I had a dream at the time that someday I would be speaking to a graduating class after I've achieved something in life. Well I guess standing here before you today must mean I've achieved

something worthwhile. I hope what I share today will help inspire you to become the best "YOU" you can be.

My parents did not finish any formal education. My guess is some of you graduating today may relate to this. They never graduated from elementary, but they instilled in me the love of learning and to always strive for the best me I can be.

I realized at a very young age that EDUCATION was the key to success, and that if I didn't get good grades I'd never have the opportunity to go to college since my parents couldn't afford it.

The only way for me to get a college education was to get a scholarship from ASG, and that's exactly what I did. I graduated second in my high school class at Fagaitua HS and was offered a scholarship to go off island, but my parents decided for me to attend ASCC instead.

I was so focused on my goal of going off island and getting a Bachelor's degree that I graduated with a 4.0 GPA and was Co-Valedictorian of my ASCC graduating class.

I remember many times in College staying up late 'burning the midnight oil' trying to finish projects and study for exams. BYU Provo was especially brutal. Winters were extremely cold, especially for a young man from a small tropical island where the only time you see snow was on TV or in your dreams. Students were making fun of me as I wore full on winter gears in the middle of September when everyone else was running around in shorts and t-shirts. When I responded that I was from Samoa, they would laugh and say 'is that in Africa?!'

The student body count at BYU was about the same as the total population of American Samoa at the time. 'Culture shock' was an understatement. Civil Engineering was a tough major as it required long hours in class taking courses with names Id never heard of.

I remember well my first finals week there. It was a bone chilling Winter morning, I found myself in bed with the flu, muscle aches made it hard to move let alone the cold winter made me want to sleep the finals week all the way through. Sick as a dog, I was ready to just stay in bed and get a zero on my finals, the only thing that forced me to go take those finals that cold winter week was the thought of Mom & Dad working hard at home to care for my younger siblings. I was the first of 7 children to receive a full scholarship to attend a University off island. I had an image in my head of my father working hard in his plantation in the hot sun every day and my mother waking up early every morning around 2am to catch the bus to go to work at StarKist so they could put food on the table. These images played in my mind over and over again and forced me to keep going and get good grades at BYU.

That first finals week set the stage for the rest of my experience there. While most kids from home were out parting with their friends, I was either at the lab or at the study hall doing homework and studying for my classes. Most of my poly friends would call me the anti-social 'palagi toi' because I would hardly go with them to their activities. I was so focus on doing what I came there to do, to graduate with a Bachelor's Degree that everything else that did not take me to that goal was ignored and put in the back burner.

The Engineering program was a 3 year course for a junior college graduate like me. I told my college adviser that I needed to be done in 2 years. He said that would not be possible since I was required to take several pre-requisite courses in order to get into the program. I was determined; my WHY was stronger than any HOW. I went to school every semester without a break; Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer. I graduated from BYU with a Bachelors of Science in Civil Engineering exactly 2 years after I started.

Most of the money I made while working part-time during my two years there I sent home to help my parents. I used some of it to help pay for my Dad to come to my graduation.

It is amazing what you are capable of doing when you are DETERMINED with a big enough WHY to do it.

My point in telling you my story is not to gloat, but to remind you that no matter what situation you are in now, it does NOT shape who you will become in the future.

# Choice #1 – Choose Now to Find Your Purpose & Stay True To Yourself

For two years straight, I would leave our home each day early when it was dark and my son was asleep and returned home late when it was dark and my son was asleep. I worked full time during the day and went to school full time at night. With Determination and Focus, I received my Masters in Environmental Engineering two years after I started.

For some of you, a formal Education may not be a route you want to pursue. You may be thinking of going into the workforce after today, or becoming a Faifeau, or go into business for yourself. There is nothing wrong with that. We need more entrepreneurs by the way.
