Leone Lions collect their 1st win of the season over VocTech

JV PLAYOFFS SET FOR THIS SATURDAY

The fifth week of the ASHSAA football season saw head coach Oakland Salave'a and his Leone Lions collecting their first win of the regular season, in the varsity division. However, it was a victory that didn't come easy, as Nu'uuli stood their ground up to the last second.

The 2017- 18 ASHSAA football season coverage is sponsored by Congresswoman Aumua Amata.

Due to a change in schedule that wasn't received by Samoa News in time, the Leone Lions and Nu'uuli Wildcats varsity game wasn't covered. Nevertheless, Leone did pick up their initial win of the season after a 20-12 victory over head coach Andrew Bill Ena and his Nu'uuli Wildcats.

After their first win last Thursday evening, the Lions are now (1-3) while the Wildcats are at the bottom of the division with a (0-4) record – they are the two lowest ranked teams in the varsity division, based on current standings.

For now, the Warriors top the division with an undefeated (4-0) record, looking to open up their second round of competition against the Faga'itua Vikings this Friday, as the Vikes are tied with the Samoana Sharks at No. 2, both with a (2-2) record after the

Vikings lost to the Sharks (by two points) last Friday.

A reminder to all ASHSAA football fans and supporters: ASHSAA has mandated that any team who stays undefeated will automatically be named champions; however, if all teams have at least one loss, then there will be a play-off and a championship game, similar to the routine in previous years.

JUNIOR VARSITY LIONS 0 – WILDCATS 0

Last Saturday morning, the Junior Varsity match up between the Lions and the Wildcats ended with each team being scoreless – as defensive units on both sides of the ball stepped up their game to deny all attempts towards the end zone.

The Lions offense, led by Oakland Salave'a, were all plugged up by the Wildcats run defense, led by middle linebacker Dennis Enoka.

For the Lions, Cyan Fiatoa led the way for Leone's defensive front, as they managed to contain and wreak havoc in the backfield of Nu'uuli's offense with tackles for losses, and more. ASHSAA has scheduled this Saturday to be the date for play-offs for the Junior Varsity Division.

#1 Samoana will face off against #4 Nu'uuli Wildcats; afterwards, #2 Tafuna will play against #3 Leone.

The championship game for the Junior Varsity Division will be held next weekend.

Diamondbacks had great year despite postseason loss

PHOENIX (AP) — When the pain of the way it ended finally fades, the Arizona Diamondbacks will realize just how successful their season was.

They literally flipped their record, from 69-93 in 2016 to 93-69 this year, third-best in the National League. Outscored by 138 runs in 2016, Arizona outscored opponents by 153 this year.

The Diamondback earned the league's No. 1 wild card spot and beat the Colorado Rockies 11-8 in a crazy game before a raucous capacity crowd.

Then everything unraveled against the Los Angeles Dodgers, who swept Arizona in three games in the NL Division Series.

"It was a pretty magical year for a lot of reasons," first-year manager Torey Lovullo said. "... But we're still aching a little bit, we're still a little bit frustrated."

Still, it was a triumphant debut for Lovullo and new general manager Mike Hazen, both hired from the Boston Red Sox.

"We had a hell of a run," reliever Archie Bradley said. "This is a great group of men here." Zack Greinke, in the second season of a six-year, \$206.5 million contract he signed with the previous regime, went 17-7 with a 3.20 ERA but faded down the stretch.

He was yanked in the fourth inning of the wild-card win over the Rockies, replaced by Robbie Ray, thereby ruining plans to start Ray in Game 1 against the Dodgers.

Ray had a breakout season and stands as one of the biggest hopes for the future. The 25-year-old left-hander went 15-5 with a 2.89 ERA and 218 strikeouts in 162 innings.

Paul Goldschmidt, twice a runner-up in the voting, had another MVP-caliber season, hitting .297 with 36 home runs and 120 RBIs, but he was just 1-for-11 in the NLDS, the lone hit a two-run homer to open Game 2. With a runner on second, Dodgers closer Kenley Jansen struck out Goldschmidt to complete the playoff sweep Monday night.

