## Which new FBS head coaches are most likely to succeed?

Grading the hires of new college football coaches is an offseason tradition and an exercise in educated guess work.

Still, college football writers do it every year, ticking off fans of teams that receive poor marks and opening themselves up for criticism years later when that C turns out to be an A. Or vice versa.

So let's not do that. Instead, let's rank the members of the 2016-17 class of newly hired coaches by which are most likely to succeed in their jobs.

Success is relative, of course. At Texas, triumph is a steady diet of conference titles and national championship contention. At Purdue, regularly going to bowl games is enough. At LSU, it's beating Alabama.

### WITH THAT, HERE WE GO:

#### 1. Jeff Brohm, Purdue

Brohm is most likely to thrive because of the combination of his track record (30-10 in three seasons at Western Kentucky) and the low bar to clear at Purdue, where the past nine seasons have produced two bowl appearances and one winning final record. The Boilermakers shouldn't be this bad and the school is in the process of pumping millions of dollars into facilities. Brohm is a creative offensive mind who could easily be Purdue's next Joe Tiller.

#### 2. P.J. Fleck, Minnesota

Playing in the Big Ten West doesn't put the Gophers at a severe competition disadvantage the way that, say, Maryland is by being in the Big Ten East. At Western Michigan, Fleck had recruiting classes that were comparable to some low-rated Big Ten groups, which is remarkable for a MAC school. If the Gophers can consistently threaten Wisconsin, Nebraska and Iowa under Fleck, that's a step forward, and it doesn't seem like a stretch for him to pull that off a few times over the next five years.

#### 3. Charlie Strong, USF

Strong did an excellent job at Louisville in the Big East, when he was able to load up on players from Florida. Now he's back in his comfort zone. In the short term, Strong inherits a team favored to win the American Athletic Conference.

#### 4. Tom Herman, Texas

It is easy to buy into the Herman hype-machine. He very well could be the next great college football coach, and Texas offers him the chance to compete at the highest level. He has also been a head coach for all of two seasons at a Houston program that went 75-43 in the nine years before he got there. Meeting through-the-roof expectations at Texas means Herman's success is no guarantee.

#### 5. Luke Fickell, Cincinnati

The Ohio native and former Buckeye seems a perfect fit at a program that helped launch Mark Dantonio, Brian Kelly and Butch Jones to Power Five jobs.

#### 6. Mike Sanford, Western Kentucky

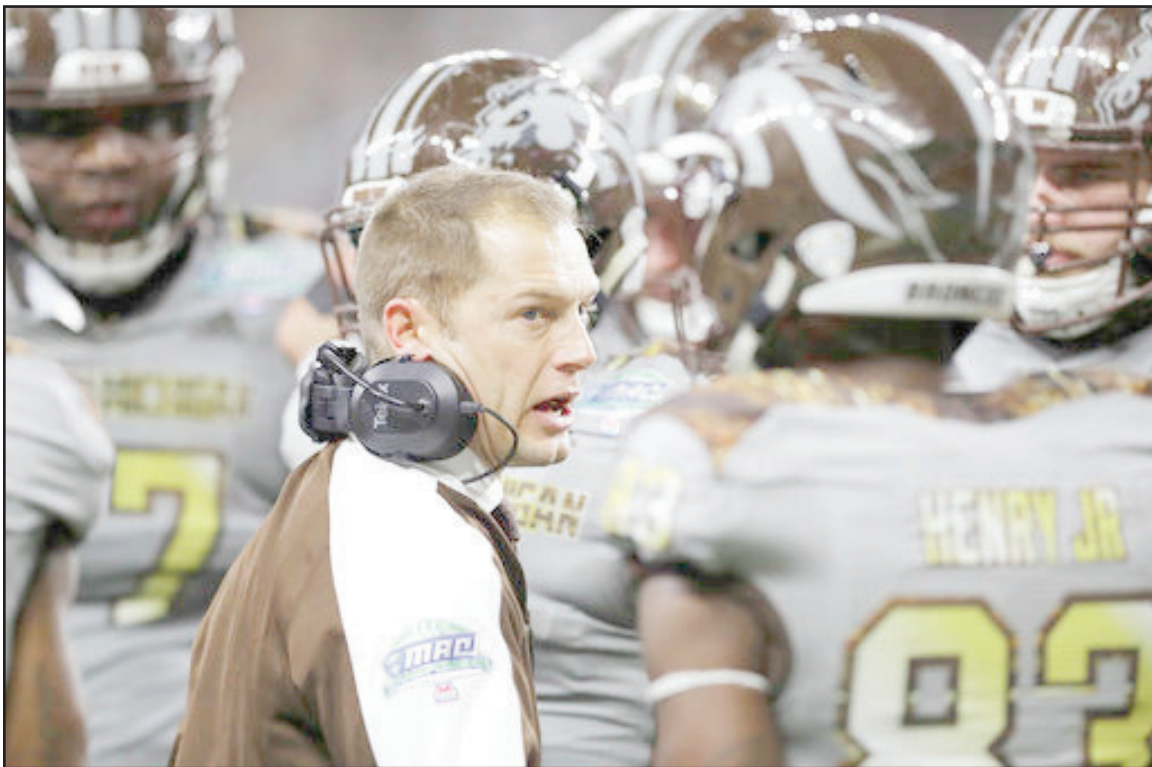
All first-time head coaches come with uncertainty, even one like Sanford who seems to have all the makings of a rising star. This looks like an ideal match of ascending coach and program, but beware: Anything less than yearly Conference USA championship contention will be seen as a step back for WKU.

