ago, the Cowboys and Jones kneeled arm-in-arm before the anthem. All of them stood during the anthem, with arms still locked. Otherwise, the Cowboys have stood on the sideline.

The NFL players' union had a swift rebuke Monday. Executive director DeMaurice Smith said Jones contradicted assurances last week from Commissioner Roger Goodell and New York Giants President John Mara that players could express themselves without reprisals.

Baker plays 2 hunches vs Cubs and both come up empty

CHICAGO (AP) — A town that already held bad playoff memories for Dusty Baker found a way to torment him again.

The Nationals manager sat down in the interview room to explain two late-inning pitching changes that went south. Combined, they produced a 2-1 loss that left Washington on the brink of elimination in the NL Division Series against Chicago.

Judging by how Baker leaned in toward the microphone to answer questions, his seat must have already been hot.

“I probably couldn’t live with myself if (Kyle) Schwarber had had hit one out of the park,” Baker began, “which he’s dangerous to do that.”

That was in the bottom of the seventh with ace right-hander Max Scherzer still flummoxing Chicago’s hitters, but closing in on his 100-pitch limit for his return from a hamstring injury. A one-out double by Ben Zobrist, the Cubs’ first hit of the game, brought Baker to the mound with lefty-hitting slugger Schwarber on deck.

“I think we were all kind of 50-50 on what was going to happen,” Scherzer acknowledged afterward. The mound meeting ended with catcher Matt Wieters advocating for hard-throwing lefty Sammy

Solis and Baker agreed. “These are pressure-packed situations. They’ve done their homework and they’ve done their job to come up with the best scenario in that situation,” Scherzer said. “I understand it. And when they made the decision I was behind it as well.”

Cubs manager Joe Maddon swapped out Schwarber with righty-hitting Albert Almora Jr., who had already notched 10 RBIs in pinch-hit situations. When he jumped on a Solis changeup and singled to center field to tie the game, Baker already knew there might be some explaining to do.

Baker’s other tough pitching call an inning later only doubled his workload. With a Cubs runner at second and two outs, the Nats could have walked dangerous left-handed bat Anthony Rizzo and gone after the next hitter, young catcher Willson Contreras.

Baker decided to pull Brandon Kintzler in favor of lefty Oliver Perez and pitch to Rizzo, who promptly blooped a single into left-center to drive in the go-ahead run. Rizzo, upset by the decision to pitch to him in that situation, added insult to injury by screaming “Respect me! Respect me!” after the ball fell in.

Reminded of that moment, Baker scratched his chin.

Feala turned to his air attack from the Vikings 20-yard line – Feala finds Elliot Lelei on the post route, and hooked up with Lelei for Samoana’s second touchdown of the game.

As Samoana is the only team known in the league that can make field goals by way of Lelei – Samoana’s fake field goal conversion totally caught the Vikings off guard, as they didn’t rush the kicker nor maintained coverage, and the Sharks were able to fake the kick and opted to pass out to (#11) for a successful two-point conversion – the conversion that brought them back to take the lead as well as the win with a 14 - 12 victory.

JUNIOR VARSITY SAMOANA SHARKS 34 – FAGA’ITUA VIKINGS 6

The Faga’itua Vikings started this one off by shooting themselves in the foot with false start penalties and holding penalties, spotting themselves an offensive conversion deep inside their territory – where they snapped the ball and their quarterback was forced and sacked in the backfield for a safety by Paul Fano and Masaichi Aviu of the Sharks as they took the two-point lead.

Samoana’s offensive side of the ball was noticed to have some changes in the opening quarter of this one, as they brought Fano to be their starting quarterback, as Fano led the

Sharks right back to the goal line to claim their opening touchdown of the game.

6:23 into the opening quarter, and Fano crosses the goal line for the first touchdown of the game – an option quarterback keep from Faga’itua’s 15- line. Their two-point conversion in the hands of Fano again on a quarterback sneak was good enough to give them a 10 - 0 lead.

It wasn’t until the fifth minute of the quarter when the Vikings option game finally came through after patiently waiting for windows to start opening. 5:24 in the opening half, and the Vikings Jesse Toilolo catches a 25-yard pass from his quarterback for Faga’itua’s first touchdown of the game.

3:44 still in the first quarter, Samoana managed to get back into Vikings territory and play a desperate third down on the Vikings 5-yard line — Jr. Tanielu pitched the ball out to Fano who stormed towards the corner of the end zone for his second touchdown of the game.

8:22 in the third quarter of play, and Tanielu finds John Uga’itafa on a quick slant pass to open up the second half of play with another Samoana touchdown. Their two-point conversion, a quarterback keeper by Tanielu was good enough to extend their lead and win it for their Sharks 32 - 6.