"I really didn't play that well the last month," Goldschmidt said, "and honestly against the Dodgers, too."

Then there was J.D. Martinez. Acquired from Detroit before the trade deadline, the slugger went on a power-hitting tear, batting .302 with 29 home runs and 64 RBIs in 62 games with Arizona. He hit a National League-record 16 home runs in September, four of them on one memorable night at Dodger Stadium.

The four-homer game came during a franchise-record 13-game winning streak that included a pair of three-game sweeps of the Dodgers.

Here are some things to consider after the Diamondbacks' 93-win season:

LOVULLO'S TOUCH: From the moment spring training began, the manager cultivated a personal connection with his players. He often used the word "love" to describe the feelings they had for each other, not exactly a word often heard in professional sports.

"The thing that I'm most proud of is the culture we're building here," Lovullo said.

WHITHER MARTINEZ?: Martinez is a free agent and he would like to stay with the Diamondbacks.

"This is, obviously, some of the best times I had in my life

since playing professional baseball," he said.

The Diamondbacks, though, are a low-payroll team that probably can't afford to keep him.

Hazen said the Diamondbacks would stay in touch with Martinez but "it's too early to say what our offseason priorities will be."

ARCHIE'S FUTURE: Bradley was the odd man out in the competition for the fifth spot in the Diamondbacks rotation and opened the season in the bullpen.

He developed into one of the best relievers in the league (1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts in 73 innings), blowing opponents away with his electric fastball and baffling them with his knuckle curve.

Outgoing and highly quotable, he emerged as the No. 1 fan favorite. His thick, bushy beard was his trademark. Fans bought fake beards to don whenever he entered the game. His triple in the wild-card game is one of the signature moments of the Diamondbacks' season.

Just what role Bradley will have next season remains to be seen.

"We want him to have as big an imprint on this team as he can," Hazen said.

SHORTSTOP QUANDARY: Barring a trade, there will be a crowd at shortstop next spring when Chris Owings and Nick Ahmed return from injuries.

Ketel Marte came up from Triple-A Reno to lay a solid claim to the position and he was outstanding at the plate in the postseason. He tripled twice in the wild-card win and hit .333 (4-for-12) with a home run in the NLDS.

NLDS Game 4 of Nats-Cubs rained out, set to play Wednesday

CHICAGO (AP) — The showers came a little late, but the rain that soaked Wrigley Field and washed out Game 4 of the NL Division Series followed Tuesday’s forecast pretty closely.

Instead, Washington Nationals manager Dusty Baker delivered the biggest surprise of the day.

Baker announced after the rainout that he will stay with Tanner Roark for Wednesday’s must-win game against the Chicago Cubs instead of giving the ball to ace Stephen Strasburg on regular rest. Jake Arrieta pitches for the Cubs in his return from a right hamstring injury.

Strasburg threw a bullpen session earlier in the day, according to Baker, and the manager also said there is an illness going around the team, which he attributed to the weather, air conditioning at their hotel and Wrigley, and the “time of the year for mold around Chicago.”

“We decided to stay with Tanner because, No. 1, you know, he was slated,” Baker said. “Didn’t work out for Stras for his bullpen day, and we’re all creatures of habit, and plus, we’ve got full confidence in Tanner. And Stras, it would have been better, because he’s feeling under the weather, like a lot of my team is.”

The Cubs and Nationals took batting practice and the grounds crew got the field ready before bringing out the tarp. The rain started to fall about a half-hour after the game was supposed to start. With more showers in the forecast, Major League Baseball then called it off.

Chicago leads 2-1 in the best-of-five series going into Game 4, now scheduled for Wednesday at 4:08 p.m. EDT. There is rain in the forecast for early in the day.

“Everybody was pretty much on the same page on this one,” MLB executive Joe Torre said. “You know, we all felt it wasn’t going to be enough playing time without rain.”