#### 7. Ed Orgeron, LSU

Successful stints as interim head coach at Southern California and LSU have helped Orgeron put a 10-25, three-year run at Ole Miss behind him. He seems better prepared to lead a major program, but he is also replacing the winningest coach in LSU history. Good luck satisfying Tigers fans while Nick Saban is still coaching in Tuscaloosa.

#### 8. Willie Taggart, Oregon

Can Oregon replicate the peak it reached under Chip Kelly? How close does Taggart — who needed 2 1/2 seasons to turnaround USF — have to come to Kelly to be considered successful?

# Albert Pujols hits 599th HR in Angels’ 9-3 win over Braves

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) — Albert Pujols was only moderately excited when he looked up at the scoreboard and learned he had tied Babe Ruth’s career hits total with his 599th home run.

The slugger always prefers to see less attention focused on his milestones and more on the Angels’ victories — particularly when a first-time starter plays a major role.

Pujols connected during Los Angeles’ nine-run third inning in a 9-3 victory over struggling Bartolo Colon and the Atlanta Braves on Tuesday night.

Pujols moved to the brink of his latest landmark with a three-run homer off Colon (2-6) early in the Angels’ biggest inning of the season. After his first-inning single, Pujols’ homer was his 2,873rd career hit, matching Ruth’s total in 30 fewer games.

“I don’t play here for numbers,” Pujols said. “My goal since Day One when I got to

the big leagues was to help the organization that I wear the uniform of. ... I’m aware of the history, don’t get me wrong. I respect it, but I think that’s kind of a distraction that I don’t want to bring into the game for me.”

The 37-year-old slugger has homered in back-to-back games for the first time this season. He can become the ninth player in baseball history, and fourth-youngest, to reach 600 homers with his next shot.

Pujols would rather talk about Parker Bridwell (1-0), who earned his first major league win by pitching six-hit ball into the seventh inning of a spot start in the Angels’ injury-plagued rotation.

“He didn’t look like a guy that was making his first start out there in his career,” Pujols said. “He was really comfortable as soon as he took that ball in the first inning and went right after the batters.”

Matt Kemp and Tyler Flowers homered for the Braves.

### BART’S BAD DAY

The 44-year-old Colon committed one of the Braves’ three errors in the third, leading to seven unearned runs. Although he gave up seven hits and got just seven outs in his latest unimpressive outing, Atlanta seemed to take the loss as a result of group ineptitude.

“I don’t know that I’ve ever witnessed anything like that, and I’ve been at all the levels,” Braves manager Brian Snitker said. “I don’t know. It was a little bit of everything. I don’t know, because I didn’t count, how many extra outs we gave them.”

### RAMSHACKLE RALLY

In their second game after losing Mike Trout to an injured thumb ligament, the Angels still managed plenty of offense.

All nine batters scored one run apiece in the third-inning rally, which would have ended before it began if Jace Peterson had completed a double play

on Kole Calhoun’s one-out grounder. Instead, Pujols’ subsequent homer cleared the bases.

The Angels reached base in 12 consecutive plate appearances during the rally, which included an error by shortstop Dansby Swanson along with a handful of head-scratching defensive plays that weren’t errors.

“It bothers you, because this is the major leagues,” Snitker said. “That shouldn’t happen. It’s one thing these guys should be able to do is make plays, and we didn’t. And it was a lot of people not making plays.”

### PARKER CAN’T LOSE

Bridwell persisted through a bumpy beginning to win in his first appearance for the Angels, who acquired the right-hander from Baltimore last month. After converting Bridwell into a starter, the Angels called him up to become the ninth starter and 22nd pitcher to appear for the club in just 55 games.

Bridwell had about 20 friends and family members in the stands, but didn’t show the pressure. Waiting out the Angels’ extensive rally didn’t bother him, either.

“I just sat in my spot and didn’t talk,” Bridwell said. “And when (Atlanta) made the pitching change, I just went down to the (batting) cage and played catch, a couple of throws, and watched the offense put up runs.”

### TRAINER’S ROOM

Braves: 2B Brandon Phillips didn’t play to get extra rest for his bruised right knee. He isn’t expected to need a stint on the disabled list.

Angels: OF Cameron Maybin sat out after feeling tightness in his side after making a running catch Monday. ... 3B Yunel Escobar will play a rehab game with Class A Inland Empire on Wednesday, and could return to the Angels on Thursday. He has missed two weeks with a strained hamstring.

### 13. Randy Edsall, UConn

UConn needed a coach who can consistently get the Huskies to bowl games, and Edsall has done it before.

### 14. Tom Allen, Indiana

If Allen produces just slightly better results than Kevin Wilson without alienating the administration, he will be a success. Problem is getting better results while facing Ohio State, Michigan, Penn State and Michigan State every year.

### 15. Butch Davis, FIU

The 65-year-old Davis brings credibility to a program

# Gardner, Holliday HRs carry Yankees over Orioles 8-3

BALTIMORE (AP) — Brett Gardner and Matt Holliday are going head-to-head in a good-natured home run derby, and the big winner appears to be the first-place New York Yankees.

Gardner and Holliday each homered twice, Aaron Judge drove in two runs and New York received a solid pitching performance from Luis Severino in an 8-3 win over the Baltimore Orioles on Tuesday night.

Gardner set the tone for the AL East leaders by connecting on the third pitch from Chris Tillman (1-2), who had not allowed a home run in his previous four starts this season.

Holliday went deep in the first inning and again in the third, his 22nd career multi-homer game.

Gardner’s second solo shot sparked a three-run fourth that made it 8-0. The drive left Gardner and Holliday knotted at 11 home runs apiece.

“He stared at me all around the bases,” Holliday joked. “We’ve got a little competition going. It’s kind of sad considering I’m about 50 pounds heavier and much, much taller.”

Yankees manager Joe Girardi said: “Hitting can be contagious. I think they can feed off each other. It helps.”

For an offense that has feasted on the long ball this season, the mantra is: One home run deserves another.

“Our real strength is our depth, 1 through 9,” Holliday said. “Guys can do damage.”

Severino (4-2) gave up one run and seven hits over 6 1/3 innings, striking out eight and walking one. Although the right-hander’s run of 17 consecutive scoreless innings ended in the sixth, he has gone four straight starts without allowing a home run for the first time in his career.

“His stuff is elite,” Holliday said. “Anytime you can give him a lead and make him feel a little more comfortable, it makes it even harder on the opposing team.”

Trey Mancini had three hits and an RBI for the Orioles, who have lost eight of nine and 14 of

18. Three-time All-Star Manny Machado went 0 for 5 with four strikeouts, lowering his batting average to .210.

Tillman lasted only 2 2/3 innings, yielding five runs and seven hits — three of them homers.

“Chris wasn’t very crisp and just didn’t pitch well,” manager Buck Showalter said. “Couple in the fact that it’s a good-hitting club, and it just wasn’t very good.”

Tillman went 16-6 last year, but he started this season on the disabled list and has been inconsistent since being activated on May 7.

“It just kind of snowballed tonight,” Tillman said. “They came out hacking and never stopped.”

After jumping to a 2-0 lead in the first inning, New York got an RBI single from Aaron Hicks in the second. Holliday’s second solo homer and an RBI single by Chase Headley made it 5-0 in the third.

Gardner hit his second home run leading off the fourth, and a two-run double by Judge completed the Yankees’ offensive thrust.

### BRONX BOMBERS

The Yankees have homered in 10 of their last 11 games and have 75 home runs in 49 games. They are 18-4 when hitting at least two homers.

### TRAINER’S ROOM

Yankees: SS Didi Gregorius was hit in the hand by a pitch in the ninth. He stayed in the game, but Girardi said doctors would take a look at it. ... CF Jacoby Ellsbury is moving closer to coming off the seven-day concussion DL. Ellsbury, who was hurt crashing into the outfield wall last Wednesday, said: “My neck’s felt better each day. I’ll continue to get treatment on that, but as far as the headaches, it feels a lot better today.” ... 1B Greg Bird homered off minor league pitcher Alexander Vizcaino on the first of seven at-bats in a simulated game. Bird is scheduled to play the field in an extended spring training game Wednesday.

# Sale struggles, but Marrero hits 2 HRs to lift Red Sox

CHICAGO (AP) — This wasn’t the way Chris Sale pictured his return to Chicago. With the way the Red Sox swung the bats, it didn’t make much of a difference.

Sale had a shaky first start back in his former home, but Deven Marrero hit two of Boston’s season-high six home runs in a 13-7 victory over the Chicago White Sox on Tuesday night.

Mookie Betts, Jackie Bradley Jr., Xander Bogaerts and Mitch Moreland also went deep. The Red Sox won for the seventh time in nine games after an anticipated duel between aces never materialized.

Sale (6-2) got a warm reception from the crowd and a rude welcome from his old team. The five-time All-Star gave up six runs and 10 hits — both season highs — over five innings in his first appearance against the White Sox.

“I don’t know how many times I’ve given up six runs and still been in a pretty good mood after the game,” Sale said. “That says a lot about my guys behind me.”

Marrero drove in five runs and doubled his career home run total. After hitting two in his first 59 major league games, he went back-to-back with Betts in a four-run second inning and chased Jose Quintana (2-7) with a three-run drive in the third that made it 7-3.

Bradley bumped the lead to 10-6 in the fifth with a three-run drive off Dan Jennings after Chicago cut it to one.

Bogaerts added a solo homer in the eighth and finished with four of Boston’s 16 hits. Moreland knocked a two-run homer off Juan Minaya in the ninth to make it 13-7. Craig Kimbrel worked the final 1 1/3 innings for his 14th save in 15 chances, and the Red Sox picked up the win after dropping two in a row.

Todd Frazier and Tim Anderson homered for Chicago, but the White Sox took the loss after winning four of five.