If the Nationals win Wednesday, Game 5 would be Thursday night in Washington. The winner of the NLDS takes on the Dodgers in the next round, scheduled to begin Saturday in Los Angeles.

Chicago won 2-1 at home Monday.

Arrieta has pitched just 10 1/3 innings since Aug. 30. The 2015 NL Cy Young Award winner got hurt during a loss at Pittsburgh on Sept. 4. He returned late last month and made a couple starts down the stretch, but lasted just three innings in a loss at St. Louis on Sept. 26.

The Cubs skipped Arrieta’s last turn in the rotation in the regular season and then pushed him back to Game 4 for the playoffs, giving the right-hander ample time to rest.

“Jake’s really primed for this opportunity,” Cubs manager Joe Maddon said. “He’s done a great job of rehabbing his leg. He feels very good arm- and leg-wise right now. I’m real eager to watch him play.”

The 31-year-old Arrieta was a key factor in Chicago’s turnaround in the last part of the season, going 6-3 with a 2.28 ERA in his final 12 outings. Arrieta, who is eligible for free agency after the season, could be making his last start in a Cubs uniform.

“These next few days are going to be extremely special, and if we’re fortunate enough to get past these guys, like I feel we are, I’m going to do everything I can to enjoy the last few weeks,” Arrieta said Monday.

Roark is from Wilmington, Illinois, about 60 miles south of

Chicago, and grew up rooting for the Cubs. Baker praised Roark’s “warrior mentality” on Monday, but the decision to go with the righty over Strasburg and the circumstances surrounding the move likely will be hotly debated ahead of Game 4.

With Max Scherzer nursing his own right hamstring injury, Strasburg started the series opener on Friday and turned in a dominant performance. The right-hander was working on a no-hitter before Kris Bryant and Anthony Rizzo hit consecutive RBI singles with two outs in the sixth inning.

Strasburg struck out 10 in seven innings and was charged with two unearned runs and three hits in Washington’s 3-0 loss. Going back to the regular season, he is 5-2 with a microscopic 0.74 ERA and 73 Ks in 60 2/3 innings over his last nine starts.

Baker said Strasburg will start Game 5 if the series goes that far.

“It’s fine,” said Baker, who left open the possibility of going with Strasburg when he talked to reporters before the game. “We have full confidence in Tanner.” The rainout also meant the Nationals had to switch hotels. The biggest winner of the day was the Dodgers, who eliminated Arizona with a 3-1 victory in Game 3 of their NLDS on Monday night. If the NLDS between the Nationals and Cubs goes the distance.

Offseason overhaul complete, new era begins for Celtics

BOSTON (AP) — Kyrie Irving turned the NBA world upside down multiple times this summer.

It happened the first time after news leaked out that he had asked the Cleveland Cavaliers front office to trade him from the team he helped lead to a championship in 2016.

Then Irving was in the spotlight again as the centerpiece of a league-shaking trade that sent him to the rival Boston Celtics in exchange for a package that included Isaiah Thomas and Jae Crowder.

Now detached from the partnership he created with LeBron James, Irving enters the 2017-18 season as one jewel of the Celtics' offseason overhaul, along with Gordon Hayward, who signed as a free agent.

Only four players remain from Boston's roster from a year ago, when it outfought Cleveland for the East's top seed, only to fall to the Cavs in five games in the Eastern Con-

ference finals.

Along with Al Horford, the Celtics have a brand new "Big Three" as they continue their pursuit of the Cavs. While Irving maintains his departure from Cleveland wasn't about James, he now has exactly what he says he wanted: the leadership role in building a championship team. Still, he downplayed the idea that this season is more important than any other during his six-year career.

"Every moment in my life is pretty important," Irving said. "I wouldn't say that it's the most important. I would say it's probably the most interesting."