Dealt to Boston last winter for a package of prospects that included highly regarded slugger Yoan Moncada, Sale was looking forward to pitching against his old friends. He got a standing ovation when he trotted to the mound in the first inning.

But it was a rough night overall for the lanky left-hander. He threw 111 pitches and was consistently behind in the count, though he finished with nine strikeouts and two walks.

Manager John Farrell said the ballpark “played extremely small.” But Sale blamed his rough outing on a lack of command, not the conditions.

Quintana got pounded for seven runs and 10 hits in 2 2/3

innings. It was his shortest outing since he lasted one inning against the New York Yankees on Sept. 2, 2013.

“We’re just going to have to keep grinding it out,” manager Rick Renteria said. “It’s not the stuff. The stuff’s the same. It’s the command and the execution. If we can get that back on track, I think Q’s going to be who he is, which is a very effective major league pitcher.”

The 2016 All-Star has allowed 15 runs, 18 hits and four homers in his past two starts. And his ERA has jumped from 3.92 to 5.60.

“We were both off,” Sale said. “I think people were expecting something a little different. But they came to a 7 o’clock batting practice session.”

**OOPS**

Melky Cabrera briefly remained in the game after fouling a ball off his own face in the eighth inning. The White Sox outfielder went after a pitch low and away and smacked it straight into the ground. It kicked back up and caught him in the head, knocking off his batting helmet. He was visited by a trainer but continued the at-bat and reached on an infield single before being lifted for pinch runner Willy Garcia.

**NOT CUT-TING IT**

At least one White Sox player thought it would have been a real rip to wear throwback uniforms in honor of Sale’s return to the South Side. The fiery Sale clashed with management at times and drew a five-day suspension from the team last year for cutting up throwback uniforms he thought were uncomfortable.

“I don’t know if we gave away the cut-up ones, but maybe we can wear them and put, like, some tape around some of the shirts, so it looks like Edward Scissorhands out there,” Frazier said. “I think (Sale would) probably chuckle after that, too. Why not?”

**TRAINER’S ROOM**

Red Sox: The Red Sox placed 2B Dustin Pedroia on the 10-day disabled list with a sprained left wrist and activated 3B Pablo Sandoval from the DL on Tuesday.

White Sox: Renteria had no specific timetable Tuesday for right-handers James Shields (right lat strain) and Nate Jones (elbow inflammation) beginning rehab assignments. Shields threw 45 pitches in a simulated game on Monday and Jones threw 25 in a bullpen session.

# Slide safely or prioritize safety? Runners must think fast

NEW YORK (AP) — If Mike Trout has ever been concerned about his safety when stealing a base, it hasn’t held him back.

For the AL MVP and many of baseball’s best baserunners, it might not matter anyway. In those split seconds after ball beats runner to the bag, decisions aren’t made with much calculation. If they see a way to the base, they’ll contort their body any which way to try to get there.

“When you look down there, you see the throw is going to beat you, you have to do something to try to escape,” the Los Angeles Angels star said last week.

Sometimes the result is a sweet, highlight-worthy slide . But as Trout experienced over the weekend, there’s a risk to letting instinct take hold in those spots — he tore a ligament in his left thumb diving into second base in Miami on Sunday.

Trout was set to have surgery Wednesday to repair the thumb, which put him on the disabled list for the first time in his career. It’s yet to be seen if the injury will add caution to Trout’s baserunning after years of brazen, crowd-pleasing evasions of infielder’s tags.

Trout has been a regular Houdini on the basepaths throughout his career, and he’s particularly adept at missing tags when he goes in headfirst. He gave Blue Jays third baseman Josh Donaldson the slip on a stolen base last September with one, flipping onto his right side at the last moment, whipping his left arm away from Donaldson’s glove and getting his right hand on the corner of the base.

Trout has also gone headlong into first base when needed, and he even risked his body last season against Toronto when he avoided both a catcher and a discarded baseball bat on a slide into home plate.

Those kinds of plays might give some managers ulcers, but not all skippers are keen on

slowing down their most gifted athletes. Pirates boss Clint Hurdle has one of baseball’s slickest baserunners in Josh Harrison, who has a history of staying safe in creative ways . Hurdle has no intention of holding Harrison back.

Harrison recently tested the bounds of his knee ligaments with a wild slide to avoid a tag at second base. While legging out a double, Harrison cut short his feet-first slide well shy of the bag by jamming his right foot into the ground. He popped into the air, and with his helmet knocked off, his legs splayed and his arms flailing, he dodged Nationals infielder Wilmer Difo and landed his left foot on second base. He immediately looked into the Pirates dugout and grinned at his stunned teammates.

Harrison attributes his ability to elude defenders to his older brothers and a narrow hallway in his childhood home.

“I’m sure I’ve done things like that running from my brothers, running, thinking I’m going to slide under a tag or something,” he said. “Just trying to get away by any means. They were bigger than me.

“I would never suggest anybody to do that,” he added. “But if you can handle it, you obviously know if you can.”

If a player is capable of pulling off something like that, Hurdle isn’t about to make him stop.

“Let men play the game. That’s what I’ve got,” Hurdle said. “He plays the game with his heart outside his chest. I’ve never seen anybody avoid tags like he does. I think it’d be a waste of my time telling him, ‘Hey, can you slow down? Can you be a little bit more careful?’”

“That’s one of the things that got him to the big leagues. That’s what keeps him playing,” Hurdled said. “He’s been to an All-Star Game. It’s that zest, that effort, that energy to play. So, I’m just going to let him play.”

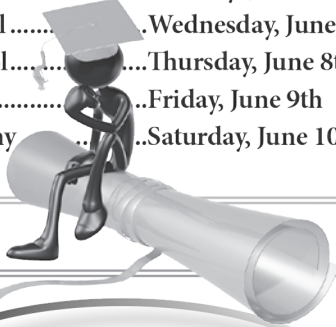

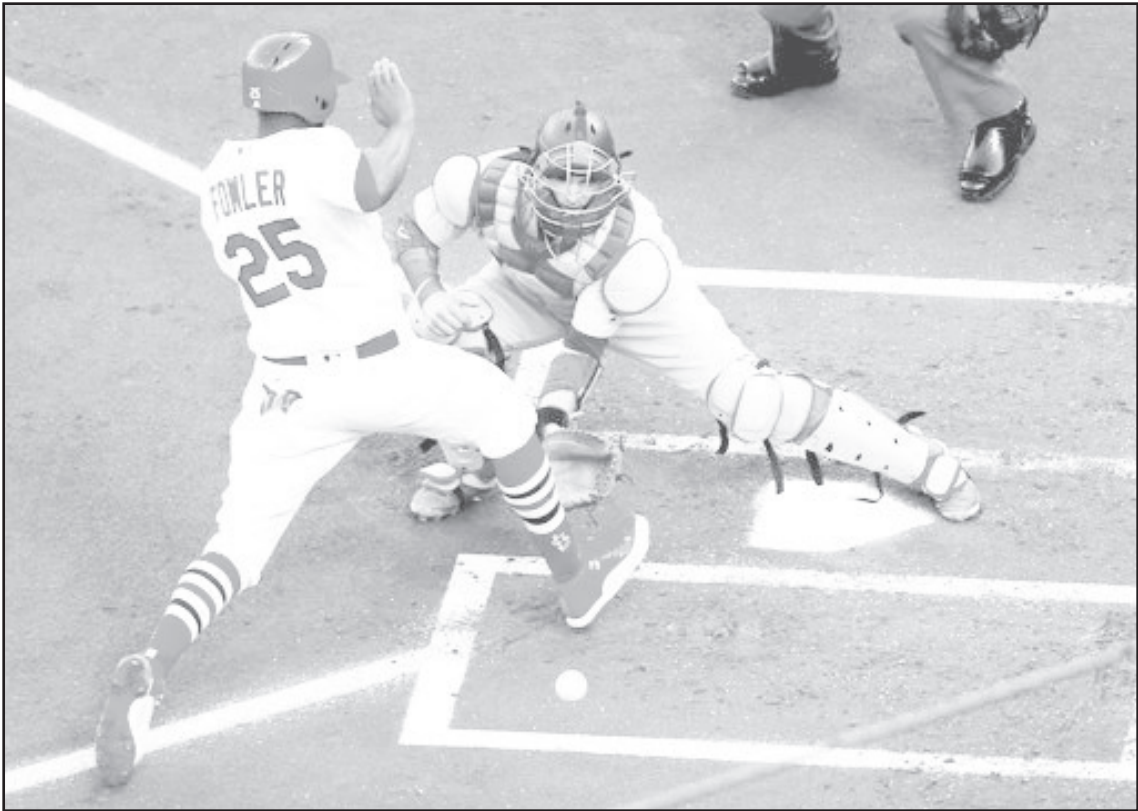

# Utley, Forsythe lead rally as Dodgers move into first place

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Chase Utley was searching for his batting stroke in April. He's found it in May

Utley, Logan Forsythe and Chris Taylor combined to reach base 12 times and totaled six runs, helping the streaking Los Angeles Dodgers rally past the St. Louis Cardinals 9-4 on Tuesday night to move atop the NL West.

The Dodgers went ahead of the Colorado Rockies, who lost 10-4 to the Seattle Mariners.

Utley finished a homer shy of the cycle and was hit by a pitch as the Dodgers won their season-high sixth straight game. Forsythe reached five times, including three walks, and Taylor reached three times.

"Hitting the ball where they're not playing to be honest, squaring some balls up, putting some good at-bats together," Utley said. "Having a little success can breed confidence and I've always had the opinion that a confident hitter is a good hitter."

Adrian Gonzalez's sacrifice fly and Utley's RBI double started the Dodgers comeback in the third. Enrique Hernandez tied it at 3 with a single, and Paul DeJong's throwing error on the same play scored Utley to give the Dodgers a 4-3 lead.

The Dodgers scored three more times behind one hit in the fifth as relievers Tyler Lyons and John Brebbia each walked in a run.

"I think the at-bat quality and there's a thing about winning 90 feet when we need to," Dodgers manager Dave Roberts said. "And guys were able to get on base and win 90 feet when we had too."