Aussie officials expecting Serena Williams to defend title

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — Australian Open officials are hopeful Serena Williams will make her competitive comeback to tennis next January to defend her title at Melbourne Park. At a news conference Tuesday called to announce an increase in prize money for the year's first major, tournament director Craig Tiley said Williams was planning on playing the Jan. 15-28 Australian Open. Williams was pregnant last January when she beat her sister Venus in the final. Serena gave birth to a daughter, Alexis Olympia Ohanian Jr., on Sept. 1 and has previously said she plans to return to playing in 2018. If that's in Melbourne, she'll be competing for more money. The tournament's overall prize pool will increase by 55 million Australian dollars (\$42.7 million), and the men's and women's singles champions will earn \$4 million (about \$3.1 million depending on exchange rates), an increase of 20 percent. Tiley said Williams was back in training to defend her title. "Serena will be back," Tiley was quoted as saying. "We look forward to welcoming her and again go on that journey of breaking the all-time record for the most number of Grand Slams."

Williams has won 23 Grand Slam singles titles, one more than Steffi Graf for the Open-era record. Australian Margaret Court is the all-time leader with 24. In the men's field, Tiley confirmed six-time winner Novak Djokovic and fellow former world No. 1 Andy Murray, who have both had injuries this year, would play in Melbourne 2018 along with Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal, who contested a classic final last January.

"I've been in contact with all the top players and am pleased to announce we'll have the full top 100 men and women returning to the Australian Open," Tiley said. The women's singles trophy will be presented by Billie Jean King, 50 years after she won her first Australian Open title.

Andre Iguodala doesn't want credit for being Warriors leader

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Andre Iguodala wants nothing to do with this conversation, not if it has to do with giving him any credit at all. For a single thing.

No, thanks. Even if assistant coach Mike Brown applauds Iguodala for all of his thoughtful conversations and serving as a sounding board when Brown guided the champion Warriors through much of the postseason as Steve Kerr was ailing.

"That's why he got fired in Cleveland and LA, 'cuz no one can trust him," Iguodala said so matter-of-factly of Brown. "I didn't ever say nothing to him, no. We never had any conversations." That's the impossible-to-read Iggy for you. Yet so reliable at the same time.

Then, without prompting while sitting at his locker after a preseason loss to Denver, he goes into recalling a lesson he took from that same day.

"We had a sermon in chapel today, earlier before the game, and it was talking about integrity. You can be honest but don't have integrity, but what does it mean to be a leader?" Iguodala said. "We were just saying you lead by example, without wanting any credit for it. So I don't want no credit for it.

"True story. But as a true leader, I can't even say those words. I'm not allowed to even say that. I can't say I'm a leader. I gotta say I try to do what's best for the team."

Then, he added: "Mike Brown's my guy, yeah. You gotta look out for one another, that's all."

Got this Golden State star figured out yet?

The Warriors could have lost him this offseason because Iguodala was wanted just about everywhere, yet ultimately opted to stay put.

Sometimes, his dry sense of humor can be tricky to navigate — that deadpan wit an acquired taste. Yet ask anybody around Iguodala about how much he means both behind the scenes and on the court and they insist it's immeasurable. This is the player whom Kerr asked to come off the bench before the 2014-15 title run and who he still appreciates so much to this day for his selflessness.

In July two years ago, after the franchise's first championship in 40 years, Iguodala had a little fun on Twitter when Kerr noted the defensive stopper would likely be a super sub again.

"Then trade me," Iguodala posted, before saying a minute later: "Ha! Got eeeeeem! Yall know I'm playing."

The 2015 NBA Finals MVP considered joining Houston and others this summer before he ultimately came back for what everybody is counting on being another deep postseason run

to chase a second straight title, receiving a \$48 million, three-year contract.

Brown isn't sure Iguodala realizes how much he meant last spring, to which Kerr said with a smile, "Maybe Mike should tell him."

"It doesn't surprise me. That's who Andre is," Kerr said. "Andre's one of our captains. He's one of our true leaders. He brings it every day in practice, he's one of the smartest players I've been around. He's the guy who made the initial sacrifice in terms of coming off the bench. Andre, he's irreplaceable for what he brings to us in so many different ways."