Utley has hit .333 (22 for 66) in May and he has three homers in his last six games after hitting just .122 in April.

"It wasn't ideal," Utley said of his slow start. "Not something you really anticipate, but it is what it is and I've been through some funks through the course of my career before. You try to stay positive. You try to stick with what you know and what helped make you successful and hopefully it turns around."

Kenta Maeda spotted the Cardinals three first-inning runs for the second straight start, but once again held them scoreless after that to give the Dodgers a chance to come back.

Brandon Morrow (1-0) led a parade of six Dodgers relievers. The Dodgers bullpen gave up one run in five innings, the third consecutive game Los Angeles relievers had to get more than nine outs.

The Cardinals, who've lost 10 out of their last 13 games, capitalized on a fortunate call and a couple of Dodgers errors to take a 3-0 lead in the first.

Dexter Fowler appeared to be thrown out trying to steal second following a strikeout, but umpire Mark Wegner called a close 3-2 pitch to Tommy Pham ball four. Matt Carpenter followed with a single, Taylor's throwing error scored Fowler, and Pham and Carpenter took an extra base on Maeda's throwing error on the same play. Yadier Molina drove them both home with a single.

"When we score three in the first we anticipate that's a game we're going to add on to and win," Cardinals manager Mike Matheny said. "We started out real well and then we couldn't get anything positive going."

Molina had three RBIs, and his homer off Chris Hatcher in the eighth broke the Dodger bullpen's scoreless innings streak at 24 2/3 innings.

Michael Wacha (2-3) needed 77 pitches to get through three innings, the shortest outing for a Cardinals starter this season. Three of the four runs he allowed were earned.

### DODGERS BLUES

Wacha has blown 3-0 leads in consecutive starts against Los Angeles.

### MAEDA LOSES GRIP

Maeda made throwing errors in the first and second innings. It is the first time Maeda has had two errors in a game and his first error since June 30, 2016.

Dodgers: 3B Justin Turner (hamstring) will go on a rehab assignment, but a beginning date has not been determined.

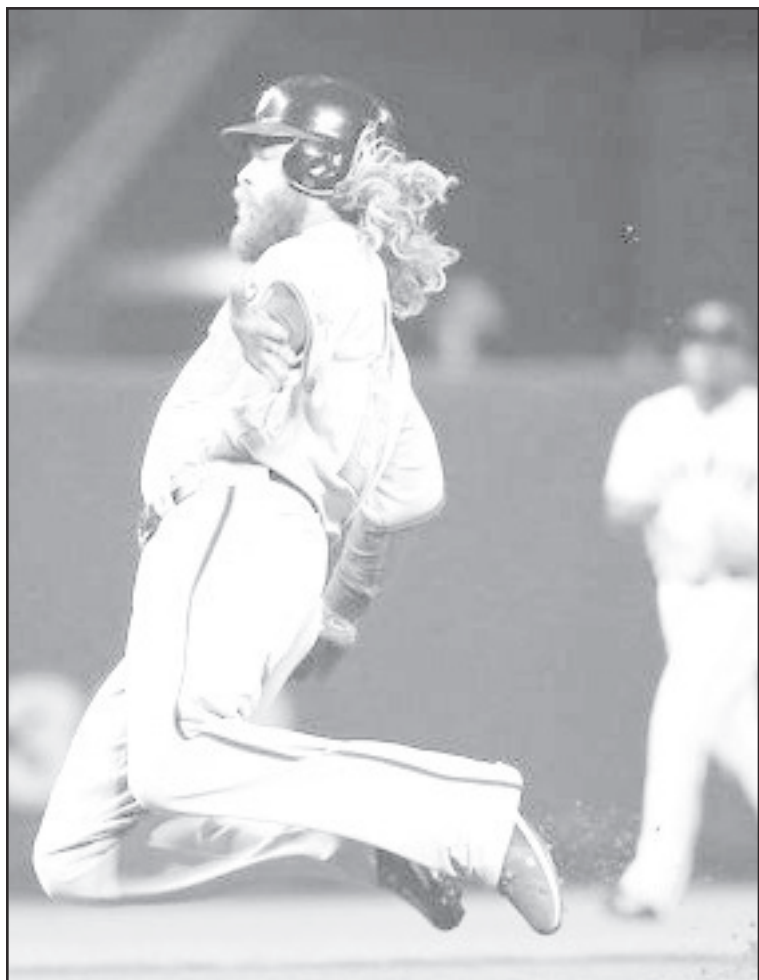

# Gonzalez gets 1st win since April as Nats beat Giants 6-3

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Gio Gonzalez pitched into the seventh inning to win for the first time in more than a month, and the Washington Nationals beat the San Francisco Giants 6-3 on Tuesday night.

Daniel Murphy and Trea Turner had three hits apiece as the NL East leaders won their fourth in five games. Jayson Werth added two hits and a bases-loaded walk, and Michael A. Taylor had two hits and two RBIs.

One night after a wild, bench-clearing brawl that resulted in suspensions for Washington outfielder Bryce Harper and San Francisco reliever Hunter Strickland, the teams played without incident.

Each player appealed his penalty, keeping both eligible to participate until resolutions are reached.