Iguodala often drew the chore of guarding Cleveland star LeBron James during the Finals, and he scored his postseason high of 20 points in the Game 5 title clincher. He averaged 7.2 points, 4.1 rebounds and 3.2 assists during the postseason for Golden State. During

the regular season, he became the first Warrior to ever lead the NBA in assist-to-turnover ratio at 4.50 — 261 assists to 58 turnovers.

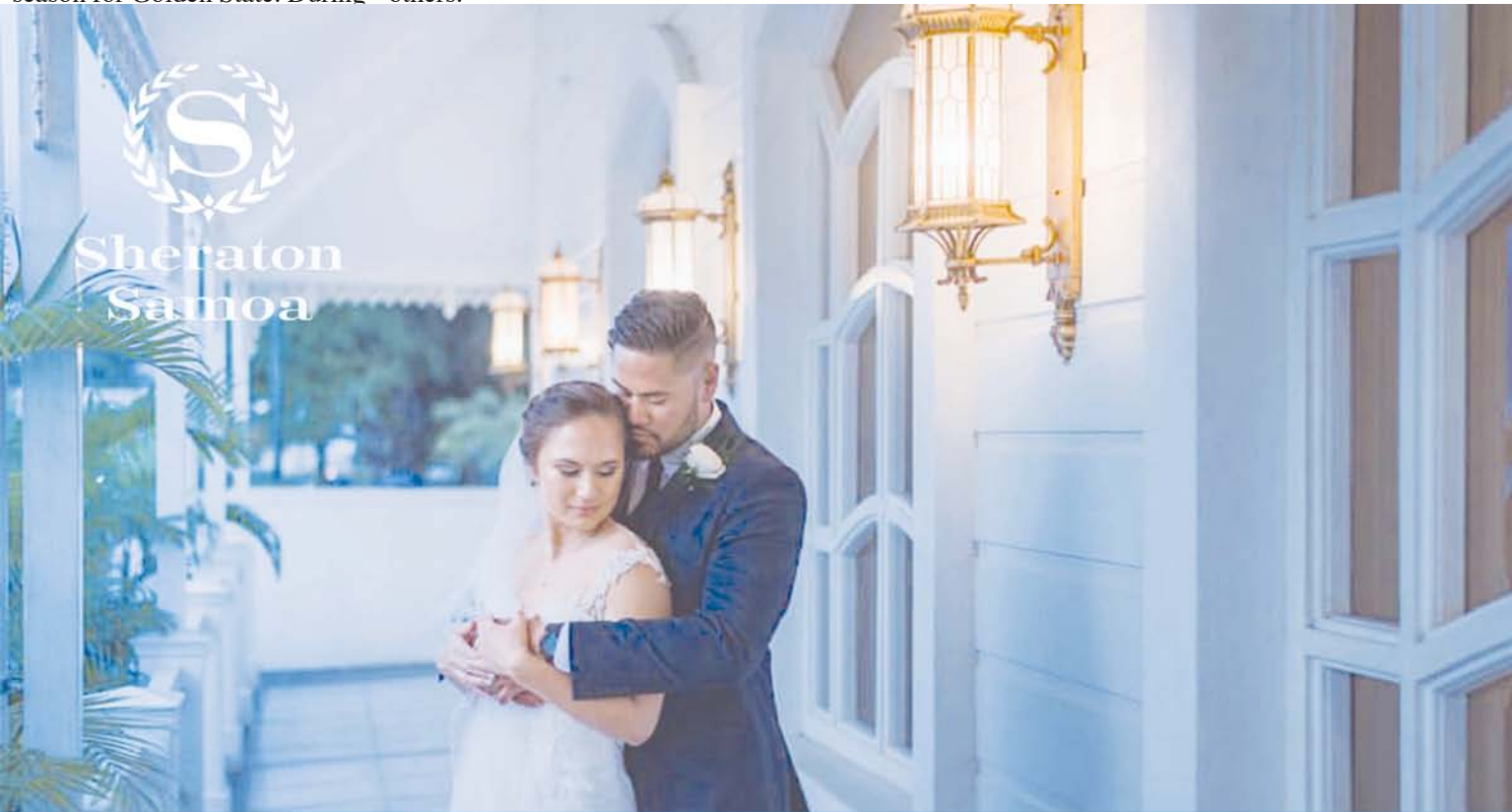
Last season, when Kevin Durant and Zaza Pachulia joined the starting lineup and David West and JaVale McGee became key backups, Iguodala warned that it could take months to build chemistry.

His stance hasn't changed.

"I think we're still building on it, that's the great thing. The hardest part is having to understand, you know it's going to be hard but can you continue to put layers on top of layers on top of layers as you have success and you're not getting complacent, not getting comfortable," he said. "So we understand that, we want to continue to get better so we're going to keep building on what we've already established." Brown sure is appreciative, along with all the others.

Georgia Tech's Marshall ready for huge test at No. 11 Miami

ATLANTA (AP) — Four starts into his college career, TaQuon Marshall already has the look of a star.

In the end, though, games like this will determine how he's remembered at Georgia Tech.

On the road.

Against No. 11 Miami.

"I'm really excited," Marshall said after practice Tuesday. "This is really going to be a big test for us."

If nothing else, Marshall and his teammates should be well rested when they face the Hurricanes. Georgia Tech (3-1, 2-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) is coming off a bye week and wasn't able to play at Central Florida in the aftermath of Hurricane Irma, meaning the Yellow Jackets have played two fewer games than a lot of teams

"We're still a little bit of an enigma. You usually know by this time of year, but we've only played four games," coach Paul Johnson said. "It's hard to tell where we are. But we'll know a lot more after Saturday, that's for sure." In some ways, that applies to Marshall as much as anyone.

The junior claimed the starting job over Matthew Jordan, who was the top backup to Justin Thomas the last two seasons, and quickly grabbed a place in the Georgia Tech record book by running for 249 yards and five touchdowns in a season-opening, double-over-time loss to Tennessee.

Since then, Marshall had two more 100-yard rushing performances while showing a surprisingly accurate arm, completing nearly 58 percent of his limited attempts with four TDs and no interceptions.

"The moment has not gotten too big for him," Johnson said. "That's what you're worried about, especially in that first game, that he'd get a little bit starry-eyed. For the most part, he's kept his composure really well."

But the Yellow Jackets have yet to play anyone close to the stature of Miami (4-0,

2-0), which is coming off a last-second victory at Florida State, and the first road game of the season only heightens the challenge.

Under Johnson, Georgia Tech is just 2-7 against the Hurricanes. That includes four straight losses at Miami — all by margins of at least 15 points.

This is Marshall's chance to really shine. "Of course, I don't expect to come out and make all the plays," he said. "I mean, the guys around me make the plays for me."

It's clear that Marshall has earned the respect of those around him with not only his playing skills, but with his toughness and vocal leadership style. This week, he was one of three players chosen by his peers as a team captain; the other two are seniors.

"That kid's playing lights out," receiver Ricky Jeune said. "Everybody believes in him. That's our guy."

Jordan was thought to be the favorite for the starting job, based on his experience and a standout performance leading the Yellow Jackets to an upset victory at Virginia Tech last season when Thomas was injured. But Marshall, who began his college career as a running back, emerged as the favorite during spring practice, showing flashes of the playmaking ability that Johnson wants from his quarterback in the triple option. Jordan was further hampered by a foot injury that forced him to shut down midway through the spring, allowing Marshall to further solidify himself as the top choice heading into fall workouts. Johnson actually made his decision a couple of weeks before the opener, though he didn't announce it until the night of the game.

"We've been doing this for 32 years. We've had a lot of quarterbacks," Johnson said. "He's playing well, but we fully expected him to play well."

Now, can Marshall keep it going against his toughest opponent yet?