The only reminder of the fight came when Harper was booed by the AT&T Park crowd every at-bat. The Nationals slugger, who received a four-game ban Tuesday from Major League Baseball, went 0 for 5 with three strikeouts and twice left the bases loaded.

He was the only Washington starter without a hit.

Gonzalez (4-1) allowed three runs over 6 1/3 innings with six strikeouts and three walks to win for the first time since April 27. The left-hander also singled home a run in the second and reached on an error in the fifth, two batters before

Werth’s walk against reliever Bryan Morris forced in Taylor to extend Washington’s lead to 6-2.

The Nationals won handily despite stranding 11 runners.

Buster Posey had three hits and an RBI for the Giants. Orlando Calixte, called up from the minors before the game, had two hits and two RBIs.

San Francisco starter Jeff Samardzija (1-7) permitted three runs and nine hits over four innings.

Giants: Michael Morse, who collided hard with Samardzija during Monday’s brawl, was placed on the seven-day concussion disabled list. ... # Petty doesn't feel like forgotten man in Jets' 3-QB race

FLORHAM PARK, N.J. (AP) — Bryce Petty is in the middle of a three-way quarterback competition that many believe is truly just a two-man race.

And, he's the odd-man out. "I mean, it's OTAs," Petty said Tuesday after the New York Jets' fourth practice of organized team activities. "How do you have an underdog?"

Well, there's Josh McCown, the veteran mentor who appears to be the front-runner to start in the season opener at Buffalo on Sept. 10. There's also Christian Hackenberg, the second-round draft pick from a year ago who has never played in a regular-season game and may or may not be the future of the franchise.

Then, there's Petty, who barely made the roster last year and could face a similar uncertainty this summer.

"I don't feel like No. 3," Petty said of the Jets' quarterback depth chart. "I don't think Hack feels like he's No. 3. I don't think Josh feels like he's No. 3, or any of the above."

The reality, however, is that it would be a surprise if Petty wins the job.

"I don't read headlines," Petty said. "I don't do things like that. I'm just focused on coming in here and being better every day."

Petty, a fourth-round pick out of Baylor in 2015, played in six games last season and started four. He hardly solidified himself as part of the Jets' future plans while throwing three touchdown passes and seven interceptions with a 60.0 quarterback rating.

Still, he would have finished as the starter in place of Ryan Fitzpatrick if an injury to his left (non-throwing) shoulder hadn't ended his season before

the finale. "I have the confidence now that, 'Hey, I can play this game,'" Petty said. "I think that's a big thing. ... I think just kind of going through that process, sometimes you kind of make it bigger than it is. Some guys need experience to build that confidence. I think that's kind of what I needed to see that, 'Hey, I can see the rush, I can see the defense, I can make throws, I can throw touchdowns,' and things like that. "That's part of growing up and maturing, and maturing in this league, as well." Both coach Todd Bowles and offensive coordinator John Morton have said that all three quarterbacks will get chances to work with the starting offense throughout organized team activities and perhaps through minicamp. Bowles acknowledged last week that a final decision might not come until training camp in August.

"He's learning the offense just like everybody else — him and Hack, obviously," Bowles said Tuesday. "McCown has been in it before somewhat so he knows it a little more than the other guys. In the fourth practice, it's slowing down for them and they're starting not to turn the ball over as much. They turned it over some last week and haven't turned it over as much this week. It's a process. As OTAs go, we'll look for them to improve even more."

For Petty, there was a lengthy list of things he needed to work on in the offseason, from seeing the field better to reading defenses more confidently, to basic mechanics and footwork.

Another key is staying healthy. Petty hurt his right shoulder in the preseason last summer, then was injured twice in his limited action during the regular season, with the second ending his stint as the starter.

"Whether that's mastering the protections or getting the ball out faster and things like that, I'm trying to do a better job of that," Petty said. "There's always things to get better at, but as long as I'm on the field, that's priority No. 1."

That means trying to avoid the type of bone-rattling smash he took when he ended up being sandwiched by Miami's Ndamukong Suh and Cameron Wake in Week 15.

"If I could survive a hit from those two guys, I think I'll be all right," Petty said with a big smile. "The joke is that I'm going to put that picture in my man cave and have them sign it. I mean, that way, one day when I have kids, they'll know who their Dad is, so they can't mess with me."

"It was a good hit and good little story, so you've got to make jokes out of that kind of stuff."

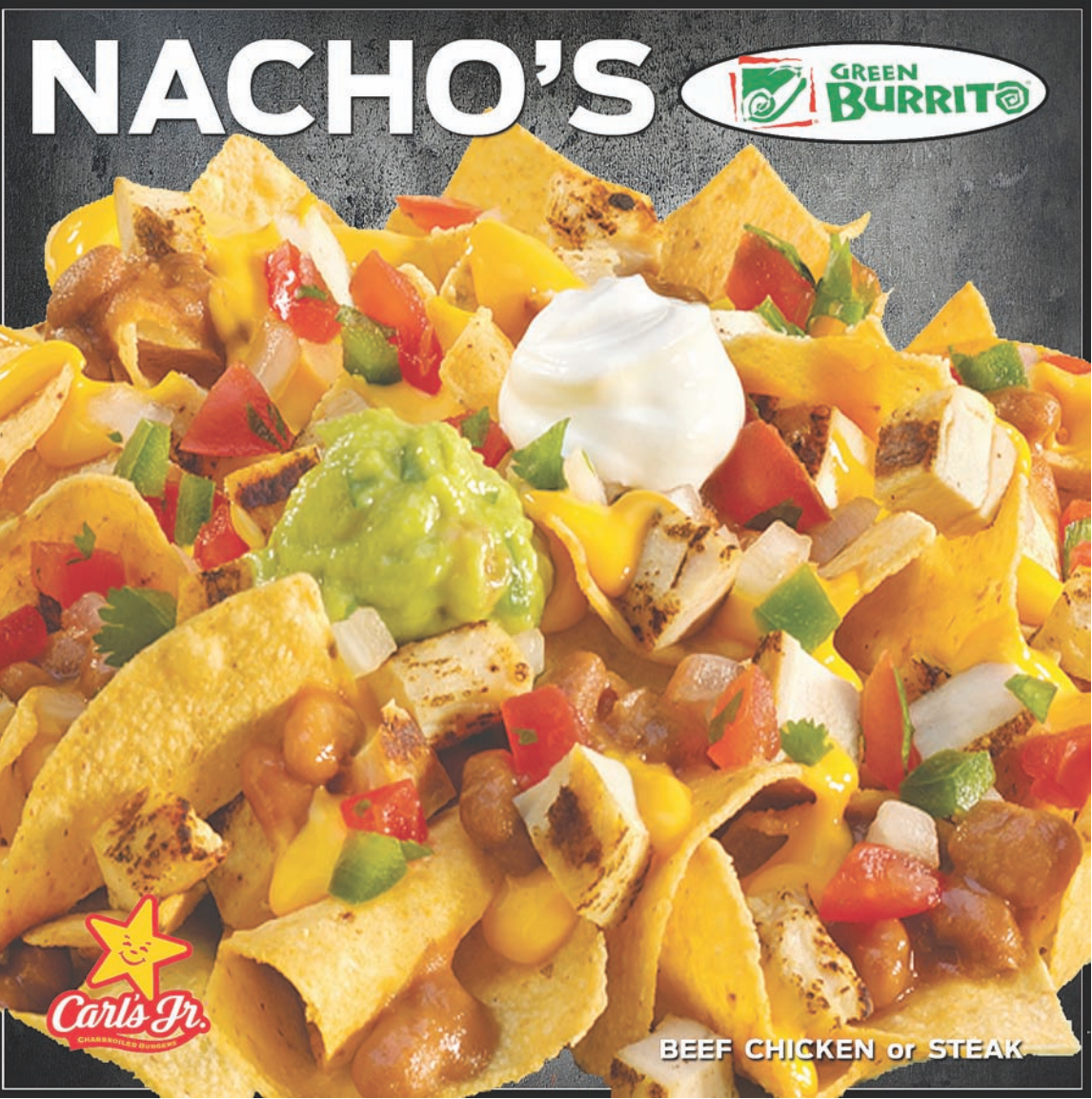

DEAR UNSURE: I agree with your mother for the reason she gave you. You will need baby things in the near future. Your wedding will effectively be your wedding shower.

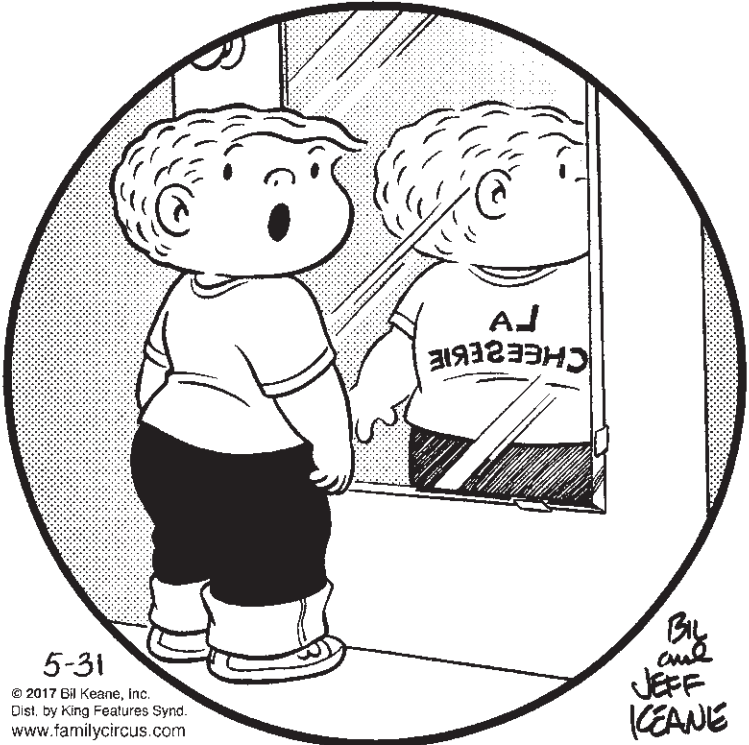


